The MOST will provide staff, supplies, and materials. The program will be open to youth in the summer playground programs at Burnet, Thornden, Kirk, Schiller, Westmoreland, and Wilson Parks. Agreement With National Center for Safety Initiatives (NCSI), to provide full-service background screenings for prospective employees and volunteers over 16 years old working with the Parks and Water Departments, for the period of July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024. A LOCAL LAW OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE TO AMEND CHAPTER 15 OF PART M, THE MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE, AS AMENDED, ENTITLED TRAFFIC CODE TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE XXV TO BE ENTITLED SCHOOL BUS STOPARM DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, in 2019 the New York State Legislature passed Assembly Bill A04950-B and Senate Bill S04524-B, entitled "An Act to Amend the Vehicle and Traffic Law, in relation to Photo Violation Monitoring Systems and Owner Liability for Failure of Operator to stop for a School Bus Displaying a Red Visual Signal; to Amend the General Municipal Law, in relation to jurisdiction and procedure; to Amend the Public Officers Law, in relation to certain photographs, videotapes, or other recorded images; to Amend the Education Law, in relation to authorizing School Districts to enter into agreements with Municipalities for the installation and use of School Bus Photo Violation Monitoring Systems; and

WHEREAS, then Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed these bills into law in 2019, and pursuant to this law, the City of Syracuse, with the cooperation of the Syracuse City School District, is eligible to implement a School Bus Stop-Arm Demonstration Program upon passage of the necessary local law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Common Council hereby find and declare that the interests of the public welfare require that the City of Syracuse amend Chapter 15, of the Miscellaneous Provisions of the City of Syracuse, as amended, to add a new Article XV to be entitled "School Bus Stop-Arm Demonstration Program" relative to the installation of a school bus photo violation monitoring system on school buses that transport students of the Syracuse City Schools, which is installed to work in conjunction with a school bus stop-arm. This system automatically produces two (2) or more photographs, two (2) or more microphotographs, a videotape or other recorded images of a vehicle at the time it is used or operated in violation of subdivision (a) of Section 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law; and under this program the City will impose monetary liability on owners of vehicles for failure of the operators thereof to comply with § 1174 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law when meeting a York State Vehicle and Traffic Law; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law Section 10 (1) (i) the City of Syracuse is authorized to adopt a local law establishing a Bus Stop-Arm Demonstration Program in the City of Syracuse;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 15 of Part M, the Miscellaneous Provisions of the City of Syracuse, as amended, entitled Traffic Code, is hereby amended to add a new Article XV, to be entitled "School Bus Stop-Arm Demonstration Program" which shall read as follows:

CHAPTER 15. TRAFFIC CODE

ARTICLE XV. SCHOOL BUS STOP-ARM DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM

§ 15-425. Definitions

For the purposes of this Article the following terms shall be defined as follows:

City: City of Syracuse, New York

School Bus Photo Violation Monitoring System: a device that is capable of operating independently of an enforcement officer which is installed to work in conjunction with a school bus stop-arm and which, automatically produces two (2) or more photographs, two (2) or more microphotographs, a videotape or other recorded images of a vehicle at the time it is used or operated in violation of Subdivision (a) of §1174 of the New York Vehicle & Traffic Law.

School District: Syracuse City School District

State: New York State

§15-426. Establishment of School Bus Stop-Arm Demonstration Program

- (A) There is hereby established, pursuant to § 1174-a of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, a demonstration program imposing monetary liability on owners of vehicles for failure of the operators thereof to comply with § 1174 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law when meeting a school bus marked and equipped as provided in Subdivisions 20 and 21-c of § 375 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law in the City of Syracuse.
- (B) To carry out the demonstration program, the City is authorized to enter into an agreement with the School District and a private vendor for the installation, maintenance, and use of school bus photo violation monitoring systems as well as proper handling and custody of data received by the school bus cameras, subject to the provisions of § 1174-a of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law. Once the School District has entered into an agreement with the City, cameras shall be installed on school buses owned or operated by the School District or privately owned and operated for compensation under a contract with the School District.

- (C) Cost of program and reports relating thereto.
 - (1) The total cost to the School District of the installation, maintenance and use of school bus photo violation monitoring systems pursuant to an agreement authorized by this local law shall be borne entirely by the School District Budget.
 - (2) The School District shall provide any report required of the School District, pursuant to § 1174-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, to the State or any official thereof.
 - (3) To the extent that the City shall be required to issue any report to the State or any official thereof because of the adoption of this article and/or § 1174-a of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, the City shall cause the same to be prepared pursuant to this article or applicable state law.
- (D) Pursuant to § 1174-a (a)(3)(i) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law, the School District shall be prohibited from accessing any photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, other recorded images and data from school bus photo violation monitoring systems but shall provide, pursuant to the agreement with the City, as provided in this article, for the proper handling and custody of such photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, other recorded images and data produced by such systems, and for the forwarding of such photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, other recorded images and data to the City for the purpose of determining whether a motor vehicle was operated in violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law and imposing monetary liability on the owner of such motor vehicle therefor.
- (E) The agreement between the City and the school district shall provide that photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, other recorded images and data produced by school bus photo violation monitoring systems shall be destroyed (a) 90 days after the date of the alleged imposition of liability if a notice of liability is not issued for such alleged imposition of liability pursuant to this article or (b) upon final disposition of a notice of liability issued pursuant to this article.
- (F) The City shall adopt and enforce measures to protect the privacy of drivers, passengers, pedestrians, and cyclists whose identity and identifying information may be captured by a school bus photo monitoring device. Such measures shall include:
 - (1) Utilization of necessary technologies to ensure, to the extent practicable, that photographs produced by such School Photo Violation Monitoring Systems shall not include images that identify the driver, the passengers, the contents of the vehicle, pedestrians and cyclists; provided, however, that no notice of liability issued pursuant to this section shall be dismissed solely because a photograph or photographs allow for the identification of the contents of a vehicle, provided that the City has made a reasonable effort to comply with the provisions of this subsection:

- (2) Oversight procedures to ensure compliance with the privacy protection measures required herein.
- (G) The City shall also undertake the installation of signage in conformance with standards established in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Such signage shall be installed at each roadway entrance of the jurisdictional boundaries of the City giving notice that school bus photo violation monitoring systems are used to enforce restrictions on vehicles violating § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "roadway" shall not include state expressway routes or state interstate routes but shall include controlled-access highway exit ramps that enter the boundaries of the City.

§15-427. Notice of Liability

(A) Content of Notice of Liability

- (i) A notice of liability shall contain the following: (1) name and address of the person alleged to be liable as an owner for a violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law; (2) the registration number of the vehicle involved in such violation; (3) the location where such violation took place, (4) the date and time of such violation; and (5) the identification number of the camera which recorded the violation or other document locator number.
- (ii) A notice of liability shall also contain information advising the person charged of the manner and the time in which he or she may contest the liability alleged in the notice; and a warning to advise the persons charged that failure to contest in the manner and time provided shall be deemed an admission of liability and that a default judgment may be entered thereon.
- (iii) The notice of liability may also contain such other information as the entity causing such notice of liability to be mailed deems appropriate to communicate the law and the adjudicatory process if the addressee of the notice wishes to contest the notice of liability.

(B) Delivery of Notice of Liability

A notice of liability shall be sent as provided by state law by first-class mail to each person alleged to be liable as an owner for a violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law. Personal delivery of the notice of liability on the owner shall not be required. A manual or automatic record of mailing prepared in the ordinary course of business shall be prima facie evidence of the facts contained therein. To the extent that state law does not preclude the City from causing such mailing to be made, the City shall undertake or cause to be undertaken such mailing.

- A. The owner of a vehicle shall be liable for a penalty imposed pursuant to this article if such vehicle was used or operated with the permission of the owner, express or implied, in violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law and such violation is evidenced by information obtained from a school bus photo violation monitoring system; provided, however, that no owner of a vehicle shall be liable for a penalty imposed pursuant to this article where the operator of such vehicle has been convicted of the underlying violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law. For purpose of (i) this section; and (ii) this article, there shall be a presumption that such vehicle was used and operated with the consent of the owner at the time it was used and operated in violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law.
- B. If the owner receives a notice of liability pursuant to this article for any time period during which the vehicle was reported to the police as having been stolen, it shall be a valid defense to an allegation of liability for a violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law pursuant to this article that the vehicle had been reported to the police as stolen prior to the time the violation occurred and had not been recovered by such time. For purposes of asserting the defense provided by this subsection, it shall be sufficient that a certified copy of the police report on the stolen vehicle be sent or delivered to a court of competent jurisdiction or parking violations bureau having jurisdiction where any contested notice of liability would otherwise be determined.
- C. An owner who is a lessor of a vehicle to which a notice of liability was issued pursuant to this article shall not be liable for the violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law, provided that he or she complies with the provisions of § 1174-a of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law and otherwise sends to the Court of competent jurisdiction, or other adjudicatory bureau or agency of competent jurisdiction, a copy of the rental, lease or other such contract document covering such vehicle on the date of the violation, with the name and address of the lessee clearly legible, within thirty-seven (37) days after receiving notice from the agency or entity which caused such notice of liability to be issued, together with the information contained in the original notice of liability. Failure to send such information within thirty-sevenday time period shall render the owner liable for the penalty prescribed by this article. Where the lessor complies with the provisions of this subsection, the lessee of such vehicle for purposes of this section, shall be deemed to be the owner of such vehicle on the date of such violation for the purposes of this section, shall be subject to liability for the violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law pursuant to this article and shall be sent a notice of liability pursuant to § 275-6 of this article.
- D. A certificate, sworn to or affirmed by a technician employed by the City, or a facsimile thereof, upon inspection of photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, other recorded images produced by a school bus photo violation monitoring system, shall be prima facie evidence of the facts contained therein. Any photographs, microphotographs, videotapes, other recorded images evidencing such a violation shall be available for inspection in any proceeding to adjudicate the liability for such violation.
- E. It shall be a defense to any prosecution for or allegation of a violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law pursuant to this article that such school bus stop-arms were malfunctioning at the time of the alleged violation.

§15-429. Penalties

- (1) An owner liable for a violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law pursuant to this article shall be liable for monetary penalties in accordance with the following schedule of fines and penalties:
 - (a) First violation: \$250.00
 - (b) Second violation committed within eighteen (18) months of first violation: \$275.00
 - (c) Third violation or subsequent violation, all of which were committed within eighteen (18) months from the first violation: \$300.00
 - (d) Additional penalty: \$25.00 for each violation for the failure to respond to a notice of liability within the prescribed time period.
- (2) An imposition of liability under this article shall not be deemed a conviction and shall not be made part of the operating record of the person upon whom such liability is imposed, nor shall it be used for insurance purposes in the provision of motor vehicle insurance coverage.

§15-430. Adjudication of liability.

Liability pursuant to the demonstration program established hereunder shall be imposed upon owners by the Court of competent jurisdiction in the City of Syracuse or in another manner pursuant to the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law.

§15-431. Action for indemnification.

If the owner held liable for a violation of Subdivision (a) of § 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law pursuant to this article was not the operator of the vehicle at the time of the violation, the owner may maintain an action for indemnification against the operator.

§15-432. Reporting Requirements

- A. The City shall develop and cause to be submitted an annual report on the results of the use of a school bus photo violation monitoring system to the Governor, the temporary president of the Senate and the speaker of the Assembly on or before June 1 of each year in which the demonstration program is operable. Such report shall include any information required by § 1174-a(m) of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law to be included as a result of the enactment of this article.
- B. Pursuant to the requirements of § 1174-a of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, courts, bureaus, and agencies conducting adjudications as a result of this article shall report at least annually to the City on the quality of the adjudication process and its results including the total number of hearings scheduled, rescheduled, and held; the total number of persons scheduled

for such hearings; the total number of cases where fines were paid on or before the hearing date; and the total number of default judgments entered.

§15-433. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section, or part of this article or the application thereof to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this article, or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such order or judgment shall be rendered.

§ 15-434. Effective Date

This article shall take effect immediately upon full compliance with all the requisite statutes and laws applicable to its adoption and promulgation.

Section 3. Severability Clause

Severability is intended throughout and within the provisions of this Local Law. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Local Law is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then that decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Local Law.

Section 4. Savings Clause

This Local Law is not intended to rescind or repeal any existing City of Syracuse Charter Provision, Local Law, or General Ordinance unless such change is made by its express terms. Otherwise all other provisions of the Syracuse City Charter, Revised General Ordinances and Local Laws not inconsistent with the provisions of this Local Law shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. Effective and Operative Date

This Local Law shall be effective immediately in accordance with the provisions of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law.

Cuomo in 2019. This demonstration program in Syracuse supports the City's goal to become a Vision Zero city.

Pursuant to the 2019 New York State Law, the City of Syracuse, with the cooperation of the Syracuse City School District, is eligible to implement a School Bus Stop-Arm Demonstration Program. This Program will involve the installation of a school bus photo violation monitoring system on school buses that transport students of the Syracuse City Schools. The device is installed to work in conjunction with a school bus stop-arm. The School Bus Photo Violation Monitoring system automatically produces two (2) or more photographs, two (2) or more microphotographs, a videotape or other recorded images of a vehicle at the time it is used or operated in violation of subdivision (a) of Section 1174 of the New York Vehicle and Traffic Law.

Under this program the City will impose monetary liability on owners of vehicles for failure of the operators thereof to comply with § 1174 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law when meeting a school bus marked and equipped as provided in Subdivisions 20 and 21-c of § 375 of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law. The specific provisions of the Local Law will model the New York State authorizing legislation.

To implement this program the City will need to enter into an agreement with the Syracuse City School District and/or their School Bus Vendor. Common Council approval for these agreements will be requested following a procurement process in

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY FOR PROVIDING SERVICES RELATIVE TO A SERIES OF OUTDOOR EDUCATION AND RECREATION PROGRAMS TO BE HELD WITHIN CITY PARKS AND ON LOCATION AT SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY'S OUTDOOR EDUCATION CENTER, AS PART OF THE CITY'S 2023 SUMMER RECREATION PROGRAM

BE IT ORDAINED, subject to the approval of the Mayor, that the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Syracuse University for providing services related to a series of outdoor educational programs held within City parks and on location at Syracuse University's Outdoor Education center; the programs will serve up to one hundred and fifty (150) youth attending summer recreation programs in the following parks: Burnet, Thornden, Kirk, Schiller, Westmoreland, and Wilson; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that said agreement includes the delivery of six (6) "Portables in the Parks" three (3) hour workshops at summer playground programs, as well as a "Challenge Course Experience at SU" to be held on location at Syracuse University; all sessions will be held from July 1, 2023 through August 31, 2023 and Syracuse University shall provide all education staff, as well as all necessary supplies and materials under this agreement; and

Please prepare legislation for the next Common Council meeting authorizing the City of Syracuse to enter into a new lease agreement with Ironhorn Enterprises for a 30,000±-square-foot section of warehouse space located at 1810 LeMoyne Avenue.

As the City has refined its fleet management practices, a need has been identified for indoor storage space to protect its equipment from the elements. The Syracuse Police Department ("SPD"), Fire Department ("SFD"), and Department of Public Works ("DPW") have several millions of dollars' worth of equipment that traditionally has been stored on an ad hoc basis in a number of open lots. As we reevaluated our broader real estate needs, we have identified a short-term leasing opportunity that affords us the ability to protect our fleet from winter weather while beginning the process of identifying a long-term centralized solution.

The lease would incorporate the following terms:

- 1. A term of five (5) years;
- 2. Annual rent not to exceed \$235,000 in the first year;

BE IT ORDAINED, that, subject to the approval of the Mayor, this Common Council authorizes the following findings and determinations:

Based upon an examination of the Regulations and other available supporting information, and considering both the magnitude and importance of each relevant area of environmental

concern, and based further upon the City's knowledge of the area surrounding the Project and such further investigation of the Project and its potential environmental impact as the City has deemed appropriate, the City makes the following findings and determinations:

- (1) The Project constitutes a "Type II Action" (as the quoted term is defined in the Regulations); and
- (2) Therefore, the City hereby determines that the Project will not have a significant adverse environmental impact, and the City will not require the preparation of an environmental impact statement with respect to the Project; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that as a consequence of such determination and in compliance with the requirements of the SEQR Act and the Regulations, the City directs the City Engineer to prepare any necessary Type II SEQRA documents; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the SEQRA documents for the Project be filed in accordance with the Regulations; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the City Engineer is authorized to take whatever steps are necessary to carry out this Ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 7 of the City of Syracuse — 1968, amended Chapter 13 of Article V of the "Charter of the City of Syracuse—1960" being Local Law No. 13 of 1960, charged the City Planning Commission with preparing a comprehensive Zoning Plan to consist of a zoning ordinance and official zoning map; and

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse applied for and was awarded in 2015 a New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, Clean Green Communities Program grant to fund an update to the City's Zoning Plan. Said funds were used to engage professional planning and zoning services and Mayor Stephanie Miner formed the ReZone Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, ReZone Syracuse: A Citywide Zoning Update is a systematic and comprehensive update of the entire Zoning Plan including the zoning ordinance, which established new zoning districts and contains the regulations, prohibitions, and restrictions concerning buildings, structures, and uses allowed and permitted in the City of Syracuse, and official zoning map; and

WHEREAS, the ReZone project team actively engaged the Syracuse community during the project and held more than one hundred community engagement meetings, where project information was presented and shared, and public feedback was solicited; and

WHEREAS, the new zoning ordinance and new official zoning map have been advertised

in the local newspaper on March 23, 2023, and have been explained and reviewed at a Public Hearing on March 28, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council, acting as lead agency, completed a thorough environmental review of the ReZone Project pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and adopted a Final Generic Environmental Impact Statement (FEGIS) on November 7, 2022 in accordance with SEQRA regulations; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Common Council of the City of Syracuse hereby confirms that all resolutions and ordinances emanating from the Zoning Plan and adopted prior to the effective date of the rewrite and codification of the new zoning ordinance and official zoning map shall remain in full force and effect and shall require no further action; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Common Council of the City of Syracuse, do hereby provide that the plan and map designated "An Amended Zoning Plan and Map of the City of Syracuse", dated October 15, 1957 and July 1967, as amended, which is amendatory of the "Zoning Plan and Map of the City of Syracuse", dated January 3, 1922, as amended, shall not remain in full force and effect and a part of the Zoning Rules and Regulations upon the effective date of the revised and recodified official zoning map and zoning rules and regulations of the City of Syracuse; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the new zoning ordinance and official zoning map which shall be known as ReZone: City of Syracuse Zoning Ordinance and Official Zoning Map shall be effective as of July 1, 2023; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a copy of the new zoning ordinance and a copy of the official zoning map shall be kept on file in the Office of the City Clerk and shall be made available on the City of Syracuse website, www.syr.gov.

APPENDIX A

New York State reimbursement restrictions have been obtained per review of the New York State Department of Health Bureau of Emergency Medical Services Policy Statement 13-03.

- a) Reimbursement dollars received by the EMS course sponsor (the Syracuse Fire Department, sponsor #06-059) from the state may only be used for direct costs of conducting the course and/or related to improvement of the sponsor's EMS educational program. These costs include but are not limited to: skills equipment (i.e., backboards, manikins), educational audio/video equipment and related software, instructor salaries, administrative costs, supplies and any other costs that are directly related to the educational programs delivered by the sponsor for NYS EMS certification courses.
- b) Reimbursement dollars received by an EMS agency for courses provided by a course sponsor or for the CME recertification program may only be used for the sole purpose of training. The funds may be used to reimburse for training received that directly related to certification or for future training needs. These funds can be used to enhance educational programs (i.e. audio visual equipment, textbooks, educational computer programs and products, guest lectures, reimburse students for pre-payments, conference registration, etc.) at the agency for the purpose of recertification.
- c) All funds received from DOH must be placed in a separate line item for account within the organizations financial system. United States Generally Accepted Accounting Procedures (GAAP) must be strictly adhered to and audit trails must be obtainable for all NYS funds. These records are subject to audit by DOH and the NYS Office of the State Comptroller.

On behalf of the Mayor's Office to Reduce Gun Violence, please prepare legislation to be introduced at the next scheduled Common Council Meeting requesting a waiver of the RFP process and to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative at the John F. Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into as of [DATE] between President and Fellows of Harvard College acting through the Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Initiative at the John F. Kennedy School of Government ("Harvard") and the City of [STATE/CITY] acting through the [CITY AGENCY] ("CITY"). Each of Harvard and the CITY are sometimes referred to herein as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties."

The purposes of this MOU are (A) to state terms regarding the employment by the CITY of one or more Bloomberg Harvard City Leadership Fellows (each, a "Fellow"), who are graduates of masters or professional degree programs at Harvard University; and (B) to provide for each Fellow to work for the leadership team of the Mayor of the CITY for a two-year term on a specific policy area (the "Engagement").

The Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Scope of Engagement. Each Fellow will work with the leadership team of the Mayor of the CITY, providing general support on a specific priority area and deliverables. For each Fellow, Harvard and the CITY shall agree in advance on the project or policy area on which the CITY will engage the Fellow and the expected dates of the Engagement to ensure that the Engagement includes sufficiently meaningful and rigorous responsibilities to warrant inclusion in the Fellowship program.
- 2. <u>Grant Award</u>. Harvard will provide a grant to the CITY in a mutually agreed-upon amount not to exceed \$190,100 ("Grant Award""), to be paid in equal installments on a quarterly basis during the period of the fellowship, or on such other schedule as the Parties may mutually agree to in advance. The Grant Award will be used solely to reimburse the CITY's costs of the Fellow's salary, employee benefits, housing stipend, and subscriptions during the period of the fellowship. The Grant Award will be subject to a one-time increase to reflect a standard cost-of-living increase applicable to similarly situated CITY employees.

If the CITY fails to use the Grant Award as specified herein, the CITY shall refund the unused grant amount to Harvard within 60 days of such nonuse. This obligation will apply whether or not failure to use the Grant Award funds results from termination of this Agreement pursuant to Section 6., the Fellow ceasing to be an employee of CITY, an act or omission of CITY, or for any other reason.

3. Supervision. The CITY will give work assignments to the Fellow and will supervise the Fellow's work for the CITY. The Mayor and the Mayor's leadership team will provide supervision, mentorship and guidance to help support the Fellow's tasks, objectives, and professional development. The CITY will provide access to all data, systems and technology necessary for the Fellow to conduct his or her work, commensurate with such access as CITY provides to other employees of its leadership team.

To advance the goals of the Bloomberg Harvard fellowship program, Harvard will provide at least two trainings for the Fellow, the first at the commencement of the Engagement and a second partway through the Engagement. So that Harvard may receive meaningful feedback regarding the fellowship program, the CITY supervisor overseeing the Fellow and Bloomberg Harvard Program staff will communicate from time to time at Harvard's request on the Fellow's mentorship and work.

4. <u>Salary and Benefits; Office Facilities; Compliance</u>. CITY will employ the Fellow as a full-time employee of the CITY for two years, and shall pay the Fellow's salary at the same frequency and with standard cost-of-living raises as are given to comparable CITY employees. CITY shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, codes and regulations of federal, state and local governments in connection with or related to the performance of this Agreement and CITY's employment of the Fellow. Without limiting the foregoing, CITY shall be responsible to comply with all applicable laws pertaining to employee/independent contractor classification, and shall be responsible for any damages, fines or other payments that may arise from or relate to any misclassification by CITY. CITY shall not discriminate, in any way, against any person on the basis of race, sex, color, age, religion, sexual orientation, actual or perceived gender identity, disability, ethnicity, or national origin, in connection with or related to the performance of this Agreement. In no event will Harvard be deemed an employer, joint employer or co-employer of the Fellow.

The CITY will provide the Fellow with suitable office resources, including a desk, a computer, a phone, an email account, and appropriate access to CITY networks, servers, and printers. CITY will also provide access to general productivity software such as word and data processing and email programs, and such other software programs as may be appropriate for the Fellow's work.

- 5. <u>CITY Direction and Control</u>. While conducting work for CITY, the Fellow shall at all times be under the direction and control of the CITY. The CITY will provide the Fellow with all employee benefits and privileges, immunities, and workplace procedures and protections as it provides comparable full-time CITY employees. The CITY will be responsible to inform the Fellow as to any applicable conflict of interest laws, ethics rules, and public records laws and guidelines, to the extent such laws and rules apply to the Engagement and the Fellow's position as an employee of the CITY. The Fellow must complete any required training or other requirements related to his or her Engagement offered by CITY. CITY will be responsible to provide appropriate orientation to the Fellow regarding workplace rules and expectations, including providing the Fellow with a written copy of applicable CITY policies and procedures. In no event will Harvard be responsible for Fellow's compliance or non-compliance with such rules, regulations, laws or workplace policies and procedures as may apply to the Fellow during the course of the Engagement.
- 6. <u>Term and Termination</u>. This Agreement will commence on the Effective Date and remain in effect until the later of the fifth (5th) anniversary of the Effective Date or the date on which any Engagement of a Fellow in effect as of such fifth anniversary is completed, unless sooner terminated as provided herein. Either Party may terminate this Agreement on ninety (90) days' prior written notice to the other Party, provided that any Fellow working for the CITY at the time of such notice will be permitted to complete his or her Engagement and the terms of this MOU will continue to apply for the remainder of such Engagement. Notwithstanding the foregoing,

Harvard may terminate the fellowship award for any Fellow in the event it determines the purposes of the fellowship are not being fulfilled or in the event a Fellow elects to withdraw from the fellowship, and the CITY may terminate a Fellow's employment in accordance with applicable laws and CITY regulations, in the event it determines the employment is no longer suitable. In such event, the Party taking action to terminate shall provide prompt written notice to the other Party of such termination. CITY will be solely responsible for all employer obligations relating to termination of employment of the Fellow.

The CITY and Harvard will work together to create a successful Engagement, and will cooperate on the resolution of issues that may arise.

The provisions of Sections 5-9 will survive termination or expiration of this Agreement.

7. <u>Limitation of Liability</u>. The CITY understands and agrees that Harvard is not responsible for the performance, misfeasance, or non-performance by the Fellow, and that Harvard does not warrant or make any representations concerning the accuracy, completeness, suitability, condition or benefits of the Fellow's work, including any ideas, judgments, opinions, projections, analyses or estimates which the Fellow may provide in the course of the Engagement. The CITY agrees that (i) any decision the CITY may make to rely on any work product provided by the Fellow shall be at its own risk, and the CITY shall not make, and hereby waives, and fully releases and discharges Harvard from, any and all claims or causes of action relating to, any claims, liabilities, losses, damages, costs or expenses of any kind which the CITY may at any time sustain or incur in connection with or arising out of any work product or the CITY's reliance thereon or use thereof, or any other aspect of the Engagement and employment of the Fellow.

In no event shall CITY or Harvard be liable to the other for any indirect, consequential, exemplary or punitive damages whatsoever in connection with claims arising under or relating to this MOU, whether based upon a claim or action of contract, warranty, negligence, strict liability, or any other legal theory or cause of action, even if advised of the possibility of such damages.

8. <u>Intellectual Property</u>

The CITY shall be responsible to make arrangements directly with the Fellow in regard to ownership of work product produced by the Fellow in the course of the Engagement, and Harvard shall have no responsibility in regard to any such arrangements. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the CITY shall not condition, restrict or delay the Fellow's right to present or publish works of authorship describing the Fellow's experience and insights regarding the Engagement.

9. <u>Publicity and Use of Names</u>. Neither Party may issue a press release or other public announcement about this MOU, nor may it use any name, trademark or insignia of the other Party (or of any school, department or unit of the other Party) for promotional purposes or any other purposes in connection with this MOU, without the prior written approval of the other Party, except that each Party may identify the other in any description of the MOU in its customary listings of activities. Without limiting the foregoing, the Bloomberg Harvard City

Leadership Initiative at the Harvard Kennedy School may state on its website that it is funding a fellowship for the Fellow to work for CITY.

10. Other Provisions.

- (a) <u>Severability</u>. In the event that any provision or section of this MOU shall be held to be invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect in any respect whatsoever the validity of the remainder of the MOU.
- (b) <u>Notices</u>. Any notice under this MOU may be given in person, or sent by fax, by electronic mail, by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, or by recognized delivery service, to the Party's addresses listed below (or such other address as a Party may designate by notice given in accordance with this Section 10(b)), and such notice shall be deemed to have been given when so delivered, sent by fax or electronic mail, or mailed.

- (c) <u>Force Majeure</u>. Neither Party shall be liable for any delays or failures in performance due to circumstances beyond the Party's reasonable control.
- (d) <u>Entire Agreement</u>; <u>Amendment</u>. This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the transactions which are the subject matter hereof, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements concerning such transactions. This MOU may not be amended or modified except with the written consent of both Parties.
- (e) <u>No Third-Party Beneficiaries</u>. No person or entity other than the Parties shall have any rights, interests or claims under this Agreement or be entitled to any benefits under or on account of this Agreement as a third-party beneficiary or otherwise.
