PROGRAM SUMMARY

BETWEEN THE OCTOBER AND NOVEMBER MONTHS IN FALL, 2022, THE CITY OF SYRACUSE PARKS DEPARTMENT HOSTED THREE (3) 'SOUTHSIDE PARKS COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT Summits' to gather input and feedback on 14 Southside PARK SPACES. THROUGH SEVERAL COMBINED FUNDING SOURCES TOTALING CLOSE TO ONE-MILLION DOLLARS, STAFF SUCCUESSFULLY

SOLCITIED OPEN ENDED FEEDBACK ON A VARIETY OF PROJECTS INCLUDING PLAYGROUND ENHANCEMENTS, MEMORIAL DESIGN, AND OTHER NEEDED CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS. DOLLARS ASSOCIATED WITH SPECIFIC PARKS AND IMPROVEMENTS ARE LISTED BELOW:



Syracuse has grown over the decades centered around parks, the neighborhoods have great ones, but they are maintained with budget in mind only. Go to Buffalo, go to Boston, go to Philadelphia. Their parks are assets to the community, cherished and maintained like historic cathedrals, that is what Syracuse should be doing. If we want more community we need a renaissance in public PLACES, good public spaces. Spend money on them, make them experiences to be in, hire local craftsmen and women, use the local talent to craft objectively beautiful and refreshing spaces to converse in and experience natural beauty. The tacky art installations that are used downtown do not engage the community, the colorful noncontextual pipe playground equipment doesn't entice a child a more than a pile of boulders, the lack of maintenance encourages people to not cherish their community spaces. We have the foundation of some really beautiful places here in Syracuse with our parks, we need only to think about them as neighborhood assets and canvas' for the art of nature and community.

Some of the funds should be designated for continuous maintenance so existing facilities can be well cared for. More facilities across parks to accommodate different age ranges and mobility/ uses. More elements designed for the disabled communities

UNLIKE the hideous light poles and, guard rails and playground set.
