Finance Committee Minutes Friday, November 13, 2020

Due to the declaration of a public health emergency and the social distancing requirements imposed at the Federal, State and local level, this meeting was held in accordance with Executive Order 202.1 by video/telephone conference that was made available to the public.

I. Call Meeting to Order

Ms. Murphy called the meeting to order at 8:10 a.m.

II. Roll Call

Ms. Murphy acknowledged all Committee members present.

III. Proof of Notice

Ms. Murphy noted that notice of the meeting had ben timely and properly provided.

IV. Minutes

Ms. Murphy asked for a motion approving the minutes from the October 14, 2020 Finance Committee meeting. Mr. Kinsey made the motion. Mr. Brown seconded the motion. ALL COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED THE MINUTES FROM THE OCTOBER 14, 2020 FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING.

V. New Business

Syracuse Urban Partnership

Ms. DeLaney reported that the Finance Committee is being asked to make a recommendation to the Board regarding the request from the Company to waive all or a portion of the Agency fee due at closing.

Ms. Murphy reported that she, Ms. DeLaney and Ms. Katzoff took a lot of time to examine the project, the application and the comparatives to other projects from the last 6-8 months to look at benefits ratio to project cost, etc. She came to the same conclusion as that of the National Development Council. This is a once in a lifetime project for the IDA. It is an investment being made simply because we are the gracious beneficiaries of a family foundation that has headquarters in Syracuse. \$30,000,000 transformative investment with exceptional community benefits (entrepreneurship, minority and people of color participation, a grocery store in downtown Syracuse, affordable housing, etc. as outlined in the NDC's memorandum). Ms. Murphy said this project cannot be compared to other projects. She recommended the Board consider a fee of \$25,000 for this application.

Mr. Brown agreed with Ms. Murphy's analysis. Thinks \$25,000 is fair and is supportive. Mr Brown suggested that the board consider a way to leverage any future waivers for the benefit of other projects in the geographic location, perhaps starting a small pool to help those projects to increase the positive impact of the waiver.

Ms. Murphy likes the idea of a pool of funds or assistance program for already scaled or beginning projects is a great idea and should be discussed and explored further.

Ms. Murphy asked for a motion to approve the reduction of the IDA fee. Mr. Sonneborn made the motion. Mr. Brown seconded the motion. ALL COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A MOTION TO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT THE IDA CHARGE A \$25,000 FEE FOR THE PROJECT.

Joint Schools Construction Board

Ms. Katzoff reported that the Agency received an application for financial assistance from the Joint Schools Construction Board. They are looking to refinance some or all of either their 2010 and/or 2011 outstanding bonds. In 2010 bonds were issued in the amount of just under \$31,500,000 to do renovations to 5 or 6 schools. In 2011 two tranches of bonds were issued – a taxable tail of \$15,000,000 and \$31,800,000 in tax-exempt bonds. The JSCB is working with the underwriter to evaluate those bonds. They are seeking approval to issue up to \$30,000,000 to refinance some or all of those bonds to reduce their debt service going forward. The Finance

Committee is being asked to make a recommendation to full board at their November 23, 2020 meeting that you support the issuance of the bonds.

Mr. Sonneborn asked if the Agency takes a fee. Ms. Murphy advised that the arrangement with the JSCB is to charge .5% fee on their transaction.

Ms. Murphy asked for a motion for a recommendation to the full board to authorize the refinancing. Mr. Brown made the motion. Mr. Thompson seconded the motion. ALL COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A MOTION TO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO UNDERSTAKE THE JSCB PROJECT AND APPROVAL OF THE ISSURANCE OF THE REFINANCING/REFUNDING BONDS.

Miscellaneous:

Ms. Katzoff reported that the Smith Building, LLC is on track to close next week. Dupli project is heading to closing prior to the end of the year.

VI. Adjournment

There being no further business to discuss Ms. Murphy asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. At 9:55 a.m. Mr. Kinsey made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Brown seconded the motion. ALL BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A MOTION TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AT 8:27 AM.





Project Description

The project involves the redevelopment of a vacant four-story 27,000 square foot commercial structure in downtown Syracuse. The renovation of approximately 25,424 square feet of the building for a mixed-use facility will include:

- Approximately 7,400 square feet on each of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th floors to consist of 8 affordable one bedroom apartment units per floor for a total of 24 units.
- Approximately 3,224 square feet on the first floor of which 1,813 square feet will be allocated to retail space with the balance to be used as a lobby, a mail and package delivery room, a bike storage room and a trash and recycling room. The first floor will also provide 8 on-site parking space.

Commercial tenant(s) are still to be determined, and an estimated 5 jobs that will be created as a result.

The total project cost is estimated to be \$4,722,346. The property was acquired by and is owned by a single-purpose ownership entity called 444 East Genesee Street LLC. The project has been granted Site Plan Approval by the City of Syracuse Planning Board. Plans provide for the property to be redeveloped over a 9 month period beginning in May of 2021 and completed by March of 2022.

444 East Genesee Street, LLC, has assembled an experienced development team to complete this project, consisting of The Icon Companies (developer/principal), In-Architects, Stone Hammer Construction, and the CNY Regional Planning and Development Board (development consultant).

The building is located on a one-acre parcel of land at the intersection of East Genesee Street and Townsend Street in downtown Syracuse, overlooking Firefighters Memorial Park. The building will be renamed "Corbett Corner" in honor of the Corbett family's 3 generations of Syracuse Firefighters. The location is at the center of an urban neighborhood immediately between the CBD, Syracuse University, Upstate Medical University, and other major hospitals, commercial, and institutional uses in the community. While downtown Syracuse is the fastest growing residential neighborhood in the county, there currently exists an under-supply of newly built and modern affordable housing options in an otherwise thriving marketplace.

The project will be financed through a commercial construction and permanent loan from the Community Preservation Corporation, NYS HCR PLP, and developer equity. The building has sat vacant for over 20 years due to the difficult rehabilitation challenges associated with improvement costs and feasibility. In addition to these perpetual challenges, the goal of this specific project is to provide affordable housing options to the community without compromising quality. Due to these conditions, the construction budget, and proforma, the requested SIDA benefits are crucial to the project's capacity to meet its operating and debt service costs and overall financial viability.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING WITH CONDITIONS A PROJECT SITE REVIEW FOR SITE AND FAÇADE ALTERATIONS ON PROPERTY SITUATED AT 444 EAST GENESEE STREET

We, the duly appointed members of the City Planning Commission of the City of Syracuse, do this 20th day of July, 2020, adopt the following resolution:

- WHEREAS, the applicant, 444 East Genesee Street, LLC, is requesting a Project Site Review to renovate an existing, vacant office building in order to establish 24 dwelling units and an unidentified commercial use on property situated at 444 East Genesee Street pursuant to Part V, Section IV, Article 2 and Part C, Section I, Article 10 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission held a virtual Public Hearing on the request via Webex on July 20, 2020, at 6:00 p.m., heard all those desiring to be heard, and duly recorded their testimony; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has studied the proposal and all submittals by the applicant and all interested parties; and
- WHEREAS, the subject property is a regular-shaped, double-corner lot with 53.5 feet of frontage on both East Genesee Street and McCarthy Street, and 145.03 feet of frontage on Townsend Street; and
- WHEREAS, the property lies within a Central Business District-Office and Service District zoning district, as do the adjacent and neighboring properties to the east, south, and west; neighboring properties to the north lie within a Central Business District-Office and Service (Restricted) zoning district; the property lies along the Connective Corridor and is in proximity to the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office, the Syracuse City Court, the Syracuse Police Department, and the Onondaga County Justice Center; and
- WHEREAS, land use in the area consists primarily of office, commercial, and retail uses; and
- WHEREAS, the "Syracuse Land Use and Development Plan" designates the character of this site, which lies within the downtown neighborhood, as Urban Core with a Downtown Overlay; and
- WHEREAS, the application included a property survey dated February 12, 2015, which illustrates a 52.13-foot by 142.1-foot, five-story building with a 45.22-foot by 101.31-foot first-floor footprint, and a 38-foot wide driveway on Townsend street connected to a 31-foot wide driveway on McCarthy Street by way of a 22-foot wide asphalt driveway within the City right-of-way; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was submitted to the City of Syracuse Departments of Engineering and Public Works, and the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board for review;
 - the DPW Transportation Planner defers to OCPB and does not a recommend a curb cut on Townsend Street.

- the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board suggested that the applicant consider introducing an alternative material or finish on the North Townsend Street and East Genesee Street façades; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was reviewed by the Onondaga County Planning Board pursuant to GML §239-1, m and n; said Board recommended that the proposal be modified so as to eliminate the off-street parking on Townsend Street, and install a continuous sidewalk to East Genesee Street; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to GML § 239-m, paragraph 5, the City Planning Commission shall not act contrary to the recommendation of the Onondaga County Planning Board except by a vote of a majority plus one of all the members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, in response to review comments, the applicant submitted a revised site plan (Sheet A003) dated September 6, 2019, and last revised (Rev 7) on August 3, 2020, which illustrates the first-floor footprint altered along South Townsend Street, 1,698 square feet of tenant space, a lobby, a mail and package delivery room, a bike storage room, and a trash and recycling room; and
- WHEREAS, the site plan illustrates alterations to the existing first-floor footprint by setting a portion of the first-floor façade facing South Townsend Street approximately 21.5 feet back from the street line to make room for six off-street parking spaces, and an area of concrete sidewalk along McCarthy Street removed to make room for two additional off-street parking spaces; and

As the Committee members are aware the JMA Tech project (the "*Original Project*") is well underway at the site of the former Coyne Textile building parcel and adjacent properties at Clinton and Cortland Streets. The \$26 million dollar project to demolish a portion of the old 118,000 sq. ft. Coyne building and construct a new 40,000 sq. ft. addition will create an advanced 5G manufacturing and innovation center as a focal of a planned 5G campus and create 100 plus jobs at completion.

At completion of this key economic development Project estimated leverage of new investment to the City will exceed \$60,000,000.

The Company has been working on certain additional improvements on South Clinton Street (between Taylor Street and Tallman Street) and along Cortland Avenue (between South Salina Street and Tallman Street) in the City of Syracuse, New York (the "*City*") all adjacent to, and as an enhancement to, the Original Project ("*Additional Improvements*") at a cost of \$1,114,660 above and beyond the cost of the improvements noted above.

During the course of the Additional Improvements, it was discovered that approximately 1,300 feet of water main lines and additional impacted/ancillary sewer lines all owned and controlled by the City (collectively, the "*Lines*") were in poor condition and not viable for long term service. The Lines service not only the Original Project but more importantly, the University area, the hospitals and South side neighborhoods (collectively, the "*Service Area*").

Since this discovery, the Company and the City have been collaborating on a solution that would result in the replacement, improvement and/or repair of the Lines for the benefit of the residents and businesses within the Service Area consisting of the replacement of approximately 1,300 feet of water main lines and the "slipping" of impacted/ancillary sewer lines to increase water flow and ensure viability of the Lines for decades to come (collectively, the "*Project*"). The costs of the Project approximate \$740,000 ("*Project Costs*") above and beyond the costs associated with the Original Project or the Additional Improvements.

The City authorized its participation in the Project with the Company to replace, improve or repair the Lines and agreed to provide all of the materials necessary to replace the Lines and to accept own and

maintain the new Lines and appurtenances installed by the Company all pursuant to plans and specifications approved by the Commissioner of Water and the Department of Health.

The Company has agreed to undertake the replacement/improvement/repair of the Lines.

The Company requested the Agency participate in the Project along with the City and provide certain financial assistance to the Company, in an amount not to exceed \$230,000, to help offset the Project Costs (the "*Financial Assistance*") for the benefit of the residents and businesses of the City and to leverage investments already made as well as encourage further investment in the in the Service Area.

This benefits and impacts of this Project to the City residents and its businesses, coupled with the leveraging of investments the Agency has already made in the Service Area (the Original Project and Salina 1st) as well as being able to leverage and attract new investment is well within the Agency's stated goals.

Ranalli/Taylor St LLC and JMA Tech Properties ("JMA") respectfully requests funding assistance for project expansion at the former Coyne Industrial Laundry site at 140 Cortland Avenue. Recall the original budget was presented to the Syracuse Industrial Development Agency at \$26,027,000 in the Spring 2020.

Since project kickoff in June 2020 JMA has identified additional business opportunities tied to the emerging 5G tech sector, the project plan now totals \$52,000,000. This investment will be transformative for the neighborhood, city, and region.

The revised plan is crafted to support future expansion leveraging the investment made to date. JMA in public partnership will be replacing two, 130-year-old water mains, one a major distribution to the Southside, downtown and University Hill section serving several hospitals. This represents a true savings to city taxpayers by reducing costly repairs, improving fire safety and service reliability. Additionally, JMA is separating the sanitary and storm infrastructure further reducing governmental burden and improving wastewater management, a combined cost for water and sewer at \$739,729.

The board is likely aware JMA is in process of purchasing the 100 block of Cortland Ave and the 1000 block of S Clinton with the goal to enlarge the campus for unhindered access to future buildings. Working with the Department of Environmental Conservation, JMA has applied to amend the existing Brownfield Cleanup Agreement to include S Clinton Street as the







contamination from Coyne has migrated into the adjacent city street. Having spent close to \$8 million to date, JMA could potentially invest an additional \$1.2 million to clean up an area contaminated by decades old industrial cleaning solvents. Facilitating the new traffic pattern due the street closing, JMA has agreed to install a new traffic signal at \$ Salina and Tallman for \$272,000 along with other improvements to the streets totaling \$ 1,835,985 such as grading, hardscapes, green scape, and curbing.

JMA respectfully requests financial assistance from SIDA to prepare the site for future expansion, confident the improvements directly benefit the city of Syracuse residents by:

- Substantial increase in employment numbers in addition to planned employment in the initial phase.
- Improvements to the aged water and sewer lines improving reliability of services and virtually eliminating the cost of repairs (particularly costly in the winter).
- The purchase of the streets reduces the amount of road surface to be maintained; cleaning, plowing, and patching.
- Environmental cleanup of soil and ground water.
- As a gateway to the Southside, the JMA 5G Campus will serve as a beacon in urban rejuvenation, transforming a neighborhood historically overlooked by business investment.

V. New Business

Syracuse Urban Partnership

Ms. DeLaney reported that the Finance Committee is being asked to make a recommendation to the Board regarding the request from the Company to waive all or a portion of the Agency fee due at closing.

Ms. Murphy reported that she, Ms. DeLaney and Ms. Katzoff took a lot of time to examine the project, the application and the comparatives to other projects from the last 6-8 months to look at benefits ratio to project cost, etc. She came to the same conclusion as that of the National Development Council. This is a once in a lifetime project for the IDA. It is an investment being made simply because we are the gracious beneficiaries of a family foundation that has headquarters in Syracuse. \$30,000,000 transformative investment with exceptional community benefits (entrepreneurship, minority and people of color participation, a grocery store in downtown Syracuse, affordable housing, etc. as outlined in the NDC's memorandum). Ms. Murphy said this project cannot be compared to other projects. She recommended the Board consider a fee of \$25,000 for this application.

Mr. Brown agreed with Ms. Murphy's analysis. Thinks \$25,000 is fair and is supportive. Mr Brown suggested that the board consider a way to leverage any future waivers for the benefit of other projects in the geographic location, perhaps starting a small pool to help those projects to increase the positive impact of the waiver.

Ms. Murphy likes the idea of a pool of funds or assistance program for already scaled or beginning projects is a great idea and should be discussed and explored further.

Ms. Murphy asked for a motion to approve the reduction of the IDA fee. Mr. Sonneborn made the motion. Mr. Brown seconded the motion. ALL COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A MOTION TO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS THAT THE IDA CHARGE A \$25,000 FEE FOR THE PROJECT.

Joint Schools Construction Board

Ms. Katzoff reported that the Agency received an application for financial assistance from the Joint Schools Construction Board. They are looking to refinance some or all of either their 2010 and/or 2011 outstanding bonds. In 2010 bonds were issued in the amount of just under \$31,500,000 to do renovations to 5 or 6 schools. In 2011 two tranches of bonds were issued – a taxable tail of \$15,000,000 and \$31,800,000 in tax-exempt bonds. The JSCB is working with the underwriter to evaluate those bonds. They are seeking approval to issue up to \$30,000,000 to refinance some or all of those bonds to reduce their debt service going forward. The Finance

Committee is being asked to make a recommendation to full board at their November 23, 2020 meeting that you support the issuance of the bonds.

Mr. Sonneborn asked if the Agency takes a fee. Ms. Murphy advised that the arrangement with the JSCB is to charge .5% fee on their transaction.

Ms. Murphy asked for a motion for a recommendation to the full board to authorize the refinancing. Mr. Brown made the motion. Mr. Thompson seconded the motion. ALL COMMITTEE MEMBERS PRESENT UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED A MOTION TO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS TO UNDERSTAKE THE JSCB PROJECT AND APPROVAL OF THE ISSURANCE OF THE REFINANCING/REFUNDING BONDS.

Miscellaneous:

Ms. Katzoff reported that the Smith Building, LLC is on track to close next week. Dupli project is heading to closing prior to the end of the year.

VI. Adjournment





Project Description

The project involves the redevelopment of a vacant four-story 27,000 square foot commercial structure in downtown Syracuse. The renovation of approximately 25,424 square feet of the building for a mixed-use facility will include:

- Approximately 7,400 square feet on each of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th floors to consist of 8 affordable one bedroom apartment units per floor for a total of 24 units.
- Approximately 3,224 square feet on the first floor of which 1,813 square feet will be allocated to retail space with the balance to be used as a lobby, a mail and package delivery room, a bike storage room and a trash and recycling room. The first floor will also provide 8 on-site parking space.

Commercial tenant(s) are still to be determined, and an estimated 5 jobs that will be created as a result.

The total project cost is estimated to be \$4,722,346. The property was acquired by and is owned by a single-purpose ownership entity called 444 East Genesee Street LLC. The project has been granted Site Plan Approval by the City of Syracuse Planning Board. Plans provide for the property to be redeveloped over a 9 month period beginning in May of 2021 and completed by March of 2022.

444 East Genesee Street, LLC, has assembled an experienced development team to complete this project, consisting of The Icon Companies (developer/principal), In-Architects, Stone Hammer Construction, and the CNY Regional Planning and Development Board (development consultant).

The building is located on a one-acre parcel of land at the intersection of East Genesee Street and Townsend Street in downtown Syracuse, overlooking Firefighters Memorial Park. The building will be renamed "Corbett Corner" in honor of the Corbett family's 3 generations of Syracuse Firefighters. The location is at the center of an urban neighborhood immediately between the CBD, Syracuse University, Upstate Medical University, and other major hospitals, commercial, and institutional uses in the community. While downtown Syracuse is the fastest growing residential neighborhood in the county, there currently exists an under-supply of newly built and modern affordable housing options in an otherwise thriving marketplace.

The project will be financed through a commercial construction and permanent loan from the Community Preservation Corporation, NYS HCR PLP, and developer equity. The building has sat vacant for over 20 years due to the difficult rehabilitation challenges associated with improvement costs and feasibility. In addition to these perpetual challenges, the goal of this specific project is to provide affordable housing options to the community without compromising quality. Due to these conditions, the construction budget, and proforma, the requested SIDA benefits are crucial to the project's capacity to meet its operating and debt service costs and overall financial viability.

We, the duly appointed members of the City Planning Commission of the City of Syracuse, do this 20th day of July, 2020, adopt the following resolution:

- WHEREAS, the applicant, 444 East Genesee Street, LLC, is requesting a Project Site Review to renovate an existing, vacant office building in order to establish 24 dwelling units and an unidentified commercial use on property situated at 444 East Genesee Street pursuant to Part V, Section IV, Article 2 and Part C, Section I, Article 10 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission held a virtual Public Hearing on the request via Webex on July 20, 2020, at 6:00 p.m., heard all those desiring to be heard, and duly recorded their testimony; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has studied the proposal and all submittals by the applicant and all interested parties; and
- WHEREAS, the subject property is a regular-shaped, double-corner lot with 53.5 feet of frontage on both East Genesee Street and McCarthy Street, and 145.03 feet of frontage on Townsend Street; and
- WHEREAS, the property lies within a Central Business District-Office and Service District zoning district, as do the adjacent and neighboring properties to the east, south, and west; neighboring properties to the north lie within a Central Business District-Office and Service (Restricted) zoning district; the property lies along the Connective Corridor and is in proximity to the Onondaga County Sheriff's Office, the Syracuse City Court, the Syracuse Police Department, and the Onondaga County Justice Center; and
- WHEREAS, land use in the area consists primarily of office, commercial, and retail uses; and
- WHEREAS, the "Syracuse Land Use and Development Plan" designates the character of this site, which lies within the downtown neighborhood, as Urban Core with a Downtown Overlay; and
- WHEREAS, the application included a property survey dated February 12, 2015, which illustrates a 52.13-foot by 142.1-foot, five-story building with a 45.22-foot by 101.31-foot first-floor footprint, and a 38-foot wide driveway on Townsend street connected to a 31-foot wide driveway on McCarthy Street by way of a 22-foot wide asphalt driveway within the City right-of-way; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was submitted to the City of Syracuse Departments of Engineering and Public Works, and the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board for review;

- the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board suggested that the applicant consider introducing an alternative material or finish on the North Townsend Street and East Genesee Street façades; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was reviewed by the Onondaga County Planning Board pursuant to GML §239-1, m and n; said Board recommended that the proposal be modified so as to eliminate the off-street parking on Townsend Street, and install a continuous sidewalk to East Genesee Street; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to GML § 239-m, paragraph 5, the City Planning Commission shall not act contrary to the recommendation of the Onondaga County Planning Board except by a vote of a majority plus one of all the members thereof; and
- WHEREAS, in response to review comments, the applicant submitted a revised site plan (Sheet A003) dated September 6, 2019, and last revised (Rev 7) on August 3, 2020, which illustrates the first-floor footprint altered along South Townsend Street, 1,698 square feet of tenant space, a lobby, a mail and package delivery room, a bike storage room, and a trash and recycling room; and
- WHEREAS, the site plan illustrates alterations to the existing first-floor footprint by setting a portion of the first-floor façade facing South Townsend Street approximately 21.5 feet back from the street line to make room for six off-street parking spaces, and an area of concrete sidewalk along McCarthy Street removed to make room for two additional off-street parking spaces; and

Judy,

As you know, early on in the pre-development process we decided to place extra emphasis on the building exterior in order to add a modern and aesthetically pleasing building to the City at a busy and highly visible corner. A combination of metal paneling and glass will make up the entire façade of the building. The project was bid to a number of glazing and metal panel installers as you will see in this document, however, one respondent bid both trades. That respondent was Ajay Glass, a company that has completed significant local projects including multiple building exteriors for SUNY-ESF, Upstate Medical, and Syracuse University.

Importance of Installation Method

If the metal panel system installer and the glazing installer are put under contract with the same company for installation, there are many advantages to this combination for this type of install. On this specific design there are many points of connections between the two products that have the potential to leak water or have draft issues where the products adjoin. Anywhere that the two products come together, flashing from both companies will meet and caulking/sealing at joints will be influenced by the installer. If there is ever a problem with water infiltration where the products come together, it will always be a challenge to determine what the cause is and what party will be responsible for the repair with two separate contractors. With a single installer there is a better opportunity for the two products to marry together more efficiently during construction and if there is ever an issue, a single source will be responsible for correcting it.

Local Workforce:

Although Ajay has completed many important projects in the area, they are not technically based in Syracuse but intend to employ all local workforce. Per email from Ajay Glass:

Ajay Glass is signatory to both the union Glaziers & Ironworkers.

The business agent representing the Glaziers is Bob Casella and he can be reached @ 585-224-6167 and for the Ironworkers is John Clark and he can be reached @ 315-952-2279.

If Ajay Glass was to be awarded this project we would employ the local labor force representing the glaziers to install the entrances, storefronts, curtainwalls, glass and glazing providing there is qualified manpower available at the time of the required installation. In addition we would employ the local labor force representing the ironworkers to install the insulated metal wall panels providing there is qualified manpower available at the time of the required installation.

Bids

The project general contractor, Stone Hammer Constructors, did indeed bid the glazing and metal paneling out to a handful of different companies. Their bids and/or election not to respond or bid is shown below:

The best Glazing bid (\$283,000) and best Metal Paneling bid (\$327,000) are combined cost of \$610,000. Comparatively, Ajay Glass has bid both at combined number of \$562,000. A project cost savings of \$48,000.



Request

Our project will meet HCR requirements of 20% MBE, 10% WBE, and are very accomplishing the stated goal of 6% Disabled Veteran Owned Business. There are some financial challenges in accomplishing these goals, and any cost savings from the building exterior would be very helpful to the project. The cost savings benefits of \$48,000 aside, we feel strongly that with the significant investment in the building's exterior, it is crucial to have the same contractor install both glazing and metal paneling for the reasons described in Importance of Installation section above. We are entering into a 30 year affordable housing agreement with HCR, and intend to own and manage this building for many decades to come. We would like to position ourselves for the most long-term, weathertight, aesthetically pleasing solution on the buildings exterior. Additionally, the company has indicated they will hire local workforce for the project as they have done for past local projects. For these reasons, we would like to request a waiver in order to hire Ajay Glass as a subcontractor.

Re: JMA Tech Properties LLC & Ranalli/Taylor St. LLC

As the Committee members are aware the JMA Tech project (the "*Original Project*") is well underway at the site of the former Coyne Textile building parcel and adjacent properties at Clinton and Cortland Streets. The \$26 million dollar project to demolish a portion of the old 118,000 sq. ft. Coyne building and construct a new 40,000 sq. ft. addition will create an advanced 5G manufacturing and innovation center as a focal of a planned 5G campus and create 100 plus jobs at completion.

At completion of this key economic development Project estimated leverage of new investment to the City will exceed \$60,000,000.

The Company has been working on certain additional improvements on South Clinton Street (between Taylor Street and Tallman Street) and along Cortland Avenue (between South Salina Street and Tallman Street) in the City of Syracuse, New York (the "*City*") all adjacent to, and as an enhancement to, the Original Project ("*Additional Improvements*") at a cost of \$1,114,660 above and beyond the cost of the improvements noted above.

During the course of the Additional Improvements, it was discovered that approximately 1,300 feet of water main lines and additional impacted/ancillary sewer lines all owned and controlled by the City (collectively, the "*Lines*") were in poor condition and not viable for long term service. The Lines service not only the Original Project but more importantly, the University area, the hospitals and South side neighborhoods (collectively, the "*Service Area*").

Since this discovery, the Company and the City have been collaborating on a solution that would result in the replacement, improvement and/or repair of the Lines for the benefit of the residents and businesses within the Service Area consisting of the replacement of approximately 1,300 feet of water main lines and the "slipping" of impacted/ancillary sewer lines to increase water flow and ensure viability of the Lines for decades to come (collectively, the "*Project*"). The costs of the Project approximate \$740,000 ("*Project Costs*") above and beyond the costs associated with the Original Project or the Additional Improvements.

The City authorized its participation in the Project with the Company to replace, improve or repair the Lines and agreed to provide all of the materials necessary to replace the Lines and to accept own and

maintain the new Lines and appurtenances installed by the Company all pursuant to plans and specifications approved by the Commissioner of Water and the Department of Health.

The Company has agreed to undertake the replacement/improvement/repair of the Lines.

The Company requested the Agency participate in the Project along with the City and provide certain financial assistance to the Company, in an amount not to exceed \$230,000, to help offset the Project Costs (the "*Financial Assistance*") for the benefit of the residents and businesses of the City and to leverage investments already made as well as encourage further investment in the in the Service Area.

This benefits and impacts of this Project to the City residents and its businesses, coupled with the leveraging of investments the Agency has already made in the Service Area (the Original Project and Salina 1st) as well as being able to leverage and attract new investment is well within the Agency's stated goals.

Dear Ms. Delaney,

Ranalli/Taylor St LLC and JMA Tech Properties ("JMA") respectfully requests funding assistance for project expansion at the former Coyne Industrial Laundry site at 140 Cortland Avenue. Recall the original budget was presented to the Syracuse Industrial Development Agency at \$26,027,000 in the Spring 2020.

Since project kickoff in June 2020 JMA has identified additional business opportunities tied to the emerging 5G tech sector, the project plan now totals \$52,000,000. This investment will be transformative for the neighborhood, city, and region.

The revised plan is crafted to support future expansion leveraging the investment made to date. JMA in public partnership will be replacing two, 130-year-old water mains, one a major distribution to the Southside, downtown and University Hill section serving several hospitals. This represents a true savings to city taxpayers by reducing costly repairs, improving fire safety and service reliability. Additionally, JMA is separating the sanitary and storm infrastructure further reducing governmental burden and improving wastewater management, a combined cost for water and sewer at \$739,729.

The board is likely aware JMA is in process of purchasing the 100 block of Cortland Ave and the 1000 block of S Clinton with the goal to enlarge the campus for unhindered access to future buildings. Working with the Department of Environmental Conservation, JMA has applied to amend the existing Brownfield Cleanup Agreement to include S Clinton Street as the







contamination from Coyne has migrated into the adjacent city street. Having spent close to \$8 million to date, JMA could potentially invest an additional \$1.2 million to clean up an area contaminated by decades old industrial cleaning solvents. Facilitating the new traffic pattern due the street closing, JMA has agreed to install a new traffic signal at \$ Salina and Tallman for \$272,000 along with other improvements to the streets totaling \$ 1,835,985 such as grading, hardscapes, green scape, and curbing.

JMA respectfully requests financial assistance from SIDA to prepare the site for future expansion, confident the improvements directly benefit the city of Syracuse residents by:

- Substantial increase in employment numbers in addition to planned employment in the initial phase.
- Improvements to the aged water and sewer lines improving reliability of services and virtually eliminating the cost of repairs (particularly costly in the winter).
- The purchase of the streets reduces the amount of road surface to be maintained; cleaning, plowing, and patching.
- Environmental cleanup of soil and ground water.
- As a gateway to the Southside, the JMA 5G Campus will serve as a beacon in urban rejuvenation, transforming a neighborhood historically overlooked by business investment.
