Watch Commanders

421.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

Discretionary MODIFIED

This policy provides guidelines for the designation of a Watch Commander and, as needed, an acting Watch Commander for each watch.

421.2 POLICY

Discretionary

Each watch will be directed by a Watch Commander capable of making decisions and managing in a manner consistent with the mission of the Syracuse Police Department.

421.3 WATCH COMMANDER RESPONSIBILITIES

Discretionary MODIFIED

The Watch Commander shall have overall responsibility and accountability for the operation of this department on an assigned watch. Duties may include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Ensuring that the minimum and critical staffing levels for sergeants and officers are adhered to during each watch, in addition to the Watch Commander.
- (b) Ensuring sufficient members are on-duty to accomplish the mission of the Syracuse Police Department.
- (c) Providing command-level oversight of major crime scenes, tactical situations or disasters.
- (d) Establishing service-level priorities.
- (e) Providing job-related training and guidance to subordinates.
- (f) Acquiring outside resources or providing assistance to other agencies, when applicable.
- (g) Handling service inquiries.
- (h) Managing risk exposure.
- (i) Ensuring the security of all department facilities.
- (j) Ensuring the proper equipment and vehicles are available for member use.
- (k) Representing the Department at community functions.
- (I) Making the proper incident notifications to the Captain(s) and/or Duty Chief.
