Resumes and Curriculum Vitae

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

What is the difference? What are they used for?

- We are perhaps most familiar with a professional RESUME:
 - Used when applying for a job
 - Focused on one's prior work experience and skill sets that make them valuable to an employer
- ► A CURRICULUM VITAE, or CV is a document used to obtain artrelated opportunities:
 - ▶ Set up in the same manner as a resume
 - ▶ Focused on one's prior art achievements, such as exhibits
 - Is designed to promote confidence in one's artistic abilities.

Professional Resume

Tailored each time for a specific opportunity

Length: 1 – 2 pages

Use: employment and internships

Content:

- Contact information
- ▶ Education
- professional experience (paid and unpaid) to include brief job descriptions
- ► Skills
- Awards and honors
- Possibly art achievements such as exhibits (depends on opportunity)

Curriculum Vitae (CV)

- Literally translates as the "course of one's life"
- More detailed account of all professional activities
- Length: as long as needed for academia and science; 1 2 pages for art is common
- ▶ Use: academia, research positions, art-related opportunities
 - ▶ Content:
 - contact information
 - Education
 - exhibition record
 - Awards, honors and grants
 - Commissions
 - Collections one's work is in
 - Lectures, publications and bibliography (reviews and articles about)
 - Art-related professional experience, professional affiliations/memberships, etc.

When to use a Curriculum Vitae, or "artist's resume"

- In an artist or exhibition catalog
- When applying for:
 - Exhibitions
 - Residencies
 - Grants
 - ▶ Public commissions
 - ▶ Private commissions
 - Graduate school (for art or art-related field)
 - ▶ Gallery affiliation
 - And other art-related opportunities

General information for both resumes and CVs:

- Use basic, legible fonts (i.e., Arial, Helvetica, Times) may choose a second font for headlines
- Margins ½ 1" best
- REVERSE CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER: newest items first!
- Highlight strengths through order of categories (most impressive first)
- Simple designs rather than overly busy
- First step in branding yourself: choose font and accent color carefully
- Save as a Word document to enable editing/revision/updates; submit as PDF to retain formatting
- The use of an "objective" statement is out of fashion for resumes and not generally used for CVs

Example of an artist CV:

- It is NOT necessary to put an objective in the CV. That's what a cover letter is for.
- Simple, clean design with a single accent color.
- Note the categories:
 - Education
 - Grants/Awards
 - Exhibits
 - Commissions
 - Bibliography
 - Publications
 - Relevant experience
 - ▶ Gallery representation

- Note that in both these examples, art-related work experience is included, but NOT foregrounded – it appears last.
- As one's professional achievements accumulate, education may become less important and be listed lower on the page.
