Agreement With Second Chance Canine Adoption Shelter and/or Friends of WD Second Chance Shelter Inc., to work with the City to assist in the adoption of dogs WD that have been held by Dog Control and/or Animal Cruelty Officers, for the period of one (1) year from, April 1, 2023-March 31, 2024, with two (2) one-year renewal options with the approval of the Mayor and the Common Council.
- 11. Agreement With Onondaga County and Friends of Second Chance Adoption
 8-0 Shelter Inc, (Friends), for the use of the building located at 6660 East Seneca
 Turnpike, at a cost \$1.00, to allow City staff to work inside the facility to move dogs
 from the City Shelter to this location, with the goal to adopt them out in coordination
 with Friends, from the date of execution until termination by any party upon a ninety
 (90) day notice. There will be utilities charges for the property used and occupy.
- 12. Accept & Approve From National Grid (10,000 Trees Program) a reimbursement of \$13,850, to transfer to Syracuse Parks Conservancy, for the 277 trees that were planted (in 2022) at a rate of \$50 per tree, on behalf of the Department of Parks, Recreation & Youth Programs, Urban Forestry Master Plan.

- 15. Agreement With Syracuse Urban Partnership (SYRUP), for the 2023 Summer Fellows Program, to provide stipends for youth to attend programming with partner agency sub grantees, to provide enrichment programming for a total of 850 youth between the ages of 10 and up, as detailed in Exhibit "A". Total cost not to exceed \$600,000, from an account determined by the Commissioner of Finance. Included is 5% for administrative costs.

- 25. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2022 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$436,858, on behalf of the DPW, to purchase two (2) Packer 162 for the switch to use semi-automated collection of solid waste in carts.
