ORDINANCE REDISTRICTING THE CITY OF SYRACUSE

WHEREAS, Section 3-104 of the Charter of the City of Syracuse-1960, as amended, provides that not later than six (6) months after the availability of population data on a ward or census tract basis after each Federal decennial census the Council shall reconsider the boundaries of the councilmanic districts; and

WHEREAS, said Section further provides that if the Council finds that the number of persons enumerated in any councilmanic district is less than fifteen (15) or more than twenty-five (25) per cent of the total persons enumerated in the City, the Council shall proceed by ordinance to redistrict the City in such manner that each district shall contain not less than seventeen (17) or more than twenty-three (23) per cent of the population of the City of Syracuse; and


WHEREAS, this Common Council has authorized an Independent Citizen's Redistricting Commission (the "Commission") by Local Law No. 10 of 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has presented the Common Council with its recommendations as to revised and redistricted Council Districts; and

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, that the five (5) Council Districts are hereby revised and established in accordance with the attached map (Exhibit A) which is on file with the City Clerk; and

BE IT ORDINANED, that the City Clerk shall transmit this map to the Onondaga County Board of Elections for purposes of the General Elections starting in 2023 and thereafter.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING INCREASE TO TAX ABSTRACT FEES

BE IT ORDAINED, that Ordinance No. 45984 adopted by the Common Council on April 7, 1930 and last amended by Ordinance No. 46 adopted on February 4, 2008 be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED, that the amount of fees or charges to be paid for the making and certifying of each abstract by the Abstract Clerk in accordance with the provisions of Section 7 of Chapter 75 Laws of 1906, as added by Chapter 282 Laws of 1910 and as amended by Local Law No. 4 of 1931, shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each year for a parcel of land certified to, with a minimum charge of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) for any certificate to any abstract covering a period of five (5) years or less; a minimum charge of Forty-Five Dollars (\$45.00) for any certificate to any abstract covering a period of ten (10) years or less; a minimum of Sixty-Five Dollars (\$65.00) for any certificate to any abstract covering a period of fifteen (15) years or less; and a minimum of Eighty Dollars (\$80.00) for any certificate to any abstract covering a period of twenty (20) years or less; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect October 1, 2022.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE COMMISSIONER OF FINANCE TO ADD LATE FEES TO INVOICES WHICH REMAIN UNPAID 30 DAYS AFTER INVOICING TO THE EXTENT PERMITED BY LAW AND PROPER NOTICE

BE IT ORDAINED, that the Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to establish a schedule of late fees to be applied on unpaid balances 30 days past due for the following charges:

- 1. Invoices for Code Violations.
- 2. Invoices for services performed for outside entities.
- 3. Invoices for sales of fuel, salt and other commodities.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any such late fees will be imposed to the extent permitted by New York State Law and only after proper notice has been given; and

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000.00) TO DEFRAY THE COST AND EXPENSE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS 2022/2023 SOUTH GEDDES STREET SAFETY PROGRAM

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific object or purpose of providing funds to defray the cost and expense of the Department of Public Works 2022/2023 South Geddes Street Safety Program to address the significant safety issues for non-motorists along South Geddes Street, near Fayette Street West and Erie Boulevard West, at a cost not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00), general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific object or purpose for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific object or purpose consists of the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00), thereby providing such sum for all the maximum cost of such specific object or purpose.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific object or purpose for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 20 of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is fifteen (15) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance. The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the

interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are reasonably expected to be received, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 8. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

Section 10. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.






Figure 1 —Kirk Park Launch Area





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GRANT OF EASEMENT

CITY OF SYRACUSE of 1000 Col. Eileen Collins Boulevard, North Syracuse, New York 13212 (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor"), for consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), and other valuable considerations paid, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged under seal, hereby grants to NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION, a New York corporation, having an address at 300 Erie Boulevard West, Syracuse, New York 13202 (hereinafter referred to as "Grantee"), for Grantee and its lessees, licensees, successors, and assigns, the perpetual right and easement as described in Section 1 below (the "Easement") in, under, through, over, across, and upon the Grantor's land, as described in Section 2 below (the "Grantor's Land")

<u>Section 1</u> – <u>Description of the Easement</u>. The "Easement" granted by the Grantor to the Grantee consists of a perpetual easement and right-of-way, with the right, privilege, and authority to:

- a. Construct, reconstruct, relocate, extend, repair, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, and, at its pleasure, abandon or remove underground electric facilities including a line or lines of wires or cables (either direct-buried or installed in underground conduits), handholes, manholes, conduit, vaults, junction boxes, pad-mount transformers, housings, connectors, switches and switching equipment, pipes, pedestals, closures, ducts and duct work, markers, cables, connections to underground wires, insulators, transformers, braces, fittings, foundations, anchors, lateral service lines, communications facilities, and other underground fixtures and appurtenances (collectively, the "Facilities"), which the Grantee shall require now and from time to time, for the transmission and distribution of high and low voltage electric current and for the transmission of intelligence and communication purposes in connection with the Facilities, by any means, whether now existing or hereafter devised, for the benefit of the Syracuse Hancock International Airport under and through that portion of the Grantor's Land described in Section 3 below (the "Easement Area"), and the highways abutting or running through the Grantor's Land, and to renew, replace, add to, and otherwise change the Facilities and each and every part thereof and the location thereof within the Easement Area, and utilize the Facilities within the Easement Area for the purpose of providing necessary utility service to the Airport and its users;
- b. From time to time, without further payment therefor, clear and keep cleared the Easement Area of any and all trees, vegetation, roots, aboveground or belowground structures, improvements, or other obstructions and trim and/or remove other trees, roots and vegetation within ten (10) feet of either side of the Easement Area that, in the reasonable opinion of the Grantee, may interfere with the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Facilities. The first clearing may be for less than the full width and may be widened from time to time to the full width of the Easement Area;
- c. Excavate or change the grade, as necessary for the purposes described herein, of the Grantor's Land within the Easement Area as is reasonable, necessary, and proper for any and all purposes described in this Section 1; provided, however, that the Grantee will promptly and at its sole cost and expense, upon completion of its work, backfill and restore any excavated areas to reasonably the same condition as existed prior to such excavation; and
- d. Pass and repass along the Easement Area to and from the adjoining lands and pass and repass over, across, and upon the Grantor's Land to and from the Easement Area, and construct, reconstruct, relocate, use, and maintain such footbridges, causeways, and ways of access, if any, thereon, as is reasonable and necessary in order to exercise to the fullest extent the Easement.

This Easement and all of the above rights, privileges and authority granted herein are at all times subject to the Grantor, the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority, the Federal Transportation Security Administration and any other applicable federal law and/or agency's laws, rules and regulations governing the use of Grantor's land. Access to the Easement Area may be limited or restricted at any time in accordance with said laws, rules and regulations.

<u>Section 2B</u> – <u>Description of Grantor's Land</u>. The "Grantor's Land" is described in a certain Deed recorded in the **Onondaga** County Clerk's Office on 04/27/1948 in Liber 1326 of Deeds at Page 547 and consists of land described as being part of Tax Parcel No. 057.-02-04.0 (FL 92 & 93) of the Town of Cicero, County of Onondaga, New York, commonly known as East Taft Road.

Section 2C - Description of Grantor's Land. The "Grantor's Land" is described in a certain Deed recorded in the Onondaga County Clerk's Office on 03/09/1977 in Liber 2603 of Deeds at Page 246 and consists of land described as being

part of Tax Parcel No. 015.-01-02.2 (FL 5 & 10) of the Town of Dewitt, County of Onondaga, New York, commonly known as Hancock Airport.

<u>Section 3</u> – <u>Location of the Easement Area</u>. The "Easement Area" shall consist of a portion of the Grantor's Land 10 feet in width throughout its extent, the centerline of the Easement Area being the centerline of the Facilities. The general location of the Easement Area is shown on the sketches entitled 11-22-30538497 & 11-22-30538474, which sketches are attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u> and recorded herewith, copies of which are in the possession of the Grantor and the Grantees. The final and definitive location(s) of the Easement Area shall become established by and upon the final installation and erection of the Facilities by the Grantees in substantial compliance with <u>Exhibit A</u> hereto.

 $\underline{Section 4} - \underline{Facilities \ Ownership}$. It is agreed that the Facilities shall remain the property of the Grantee, its successors and assigns.

Section 5 – General Provisions. The Grantor, for itself, its heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees with the Grantee that no act will be permitted within the Easement Area which is inconsistent with the Easement hereby granted, no buildings or structures, or replacements thereof or additions thereto, swimming pools, or obstructions will be erected or constructed above or below grade within the Easement Area; no trees shall be grown, cultivated, or harvested, and no excavating, mining, or blasting shall be undertaken within the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Grantee, it being the intent that the Easement herein conveyed is intended to prohibit the longitudinal or parallel use or occupancy of said Easement Area by surface or subsurface activities or structures which might damage or interfere with the Facilities; the Easement shall not be modified nor the Easement Area relocated by the Grantor without the Grantee's prior written consent which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld; the present grade or ground level of the Easement Area will not be changed by excavation or filling. Any agreed upon relocation of any or all of the facilities required by Grantor, shall be at Grantor's sole cost and expense. In such event, Grantor and Grantee must execute, deliver and record an instrument in recordable form evidencing such relocation of the Easement Area.

The Grantee, its successors and assigns, are hereby expressly given and granted the right to assign this Easement, or any part thereof, or interest therein, but the same shall not be divisible between or among two or more owners, as to any right or rights created hereunder without the express written consent of the Grantor which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. 

GRANT OF EASEMENT

CITY OF SYRACUSE of 1000 Col. Eileen Collins Boulevard, North Syracuse, New York 13212 (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor"), for consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00), and other valuable considerations paid, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged under seal, hereby grants to NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION, a New York corporation, having an address at 300 Erie Boulevard West, Syracuse, New York 13202 (hereinafter referred to as "Grantee"), for Grantee and its lessees, licensees, successors, and assigns, the perpetual right and easement as described in Section 1 below (the "Easement") in, under, through, over, across, and upon the Grantor's land, as described in Section 2 below (the "Grantor's Land")

<u>Section 1</u> – <u>Description of the Easement</u>. The "Easement" granted by the Grantor to the Grantee consists of a perpetual easement and right-of-way, with the right, privilege, and authority to:

- a. Construct, reconstruct, relocate, extend, repair, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, and, at its pleasure, abandon or remove underground electric facilities including a line or lines of wires or cables (either direct-buried or installed in underground conduits), handholes, manholes, conduit, vaults, junction boxes, pad-mount transformers, housings, connectors, switches and switching equipment, pipes, pedestals, closures, ducts and duct work, markers, cables, connections to underground wires, insulators, transformers, braces, fittings, foundations, anchors, lateral service lines, communications facilities, and other underground fixtures and appurtenances (collectively, the "Facilities"), which the Grantee shall require now and from time to time, for the transmission and distribution of high and low voltage electric current and for the transmission of intelligence and communication purposes in connection with the Facilities, by any means, whether now existing or hereafter devised, for the benefit of the Syracuse Hancock International Airport under and through that portion of the Grantor's Land described in Section 3 below (the "Easement Area"), and the highways abutting or running through the Grantor's Land, and to renew, replace, add to, and otherwise change the Facilities and each and every part thereof and the location thereof within the Easement Area, and utilize the Facilities within the Easement Area for the purpose of providing necessary utility service to the Airport and its users;
- b. From time to time, without further payment therefor, clear and keep cleared the Easement Area of any and all trees, vegetation, roots, aboveground or belowground structures, improvements, or other obstructions and trim and/or remove other trees, roots and vegetation within ten (10) feet of either side of the Easement Area that, in the reasonable opinion of the Grantee, may interfere with the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Facilities. The first clearing may be for less than the full width and may be widened from time to time to the full width of the Easement Area;
- c. Excavate or change the grade, as necessary for the purposes described herein, of the Grantor's Land within the Easement Area as is reasonable, necessary, and proper for any and all purposes described in this Section 1; provided, however, that the Grantee will promptly and at its sole cost and expense, upon completion of its work, backfill and restore any excavated areas to reasonably the same condition as existed prior to such excavation; and
- d. Pass and repass along the Easement Area to and from the adjoining lands and pass and repass over, across, and upon the Grantor's Land to and from the Easement Area, and construct, reconstruct, relocate, use, and maintain such footbridges, causeways, and ways of access, if any, thereon, as is reasonable and necessary in order to exercise to the fullest extent the Easement.

This Easement and all of the above rights, privileges and authority granted herein are at all times subject to the Grantor, the Syracuse Regional Airport Authority, the Federal Transportation Security Administration and any other applicable federal law and/or agency's laws, rules and regulations governing the use of Grantor's land. Access to the Easement Area may be limited or restricted at any time in accordance with said laws, rules and regulations.

Section 2A – Description of Grantor's Land. The "Grantor's Land" is described in a certain Deed recorded in the Onondaga County Clerk's Office on 02/19/1963 in Liber 2132 of Deeds at Page 298 and consists of land described as being part of Tax Parcel No. 057.-02-04.8 (FL 92, Tract No. B-258) and 057.-02-04.9 (FL 92 Tract No. B-260) of the Town of Cicero, County of Onondaga, New York, commonly known as East Taft Road.

Section 2B – Description of Grantor's Land. The "Grantor's Land" is described in a certain Deed recorded in the Onondaga County Clerk's Office on 04/27/1948 in Liber 1326 of Deeds at Page 547 and consists of land described as being part of Tax Parcel No. 057.-02-04.0 (FL 92 & 93) of the Town of Cicero, County of Onondaga, New York, commonly known as East Taft Road.

<u>Section 2C - Description of Grantor's Land</u>. The "Grantor's Land" is described in a certain Deed recorded in the **Onondaga** County Clerk's Office on 03/09/1977 in Liber 2603 of Deeds at Page 246 and consists of land described as being

part of Tax Parcel No. 015.-01-02.2 (FL 5 & 10) of the Town of Dewitt, County of Onondaga, New York, commonly known as Hancock Airport.

Section 3 – Location of the Easement Area. The "Easement Area" shall consist of a portion of the Grantor's Land 10 feet in width throughout its extent, the centerline of the Easement Area being the centerline of the Facilities. The general location of the Easement Area is shown on the sketches entitled 11-22-30538497 & 11-22-30538474, which sketches are attached hereto as Exhibit A and recorded herewith, copies of which are in the possession of the Grantor and the Grantees. The final and definitive location(s) of the Easement Area shall become established by and upon the final installation and erection of the Facilities by the Grantees in substantial compliance with Exhibit A hereto.

<u>Section 4 - Facilities Ownership</u>. It is agreed that the Facilities shall remain the property of the Grantee, its successors and assigns.

Section 5 – General Provisions. The Grantor, for itself, its heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees with the Grantee that no act will be permitted within the Easement Area which is inconsistent with the Easement hereby granted, no buildings or structures, or replacements thereof or additions thereto, swimming pools, or obstructions will be erected or constructed above or below grade within the Easement Area; no trees shall be grown, cultivated, or harvested, and no excavating, mining, or blasting shall be undertaken within the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Grantee, it being the intent that the Easement herein conveyed is intended to prohibit the longitudinal or parallel use or occupancy of said Easement Area by surface or subsurface activities or structures which might damage or interfere with the Facilities; the Easement shall not be modified nor the Easement Area relocated by the Grantor without the Grantee's prior written consent which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld; the present grade or ground level of the Easement Area will not be changed by excavation or filling. Any agreed upon relocation of any or all of the facilities required by Grantor, shall be at Grantor's sole cost and expense. In such event, Grantor and Grantee must execute, deliver and record an instrument in recordable form evidencing such relocation of the Easement Area.

The Grantee, its successors and assigns, are hereby expressly given and granted the right to assign this Easement, or any part thereof, or interest therein, but the same shall not be divisible between or among two or more owners, as to any right or rights created hereunder without the express written consent of the Grantor which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. This Grant of Easement shall at all times be deemed to be and shall be a continuing covenant running with the Grantor's Land and shall inure to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, legal representatives, and assigns of the parties named in this Grant of Easement.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF ALL RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE IN AND TO A PORTION OF 800 SOUTH WILBUR AVENUE REAR AND 802 SOUTH WILBUR AVENUE THROUGH A PURCHASE AND SALE AGREEMENT INCLUDING INDEMNIFICATION OF THE BUYER AS TO PREVIOUS SITE CONDITIONS TO BE REMEDIATED BY THE CITY

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Assessment hereby requests an ordinance authorizing the sale of all the right, title and interest of the City of Syracuse in and to a portion of the City-owned parcels at 800 South Wilbur Avenue Rear (Tax Parcel 098.2-01-05.2) and 802 South Wilbur Avenue (Tax Parcel 098.2-01-05.4) to 800 Wilbur Avenue South Syracuse LLC, a New York limited liability company with an address of 1001 Franklin Avenue, Suite 300, Garden City New York 11530 (the "Purchaser"); the specific parcels to be conveyed will be determined by the Commissioner of Assessment, subject to review by the Corporation Counsel, pending the resubdivision of the property by the City of Syracuse Planning Commission;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, subject to the approval of the Mayor, through the execution of a Purchase and Sale Agreement ("PSA") with the Purchaser; that upon payment to the Commissioner of Finance of the sum of \$20,000 per residential unit (estimated to be between a minimum of 100 units to a maximum of 200 units per phase) with an estimated several hundred units (including market, workforce, and affordable housing) to be built over three phases, the said Commissioner of Finance be and he hereby is authorized to apply the sum of \$1.00 toward the payment of delinquent taxes, exclusive of fees and penalties, to cancel and discharge said delinquency, and to issue his receipts and

discharges thereof, charging the uncollected taxes to account #269404.01; the City of Syracuse to pay all quarters due at the date of closing, for the current year's tax, said share of pro-rated tax to be determined by the Commissioner of Finance; this bid is contingent upon the City of Syracuse discharging any miscellaneous charges not presently a lien against the said premises; and the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to make, execute and deliver deeds to each parcel, upon resubdivsion by the Planning Commission as recommended by the Commissioner of Assessment, of the City's right, title and interest in and to said premises to 800 Wilbur Avenue South Syracuse LLC, said deeds to be approved as to manner, form and execution by the Corporation Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Mayor be and hereby is authorized to execute a Purchase and Sale Agreement (PSA) with 800 Wilbur Avenue South Syracuse LLC to effectuate the aforementioned sales of a portion of 800 South Wilbur Avenue Rear and 802 South Wilbur Avenue, with such PSA being subject to review and approval by the Corporation Counsel; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Common Council hereby agrees and authorizes the indemnification of 800 Wilbur Avenue South Syracuse LLC in accordance with the terms of the final executed PSA as to previous site conditions to be remediated by the City of Syracuse.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Seller's obligation to complete the transaction contemplated in this Contract is contingent upon the review and written approval of the Development Plan by the Mayor of the City of Syracuse and by a majority vote of the Common Council of the City of Syracuse, such approvals to be provided within sixty (60) days following the date on which the Development Plan is delivered to the City for review and approval (the "DP Review Deadline"). The City will have the right to extend the DP Review Deadline for an additional sixty (60) days by providing notice of the same to Buyer prior to the original DP Review Deadline. Following approval of the Development Plan in accordance herewith, Buyer shall have

the right to make non-material modifications to the Development Plan in order to achieve the development plan goals of the Project (excluding increasing the height of the buildings depicted thereon).

This Department requests an ordinance to authorize the sale of all right, title, and interest in a portion of the City-owned parcels at 800 South Wilbur Avenue Rear (Tax Parcel 098.2-01-05.2) and 802 South Wilbur Avenue (Tax Parcel 098.2-01-05.4) to 800 Wilbur Avenue South Syracuse, LLC, a New York limited liability company with an address of 1001 Franklin Avenue, Suite 300, Garden City, New York 11530 (the "Purchaser"). The specific parcels to be conveyed will be determined by the Commissioner of Assessment subject to review by the Corporation Counsel pending the resubdivsion of the property by the Planning Commission.

The Purchaser intends to construct several hundred residential units, including market, workforce, and affordable housing. The housing will be developed in three phases, with fewer than 200 units expected per phase. Total consideration for the transaction will equal twenty-thousand dollars (\$20,000) per residential unit ultimately approved and constructed.

The City, using New York State funding, shall demolish and remediate the current buildings and surrounding land. The City shall indemnify the Purchaser for any environmental liability that arises after the City's work has been completed and the parcels transferred to the Purchaser.

A copy of the survey and land description is in development; a conceptual site plan prepared by King & King Architects is attached as "Exhibit A."



We, the duly appointed members of the City Planning Commission of the City of Syracuse, do this 29th day of August, 2022, adopt the following resolution:

- WHEREAS, the applicant, Chris Bily, is requesting to modify the site plan, floor plans, and elevations for a Special Permit for a Restaurant on property situated at 713 East Fayette Street pursuant to Part B, Section III, Article 2 and Part C, Section IV, Articles 1 and 2 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission held a Public Hearing on the request on August 8 and August 29, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the Common Council Chambers, City Hall, Syracuse, New York, heard all those desiring to be heard, and duly recorded their testimony; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has studied the proposal and all submittals by the applicant and all interested parties; and
- WHEREAS, the scope of work includes interior and exterior renovations to an existing restaurant to facilitate the construction of a second floor and expansion of the customer area; and
- WHEREAS, the subject property is regular in shape with an existing one-story concrete block building, 44 feet of frontage on East Fayette Street, a lot depth of 132 feet, and a lot area of approximately 5,808 square feet; and
- WHEREAS, the property lies within a Business, Class A zoning district, as do the adjacent and neighboring lots to the north, south, east, and west; and
- WHEREAS, land use in the area consists of commercial, retail, and service uses; and
- WHEREAS, the "Syracuse Land Use and Development Plan" designates the character of this site, which lies within the Eastside neighborhood, as Urban Core; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission approved a Special Permit for a Restaurant (SP-11-15) on May31, 2011, granting two waivers from the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, with respect to the parking and sign regulations; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission approved a minor modification to the Special Permit for a Restaurant (SP-11-15M1) on November 14, 2011; and
- WHEREAS, there are no additional land uses on the site; and
- WHEREAS, the hours of operation will be from 11:30 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. Tuesday through Thursday, and from 11:30 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday, with a maximum of 15 employees on premises at one time; and

- WHEREAS, the applicant is proposing to install a 1.67-foot by 7.75-foot (12.9-square foot) wall sign facing East Fayette Street; and
- WHEREAS, during the Public Hearing on August 8, 2022, the City Planning Commission noted concerns regarding the proximity of the proposed location of an existing dumpster area with three dumpsters, and the lack of screening thereof, to the adjacent property to the west, known as 711 East Fayette Street, which is a local protected site and is undergoing renovation; and
- WHEREAS, the applicant submitted a revised site plan (Sheet A-0) dated August 18, 2022, which illustrates a proposed two-story building, two dumpsters relocated away from 711 East Fayette Street and enclosed within a vinyl-slatted, chain link fence, and an existing driveway onto East Fayette Street; and
- WHEREAS, the application included a proposed first floor plan (Sheet A-1) dated May 31, 2022, which illustrates a customer area of 1,104 square feet, a bar, and a kitchen; and
- WHEREAS, the application included a proposed second floor plan (Sheet A-2) dated May 31, 2022, which illustrates a customer area of 1,067 square feet, a bar, and a second kitchen; and
- WHEREAS, the application included proposed elevation plans (Sheets A-3, A-4, and A-5) dated May 31, 2022, which illustrate the proposed fenestration and finishing materials and the location of the proposed wall sign; and
- WHEREAS, the application included proposed exterior (finishing) materials (Sheet A-6) dated May 31, 2022; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed restaurant expansion requires 33 additional off-street parking spaces; the applicant has removed four previously approved parking spaces and is proposing zero spaces; the proposal is short 37 off-street parking spaces; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(1) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that the proposal requires 37 additional off-street parking spaces; the applicant is proposing zero off-street parking spaces; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal necessitates an expanded parking waiver from the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, based upon review comments from the Department of Engineering, it appears that the proposed expansion encroaches into the City right-of-way, which requires approval from the Common Council; and

WEHEREAS, the proposal was reviewed by the Onondaga County Planning Board pursuant to GML §239-1, m and n; and

- WHEREAS, pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, the City Planning Commission has reviewed the subject proposal, which is an Unlisted Action and has determined that it will have no significant environmental impact based on the limited magnitude of the proposal, and therefore has issued a negative declaration; and





BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED SEVEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$207,500.00) TO DEFRAY THE COST AND EXPENSE OF THE 2022/2023 DEPARTMENT OF FIRE EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL FACILITY UPGRADE PROGRAM

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific object or purpose of providing funds to defray the cost and expense of the 2022/2023 Department of Fire External and Internal Facility Upgrade Program for structural building improvements and preventative maintenance work at Syracuse Fire Stations and Syracuse Fire Facilities, at a cost not to exceed Two Hundred Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$207,500.00), general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. Two Hundred Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$207,500.00) is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific object or purpose for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific object or purpose consists of the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of Two Hundred Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$207,500.00), thereby providing such sum for all the maximum cost of such specific object or purpose.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific object or purpose for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 35 of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is five (5) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance. The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the

interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are reasonably expected to be received, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 8. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

Section 10. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are reasonably expected to be received, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 8. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

Section 10. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
