

Dear Homeowner:

For the health and safety of the occupants of multiple dwellings and mixed-use buildings in the City of Syracuse, smoke detection systems must be tested and certified that they are in working order once a year by law.

If the smoke detection system in the building owned by you is battery-operated, you may test and certify the smoke detectors yourself. **All** the detectors in the stairways and basement or similar areas (common areas), **all** the detectors in the apartments (dwelling units) and **all** rooms used for sleeping purposes must be checked. When you are done, fill out the attached card, sign it, detach it, put a stamp on the reverse side by our address and mail it back to us.

If the smoke detection system is connected to the electrical system, a state licensed electrician is required to test and certify the system.

If you have questions, please contact your inspector at 448-_____. If the inspector is in the field, you will ring into his voice mail. If this occurs, please leave your name and phone number and the inspector will call you back.

Please take the time to certify your smoke detection system as soon as possible to avoid further notification from this office.
