### **BY COUNCILOR BEY:**

Appropriate Funds - From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000 and enter into an agreement with the Syracuse Economic Development Corporation to establish a Small Business & Microenterprise Assistance Fund, to support access to operating capital for allowable uses and a Community Development Impact Fund to be administered as a revolving loan fund to support development projects, job creation and/or generate additional economic activity in the City, in accordance with the ARPA.

- 10. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$4,500,000 and enter into an agreement with Home 507 Headquarters (Urgent Care Program) until December 31, 2023, to provide support through home improvement partial loans to eligible owner-occupied homeowners for general repairs, as detailed in the legislation. There will be a 10% Administrative fee. The Mayor waived the RFP process.
- 11. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 and enter into an agreement with Home 508 Headquarters (Syracuse Homeowner Assistance and Repair Program (SHARP) until December 31, 2023, to provide small home improvement mini-grants to eligible owner-occupied homeowners for small repairs, as detailed in the legislation. There will be a 10% Administrative fee. The Mayor waived the RFP process.
- 12. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000 and enter into an agreement with Home 509 Headquarters (1% Loan Program) until December 31, 2023, to provide 1% interest loans to qualified owner-occupied homeowners for general repairs, as detailed in the legislation. There will be a 10% Administrative fee. The Mayor waived the RFP process.
- 13. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$500,000 and enter into an agreement with Home Headquarters (Closing Cost Assistance Program) until December 31, 2023, to provide financial support to generate and assist City first-time home buyers with closing cost assistance, as outlined in the legislation. There will be a 10% Administrative fee. The Mayor waived the RFP process.
- 14. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$70,000, to purchase B2G Now software to enable efficient and 511 effective MWBE Program operations that includes meeting program goals and better engagement with minority and women-owned businesses.
- 15. Application & Agreement To and with Empire State Development (ESD) for the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) in an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000, to be 512 used in a target business district (West Onondaga Street and South Avenue corridors) as the focal point for commercial and mixed-use redevelopment projects and investments in the physical environment (including infrastructure) to encourage greater density, walkability, sustainability, and economic growth. No local match required.
- 16. Special Permit To approve a restaurant located at 402 South Franklin. No one spoke in favor of or in opposition to the proposal. No waivers were granted. Walton Street #25 Corp, owner/applicant.
- 17. Special Permit To approve offices located 2118 East Genesee Street. No one spoke in favor of or in opposition to the proposal. No waivers were granted. CASALA, LLC, #26 owner/applicant.
