A LOCAL LAW OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO GRANT AND CONVEY TO NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION D/B/A NATIONAL GRID A PERMANENT EASEMENT ON A CITY OWNED LOT (TAX MAP NO. 085.-04-03.0) LOCATED ON THE NORTHWESTERLY CORNER OF SOUTH SALINA STREET AND DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING WEST STREET IN ORDER TO CONSTRUCT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN AN UNDERGROUND CHARGING VAULT STATION AS PART OF THEIR GAS MAIN SYSTEM

BE IT ENACTED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse, as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with the City Charter Section 6-202(3), the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to grant and convey to Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid a permanent easement on a City owned lot (Tax Map No. 085.-04-03.0) located on the northwesterly corner of South Salina Street and Dr. Martin Luther King West Street, as more fully described on the Legal Description and Map attached hereto as Exhibit A-1, in consideration of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), upon such terms and provisions and conditions as the Mayor may prescribe, in order for National Grid to construct, operate and maintain an underground charging vault station as part of their gas main system, and also granting to Niagara Mohawk the right of ingress and egress over said parcel to inspect, repair, maintain, and replace any the underground charging vault station and associated appurtenances.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect immediately subject to the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York.

Please prepare the following legislation for the next meeting of the Syracuse Common Council:

An Ordinance Granting a Permanent Easement to Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation d/b/a National Grid on a City Owned Lot (Tax Map # 085.-04-03.0), Located on the Northwesterly Corner of Salina Street and Dr. Martin Luther King West (a map and description of the permanent easement are attached to this request). The permanent easement is being requested so that National Grid can construct an underground charging vault station as part of their gas main system. This department has reviewed, coordinated with other City departments and is of the opinion that the Permanent Easement will not interfere with the use of the lot & the intended use is a benefit to the Public.

Grant of Easement:

City of Syracuse with offices located at 233 East Washington Street, Syracuse, New York 13202 (hereinafter referred to as "Grantor"), for consideration of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), and other valuable considerations paid, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged under seal, hereby grants to NIAGARA MOHAWK POWER CORPORATION, a New York corporation, having an address at 300 Erie Boulevard West, Syracuse, New York 13202 (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Grantee"), for Grantees and their lessees, licensees, successors, and assigns, the perpetual right and easement as described in Section 1 below (the "Easement") in, under, through, over, across, and upon the Grantor's land, as described in Section 2 below (the "Grantor's Land").

<u>Section 1 - Description of the Easement</u>. The "Easement" granted by the Grantor to the Grantee consists of a perpetual easement and right-of-way, with the right, privilege, and authority to:

- a. Construct, reconstruct, relocate, extend, repair, maintain, operate, inspect, patrol, and, at its pleasure, abandon or remove the underground gas distribution facilities including pipes, valves, fittings, vaults, housings, connectors, closures, markers, foundations, anchors and other fixtures and appurtenances; (collectively, the "Facilities"), which the Grantee shall require now and from time to time, for the transmission and distribution of natural gas, by any means, whether now existing or hereafter devised, for public or private use, in, upon, over, under, and across that portion of the Grantor's Land described in Section 3 below (the "Easement Area"), and the highways abutting or running through the Grantor's Land, and to renew, replace, add to, and otherwise change the Facilities and each and every part thereof and the location thereof within the Easement Area, and utilize the Facilities within the Easement Area for the purpose of providing service to the Grantor and others;
- b. From time to time, without further payment therefore, clear and keep cleared the Easement Area of any and all, aboveground or belowground structures, improvements, or other obstructions and trim and/or remove trees, roots and vegetation in or adjacent to the Easement Area that, in the opinion of the Grantee, may interfere with the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Facilities of the Grantee
- c. Excavate or change the grade of the Grantor's Land as is reasonable, necessary, and proper for any and all purposes described in this Section 1; provided, however, that the Grantee will, upon completion of its work, backfill and restore any excavated areas to reasonably the same condition as existed prior to such excavation; and
- d. Pass and repass along the Easement Area to and from the adjoining lands and pass and repass over, across, and upon the Grantor's Land to and from the Easement Area, and construct, reconstruct, relocate, use, and maintain such ways of access, if any, thereon, as are reasonable and necessary in order to exercise to the fullest extent the Easement
- <u>Section 2- Description of Grantor's Land</u>. The "Grantor's Land" is located Northwesterly Corner of Salina Street and Dr. Martin Luther King West, at City Owned Lot (Tax Map # 085.-04-03.0), within the City of Syracuse, County of Onondaga.

Section 3- Location of the Easement Area. The Easement being described as follows "ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL of land situate in the City of Syracuse, County of Onondaga, and State of New York being Part of Block 391 and Block 1003, more particularly described as follows: COMMENCING at the intersection of the westerly line of South Salina Street with the northerly line of Martin Luther King West Street being the point of beginning of lands of the City of Syracuse now or formerly being conveyed Deed 2583 Page 884 thence S 71° 04′ 19" W, 66.4′+/- along the northern line of Martin Luther King West Street to the Point of Beginning; Thence S 71° 04′ 19" W, 22.0′+/- continuing along the northern line of Martin Luther King West Street to a point; thence N 18° 55′ 41" W, 6.0′+/- through said lands of the City of Syracuse to a point; Thence N 71° 04′ 19" E, 22.0′+/- continuing through said lands to a point; Thence S 18° 55′ 41" E, 6.0′+/- continuing through said lands to the northern line of Martin Luther

King West Street and point of beginning. Containing 132 square feet of land more or less. The above described parcel of land being shown on a map prepared by Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation as Index 12.2-V2-M49, Map No. A-74450-C."

<u>Section 4 - Facilities Ownership.</u> It is agreed that the Facilities shall remain the property of the Grantee, its successors and assigns.

Section 5 - General Provisions. The Grantor, for itself, its heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees with the Grantee that no act will be permitted within the Easement Area which is inconsistent with the Easement hereby granted; no buildings or structures, or replacements thereof or additions thereto, swimming pools, or obstructions will be erected or constructed above or below grade within the Easement Area; no trees shall be grown, cultivated, or harvested, and no excavating, mining, or blasting shall be undertaken within the Easement Area without the prior written consent of the Grantee, it being the intent that the Easement herein conveyed is intended to prohibit the longitudinal or parallel use or occupancy of said Easement Area by surface or subsurface activities or structures which might damage or interfere with the Facilities; the Easement shall not be modified nor the Easement Area relocated by the Grantor without the Grantee's prior written consent; the present grade or ground level of the Easement Area will not be changed by excavation or filling.

The Grantee, its successors and assigns, are hereby expressly given and granted the right to assign this Easement, or any part thereof, or interest therein, and the same shall be divisible between or among two or more owners, as to any right or rights created hereunder, so that each assignee or owner shall have the full right, privilege, and authority herein granted, to be owned and enjoyed either in common or severally. This Grant of Easement shall at all times be deemed to be and shall be a continuing covenant running with the Grantor's Land and shall inure to and be binding upon the successors, heirs, legal representatives, and assigns of the parties named in this Grant of Easement.

National Gird shall file the easement with the County Clerk and be responsible for all costs associated with this process. A copy of the filed easement shall be sent to the City of Syracuse.

BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 786-2017 OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$666,000.00) TO DEFRAY THE COST AND EXPENSE OF THE SCOPING, PRELIMINARY DESIGN AND **DETAILED DESIGN PHASES OF THE** DOWNTOWN MILL AND PAVE PROJECT, PIN NO. 3756.25 AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 522-2020 TO ADD THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF FOUR MILLION ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$4,180,000.00) TO DEFRAY THE COST AND EXPENSE OF THE CONSTRUCTION AND CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION PHASES OF THE PROJECT AND AS LAST AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 209-2021 TO ADD THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$175,000) FOR ADDITIONAL CONSTRUCTION AND CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION PHASE COSTS

BE IT ORDAINED, that Ordinance No. 786-2017 as last amended by Ordinance No. 209-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific object or purpose of providing funds to defray the cost and expense of the Scoping, Preliminary Design, Detailed Design, Construction and Construction Inspection Phases of the Downtown Mill and Pave Project at an estimated maximum cost not to

exceed <u>Four Million Nine Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,974,000.00</u>)*, general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. <u>Four Million Nine Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,974,000.00)</u> * is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific object or purpose for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific object or purpose consists of the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of <u>Four Million Nine Hundred</u>

<u>Seventy-Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,974,000.00)</u> *, thereby providing such sum for the initial cost of such specific object or purpose, with additional bonds to be issued in the future to finance the balance of the Project.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific object or purpose for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 20 (c) of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is fifteen (15) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law.

The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance.

The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are reasonably expected to be received, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 8. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

Section 10. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this Ordinance be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect immediately.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A SMALL

WHICH WILL BE OWNED AND MAINTAINED BY
VERIZON WIRELESS

WHEREAS, Bell Atlantic Mobile Systems of Allentown d/b/a Verizon Wireless ("Verizon Wireless") has requested that the Common Council and the Mayor of the City of Syracuse approve a Small Wireless Facilities Pole Replacement and Maintenance Agreement (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, this Agreement would permit Verizon Wireless to install new poles and to replace certain existing City poles, subject to the approval of the City Engineer, to install small wireless facilities in the City right of way pursuant to local law and Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") Order #18-133; and

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse and Verizon Wireless have negotiated a proposed

Agreement which complies with local law and the FCC Order, and protects the public interest of the

City of Syracuse with respect to allowing access to the City's Right of Way; and

WHEREAS, the term of this Agreement shall be for twenty (20) years in accordance with the Small Wireless Master Facilities License Agreement previously authorized by Ordinance # 210-2019; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, as follows:

(1) That subject to the approval of the Mayor, the Common Council hereby approves the Verizon Wireless request for a Small Wireless Facilities Pole Replacement and Maintenance Agreement and authorizes such Agreement between the City of Syracuse and Verizon Wireless in

substantially the same form as attached hereto as Exhibit "A";

(2) The Mayor, on behalf of the City of Syracuse is authorized to execute the above referenced Agreement with Verizon Wireless, subject to review and approval by the City's Corporation Counsel; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval by the Mayor.

EXHIBIT "A"

POLE REPLACEMENT AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

THIS MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") entered into as of the ____ day of 2021 (the "Effective Date") by and between the City of Syracuse, with its principal offices at 233 E. Washington Street, Syracuse, NY 13202 ("City") and Bell Atlantic Mobile Systems LLC d/b/a Verizon Wireless, with its principal offices at One Verizon Way, Mail Stop 4AW100, Basking Ridge, New Jersey 07920 ("Verizon"). CITY and VERIZON are at times collectively referred to hereinafter as the "Parties" or individually as the "Party."

RECITALS

- A. Verizon entered into a Small Wireless Facilities Master License Agreement ("MLA") with the City of Syracuse on June 6th, 2019.
- B. Verizon has been granted the right to replace certain existing street light poles owned by the City with new street light poles which will be owned by Verizon ("Pole"), subject to permissions attained via the Pole Application process described in Paragraph 4 of the MLA.
- C. Verizon will own and maintain the Poles and use the Poles for installation and operation of its small wireless facility.
- D. City will have the right to install and operate a street light and any other required signaling equipment or signage upon the Poles.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions hereinafter set forth, and the above recitals which are by this reference incorporated herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the parties hereto, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF POLE</u>. Verizon shall have the right, subject to the City's approval, to remove certain existing City-owned street light poles, pedestrian signal poles, and signage poles, and reinstall in its place the Pole, that is consistent with the design standards pursuant to the MLA, all as pursuant to plans approved by the City. Verizon shall not remove an existing pole until ready to install the new pole in its place so as to minimize the amount of time the attached city facility is not in operation. Verizon will compensate the City for any injury or loss incurred by any delay related to the pole replacement Verizon will own the Pole and shall use the Pole for the installation, operation and maintenance of a small wireless facility, pursuant to the plans approved by the City. Verizon shall install and maintain the Pole at its sole cost and expense and in a manner consistent with industry standards and in a manner compliant with applicable law. Upon removal of the City-owned street light pole, pedestrian signal pole, or signage pole, Verizon shall deliver said poles to a facility or property owned by the City as directed by the Commissioner of Public works at no cost to the City.
- 2. <u>INSTALLATION OF STREET LIGHT</u>, <u>PEDESTRIAN SIGNAL</u>, <u>AND SIGNAGE</u>. Verizon shall install on the Pole, on behalf of City, a street light ("Street Light"), pedestrian signal or signage pursuant to the plans submitted to the City and approved by the City pursuant to Paragraph 4 of the MLA. Furthermore, Verizon shall install on the Poles, on behalf of the

City, any required pedestrian traffic signal equipment and street signage. Verizon shall pay for the cost of the initial installation of the Street Light, pedestrian traffic signal, and street signage on the Poles. These costs include, but are not limited to, all costs associated with labor, equipment, and insurance. Verizon shall supply a report to the City Engineer certifying that the installation has been completed in accordance with the approved plans and that the equipment installed on said Poles is operational. After the initial installation of the Street Light, pedestrian traffic signal equipment, and street signage, City shall be responsible for the maintenance, repair and replacement of the Street Light, pedestrian traffic signal, and street signage at City's sole cost and expense. Any repairs required for Verizon's sole benefit shall not be the responsibility of the City. In the event City requires access to the Pole for maintenance, repair or replacement of the Street Light, it shall give Verizon not less than 24 hours prior written notice, except in the event of emergency, in which case City shall provide notice to Verizon as soon as practicable. In the event City desires to replace or modify the Street Light, it shall provide construction drawings, along with a satisfactory structural analysis for review and approval, of which shall not be unreasonably withheld, by Verizon.

- 3. <u>DAMAGE TO POLE</u>. Except in the event such damage arises out of the negligence or willful misconduct of the City, its employees or contractors, in the event a Pole is damaged or knocked down such that it requires repair or replacement, Verizon shall repair or replace the Pole at Verizon's sole cost and expense. Upon receipt of notice that the Pole requires replacement, Verizon shall replace the Pole with a new identical Pole, provided that such a Pole is currently in inventory. If an identical Pole is not in inventory but a substantially similar pole is, Verizon shall notify the City and shall submit, for the City's approval, the specifications of the substantially similar pole. Upon approval, Verizon may replace the Pole with the substantially similar pole. In the event a replacement Pole is not in inventory, Verizon shall notify City and City shall install a temporary pole to support the City facility, and Verizon shall reimburse the City for all costs associated with such installation within 30 days of receipt of a detailed invoice. Verizon shall certify, prior to installation, that temporary pole is structurally capable of supporting Verizon's associated equipment. In the event the City installs a temporary pole, Verizon shall be permitted to replace the temporary pole with a new Pole once such a Pole becomes available.
- 4. <u>ELECTRICAL</u>. Verizon shall be solely responsible for the cost of electricity used by its small wireless facility located on the Pole. Verizon shall also be responsible for installing any new meter, if required, and for any associated costs. City shall be solely responsible for the cost of electricity used by the Street Light or pedestrian signal if applicable.
- 5. <u>TERM</u>. This Agreement shall be coterminous with the MLA and shall commence upon the date that Verizon commences removal of the City-owned poles.
- 6. <u>ACCESS</u>. City agrees that Verizon, its employees and/or agents shall have access to the Pole 24 hours a day, seven days a week for the purpose of design, construction, installation, upgrading, maintenance and repair of the Pole, including testing of the radio frequency coverage of the area.
- 7. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>. Verizon, its successors, assigns, and agents, shall indemnify, defend and hold the City, its officers and employees, agents and contractors (the "Indemnified Parties") harmless from any and all liability from any and all injury, loss, damage, claims, costs and expenses of every name and nature to person or property which may accrue or grow out of Verizon's Use or Verizon's breach of this Agreement. Verizon's indemnity shall not apply to any liability resulting from the gross negligence or reckless or willful misconduct of the City. The

City shall give (within sixty (60) days from the date the City is served with a Notice of Claim) written notice to Verizon of any claim for which the City seeks indemnification. Verizon shall have the right to investigate these claims. Verizon shall not settle any claim without reasonable consent of the City, unless the settlement (i) will be fully funded by Verizon, and (ii) does not contain an admission of liability or wrongdoing by any Indemnified Party. Neither party will be liable under this Agreement for consequential, special, punitive or indirect damages, whether under theory of contract, tort (including negligence), strict liability, or otherwise.

8. <u>LIMITATION OF LIABILITY</u>. Except for indemnification pursuant to Paragraph 7, neither Party shall be liable to the other, or any of their respective agents, representatives, employees for any lost revenue, lost profits, loss of technology, rights or services, incidental, punitive, indirect, special or consequential damages, loss of data, or interruption or loss of use of service, even if advised of the possibility of such damages, whether under theory of contract, tort (including negligence), strict liability or otherwise.

9. INSURANCE.

- (a) Verizon and its subcontractors shall carry the following insurance: (i) commercial general liability insurance in an amount of \$3,000,000 per occurrence and \$5,000,000 general aggregate and which provides coverage for bodily injury, death, damage to or destruction of property of others, including loss of use thereof, and including products and completed operations; (ii) Workers' Compensation Insurance as required by law; and (iii) employer's liability insurance in an amount of \$500,000 bodily injury each accident, \$500,000 disease each employee, and \$500,000 distance policy limit.
- (b) The insurance coverages identified in this Section: (i) except the workers' compensation insurance, shall include the City as an additional insured as their interests may appear under this Agreement; (ii) will be primary and non-contributory with respect to any self-insurance or other insurance maintained by the City; (iii) contain a waiver of subrogation for the City's benefit; and (iv) will be obtained from insurance carriers having an A.M. Best rating of at least A-VII and approved to do business in New York State.
- (c) Verizon shall provide the City Central Permit Desk with a Certificate of Insurance to provide evidence of insurance. Verizon will endeavor to provide the City with thirty (30) days prior written notice of cancellation upon receipt of notice thereof from its insurer(s).
- 10. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, provided Verizon is not in default hereunder beyond applicable notice and cure periods, this agreement may be terminated prior to the expiration of its term: (i) by City upon written notice to Verizon, if Verizon fails to pay any amount when due and such failure continues for thirty (30) days after Verizon's receipt of notice; (ii) by the City if the Equipment or Pole is installed or modified in a manner that differs from the design documents in the corresponding Pole Application in a material respect, provided the City first notifies Verizon of the material discrepancy, and Verizon fails to cure within sixty (60) days of the notice; (iii) by either Party upon written notice to the other Party, if such other Party fails to comply with this Agreement and the party has failed to initiate a cure within sixty (60) days after receipt of written notice; (iv) by Verizon at any time for any reason or no reason, upon written notice to the City; or (v) by Verizon in the event that Verizon fails to timely obtain or maintain, or is not satisfied with any governmental approval applicable to Verizon, provided Verizon first appeals such non-approval to the City Engineer within thirty (30) days of the non-approval, and the City Engineer affirms such non-approval or fails to otherwise cure a delay within thirty (30) days of the receipt of the appeal.
- 11. <u>REMOVAL</u>. Upon the expiration or within 90 days of the earlier termination of this Agreement, Verizon shall consult with the City Engineer who will provide instruction to either

remove any and/or all Pole(s) and replace with one of the City's original poles, keep any and/or all Pole(s), without the need for a bill of sale, and cap after removing excess height, or nay alternative measure.

- 12. <u>GOVERNING LAW</u>. This Agreement and the performance thereof shall be governed, interpreted, construed and regulated by the laws of the State of New York.
- 13. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>. This Agreement may be sold, assigned or transferred by Verizon without any approval or consent of the City to Verizon's principal, affiliates, subsidiaries of its principal or to any entity which acquires all or substantially all of Verizon's assets in the market defined by the Federal Communications Commission in which the Pole is located by reason of a merger, acquisition or other business reorganization. As to other parties, this Agreement may not be sold, assigned or transferred without the written consent of the City, which such consent will not be unreasonably withheld, delayed or conditioned. No change of stock ownership, partnership interest or control of Verizon or transfer upon partnership or corporate dissolution of Verizon shall constitute an assignment hereunder.
- 14. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices hereunder must be in writing and shall be deemed validly given if sent by certified mail, return receipt requested or by commercial courier, provided the courier's regular business is delivery service and provided further that it guarantees delivery to the addressee by the end of the next business day following the courier's receipt from the sender, addressed as follows (or any other address that the Party to be notified may have designated to the sender by like notice):

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00) TO DEFRAY THE COST AND EXPENSE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS 2021/2022 FIBER OPTIC TRUNK PROGRAM

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific object or purpose of providing funds to defray the cost and expense of the engineering services and construction needed for the Department of Public Works 2021/2022 Fiber Optic Trunk Program, to replace the functionally obsolete fiber optic trunk that serves the signal interconnect system at the Department of Public Works, at a cost not to exceed Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00), general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific object or purpose for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific object or purpose consists of the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00), thereby providing such sum for all the maximum cost of such specific object or purpose.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific object or purpose for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 35 of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is five (5) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City.

All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance. The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this

ordinance and that the interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

WHEREAS, the retirement of the Glenwood substation requires that the City replace between 150 and 200 utility poles with street lights on them in and around the Strathmore neighborhood. The City will be required to remove all affected streetlights from the old poles and remount them on National Grid's new poles. - (2) The term of the agreement authorized herein shall be from July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021; the agreement is hereby extended through June 30, 2022.
- (3) The City shall pay to Harlan Electric Company, Inc. an amount not to exceed \$70,000.00 for all services to be provided under the agreement authorized herein.

The Skaneateles Lake Watershed Agricultural Program is conducted as a requirement of the June 28, 2004 filtration waiver issued by the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH). This will be the twenty-eighth year of a renewable Intermunicipal agreement with the Onondaga County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD), which administers the program for the City. TRUCK AND A PICKUP TRUCK FOR USE BY
FORESTRY OPERATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific objects or purposes of providing funds to defray the cost and expense of the 2021/2022 Capital Improvement Program for the Department of Parks, Recreation and Youth Programs, which will involve the purchase of a Chip Truck and a PickUp Truck to be used by Forestry Operations, at a cost not to exceed One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$170,000.00), general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$170,000.00) is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific objects or purposes for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific objects or purposes consists of the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$170,000.00), thereby providing such sum for all the maximum cost of such specific object or purpose.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific objects or purposes for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 28 of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is fifteen (15) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance. The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to

initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are reasonably expected to be received, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 8. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

Section 10. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the

publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

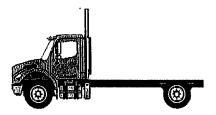

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

	This Memorandum of Understanding (this "Memorandum"), effective the day
of _	, 2021, is by and between the City of Syracuse (the "City") acting by
and	through the Commissioner of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Youth Programs,
	ng an office at 412 Spencer Street, Syracuse, New York 13204 (referred to respectively as
	"Commissioner" and the "Department") and the Syracuse Parks Conservancy, Inc., a not-
	profit corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of New York, whose address is
	Box 11384, Syracuse, NY 13218 (the "Conservancy").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the City holds all right, title and interest in various public parks, playgrounds and open spaces located within the City (collectively, "City Parks");

WHEREAS, the Commissioner, pursuant to Section 5-1201 of the Charter of the City of Syracuse, is charged with the responsibility of maintaining and operating the City Parks and planning and improving recreation facilities located thereon;

WHEREAS, the Conservancy was organized to assist the City through a public/private partnership to help ensure that the City Parks are restored, enhanced, protected, developed and operated to optimize the educational, recreational and wellness uses thereof by the citizens of the City, the surrounding communities and their guests;

WHEREAS, the City, the Commissioner and the Conservancy, without usurping the rights and responsibilities of the City and the Commissioner in maintaining and operating the City Parks, intend to work together to create an effective public/private partnership in furtherance of the joint and consistent objectives of the City and the Conservancy, bringing to the City, amongst other things, additional input from the residents of the City and the surrounding communities and various educational and other institutions regarding the restoration, enhancement, protection, development and operation of the City Parks, coordinating their efforts to best serve the interest of the citizens of the City, the surrounding communities and their guests;

WHEREAS, the Conservancy intends to provide additional funding through, *inter alia*, solicitation of private and public funds and/or available grants not otherwise available to or pursued by the City together with other resources generated by and/or available through the Conservancy in furtherance of the purposes set forth herein and, in addition thereto, labor, through volunteers and otherwise, to assist in bringing about the common objectives of the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, this Memorandum is intended to establish and outline the public/private partnership between the City and the Conservancy in furtherance of the joint objectives thereof

NOW, THEREFORE, the City, the Commissioner and the Conservancy, to the extent authorized by law and within existing legal authorities, agree as follows:

1. The Conservancy shall remain a not-for-profit corporation dedicated to the restoration, enhancement, protection, development and operation of City Parks to optimize the educational, recreational and wellness use thereof by the citizens of the City, the surrounding communities and their guests.

- 2. (a) The Conservancy shall be governed by a board of trustees ("Board") established and governed in accordance with the Conservancy's by-laws and any amendments to its by-laws, provided that:
 - (i) The Mayor of the City shall have the right either to be a member of the Board or to appoint one member to the Board; and
 - (ii) The Commissioner shall have the right either to be a member of the Board or to appoint one member to the Board; and
 - (iii) The Common Council of the City shall have the right to appoint two members to the Board, who may or may not be members of the Common Council.
- (b) Any member appointed to the Board pursuant to clauses (i), (ii) and (iii) above shall enjoy the same voting rights as those members appointed to the Board pursuant to the Conservancy's by-laws and any amendments to its by-laws.
- Consistent with the notion of a public/private partnership and in an effort to ensure the efficient allocation of the resources of the parties hereto, the City and the Commissioner may solicit and take due consideration of input from the Conservancy in the preparation of the operating and capital budgets for the City Parks and may review and consult with each other concerning operating assumptions, major fund raising projects, budget allocations, maintenance, operations, program priorities and the like; provided, however, nothing in this Memorandum shall usurp the rights and responsibilities of the City and the Commissioner in maintaining and operating the City Parks, the Commissioner remaining entitled, in the Commissioner's sole judgment, to make any additions, alterations, repairs, decorations or improvements to any City Parks and/or improvements located thereon at the City's expense, without any requirement to do so. The City and the Commissioner shall have final authority over all capital projects, programs and policies undertaken in City Parks. The Conservancy shall be responsible for deciding the projects and programs for which it will raise monies from donors; provided, however, any capital projects undertaken in the City Parks shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner. The parties hereto shall share with each other all existing or hereafter obtained information including all plans and proposals, whether or not effectuated, research and other data regarding the City Parks and the common objectives thereof and the parties will support each other's efforts regarding major fund-raising projects.
- 4.(a) The Commissioner shall permit access to the City Parks to the Conservancy or its duly authorized representative(s) at all reasonable times. The Conservancy may provide services in City Parks upon reasonable notice to and under the general supervision of the Commissioner, including horticultural, maintenance, educational, recreational tours, food, products, programs together with design and construction services (when such design and construction services have been approved and accepted by the City in accordance with

applicable laws, ordinances and City rules and regulations) and, where appropriate, may derive revenues through fees or other charges for services or products; provided, however, net revenues generated by any activities in City parks shall be used in furtherance of the restoration, enhancement, protection, development and operation of the City Parks, or, with respect to Collaborative Projects, as defined below, such portion of the net revenues as the Conservancy and the Commissioner shall agree to in advance.

- (b) Any activity or use contemplated by any proposed concession in any of the City Parks shall comply with all applicable requirements, rules and regulations, as well as the procedures for the selection of concessionaires if other than the Conservancy. The Commissioner shall be provided with reasonable notice of any proposed concession in a City Park, which notice shall include a detailed description of all goods proposed to be sold thereat (hereinafter referred to as the "Goods"), if any. The Conservancy shall be deemed to warrant that any Goods sold at any concession shall be merchantable and of good quality. Not later than the 15th day of February of each year, the Conservancy shall certify to the Commissioner as to the net revenues generated as a result of its activities in City Parks and that such revenues have been expended in furtherance of the restoration, enhancement, protection, development and operation of the City Parks and/or are being held for such purpose.
- (c) The Conservancy may collaborate or work jointly with other not-for-profit organizations that are located within or outside the City of Syracuse ("Collaborative Organizations") on projects and programs that further the goals and objectives of this Memorandum, even though the project or program may benefit parks, playgrounds or open spaces outside the City of Syracuse in addition to benefiting the City Parks ("Collaborative Projects"). The Commissioner shall approve in advance and in writing the Conservancy's participation in any Collaborative Project.
- 5. The Conservancy and the Commissioner shall work together to organize and coordinate joint work done by the Conservancy and employees of the Department in order to promote maximum efficiency. The Conservancy and the Commissioner shall work together to monitor and assess the success of any joint projects and to disseminate lessons learned to interested parties to benefit the continued maintenance and operation of City Parks. The Conservancy, the City and the Commissioner shall also cooperate in publicizing and promoting to the general public, through print, broadcast and social media, and otherwise, the activities and accomplishments of the City, the Commissioner and the Conservancy resulting from their joint efforts in fulfilling the goals and objectives of this Memorandum. In addition, the City, the Department and the Conservancy, on their respective websites, shall prominently disclose the existence and purpose of this Memorandum, with each party's website containing links to the other parties' websites.
- 6. The Conservancy shall faithfully perform and carry out the provisions of this Memorandum and cause its agents, employees, Collaborative Organizations and invitees to conform to all rules, regulations and orders now prescribed or which may hereafter be

prescribed by the Commissioner and comply with all laws, regulations, rules and orders of any kind whatsoever and of any agency or entity of government whatsoever applicable to the City Parks and the Conservancy's use and occupation thereof. The Conservancy shall not use or allow any City Park to be used or occupied for any unlawful purpose or in violation of any certificate of occupancy or the provisions on the use of such City Park as set out in this Memorandum or prohibited by federal, state or local law, ordinance or rules and regulations.

- 7. Prior to conducting any activities or Collaborative Projects in City Parks as authorized by this Memorandum, the Conservancy, at its own cost and expense, shall procure and maintain public liability insurance in commercially reasonable coverage of at least one million (\$1,000,000) dollars single limit with the City named as an additional insured and with reasonably acceptable insurers to protect the Conservancy, Commissioner and the City from any claims for loss or damage to property and for personal injuries, including death, which may arise directly or indirectly from any activities in City Parks as authorized by this Memorandum by the Conservancy, sub-licensees, Collaborative Organizations or anyone directly or indirectly employed by the Conservancy. The Conservancy shall provide and maintain workers compensation insurance of at least the statutory minimum for any employees of the Conservancy. Upon request, certificates of insurance shall be provided to the Commissioner.
- 8. The City, the Commissioner and the Conservancy shall cooperate fully and faithfully with any investigation, audit or inquiry conducted by a State of New York (the "State") or governmental agency or authority of the City that is empowered directly or by designation to compel the attendance of witnesses and to examine witnesses under oath or conducted by the inspector general of any such government agency that is a party in interest to the transaction, submitted bid, submitted proposal, contract, lease, permit or license that is the subject of the investigation, audit or inquiry.
- 9. The Conservancy shall keep books of account and records of all operations pursuant to this Memorandum in a manner reasonably satisfactory to the Commissioner and allow an inspection of such books of account and records upon reasonable request thereof. In addition thereto, the Conservancy, upon request, shall provide the Commissioner with copies of sales tax reports regarding net revenues generated as a result of its activities and Collaborative Activities in City Parks as well as annual tax returns.
- 10. It is understood that no employees, servants or agents of the Conservancy or of a Collaborative Organization are, solely by reason thereof, employees of the Department or the City and that the Conservancy alone is responsible for their work, direction, compensation and personal conduct while engaged under this Memorandum solely as an employee, servant or agent of the Conservancy or of a Collaborative Organization. Nothing included in this section or in any other provision of this Memorandum shall be construed to impose any liability or duty upon the Department or the City to persons, firms or corporations employed or engaged by the Conservancy or by a Collaborative Organization as consultants, experts or independent contractors or in any other capacity whatsoever to make the Department or the City liable for

the acts, omissions, liabilities, obligations and taxes of whatsoever nature of the Conservancy or a Collaborative Organization or their consultants, experts, employees, servants, agents or independent contractors.

- 11. The Conservancy shall not discriminate against any employee, applicant for employment or anyone desiring to attend or participate in the Conservancy's activities, programs or Collaborative Programs because of race, creed, religion, color, sex, age, national origin, sexual orientation or affectional preference.
- 12. Where provision is made herein for notice to be given in writing, the same may be given by nationally recognized overnight carrier or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the address first above provided or to such other address as shall be filed with the Commissioner or the Conservancy or by personally delivering a copy of said notice to the Conservancy or the Commissioner at such address.
- 13. The Conservancy assumes all risk in its operation pursuant to the Memorandum. The Conservancy shall hold harmless the City, the Department and their officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, actions or judgments arising out of any violation of any law and from any and all claims for loss, damage or injury including death or property damage of whatever kind or nature arising from the Conservancy's operation hereunder including the negligence thereof.
- 14. The City assumes all risk in its operation pursuant to the Memorandum. The City shall hold harmless the Conservancy and its trustees, officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, actions or judgments arising out of any violation of any law and from any and all claims for loss, damage or injury including death or property damage of whatever kind or nature arising from the City's operation hereunder including the negligence thereof.
- 15. If any provision of this Memorandum is held unenforceable for any reason, each and all other provisions shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.
- 16. Except as expressly provided herein, this Memorandum is neither a fiscal nor funds obligation document. Any endeavor involving reimbursement or contribution of funds between the parities will be handled in accordance with applicable laws, regulations and procedures. Such endeavors, if any, will be outlined in separate agreements and shall be made in writing by representatives of the parties and shall be independently authorized by appropriate statutory authority.
- 17. Nothing in this Memorandum prohibits the parties from soliciting or receiving advice and assistance in the objectives set forth above from other government entities and private groups or individuals.
- 18. This Memorandum becomes effective when signed by all signatory parties and shall remain in effect until modified or terminated by any party hereto by written notice to the other parties.

18. The parties intend to conduct activities contemplated in this Memorandum in accordance with existing authorities. If any provisions of this Memorandum are determined to be inconsistent with existing laws or regulations or directives governing the signatories, then the provisions of this Memorandum not affected by the finding of inconsistencies shall remain in full force and effect.

A LOCAL LAW OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE TO AMEND THE ANNUAL BUDGETS OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE FOR THE FISCAL YEARS 2017/2018, 2018/2019 AND 2019/2020 TO REFLECT WAGE AND BENEFIT INCREASES CONTAINED IN A BINDING ARBITRATION AWARD FOR CALENDAR YEARS 2018 AND 2019 (JANUARY 1, 2018-DECEMBER 31, 2019)

WHEREAS, pursuant to a New York State Public Employment Relations Board binding arbitration award dated June 30, 2021 between the City of Syracuse and the Syracuse Police Benevolent Association, which includes wage and benefit increases for the employees covered by said award and imposes a new collective bargaining agreement upon said parties for the period from January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2019; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse, as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to a New York State Public Employment Relations Board's binding arbitration award between the City of Syracuse and the Syracuse Police Benevolent Association, effective January 1, 2018 to December 31, 2019, which included wage and benefit increases for employees covered by said award and set forth the terms and conditions for a collective bargaining agreement for the calendar years 2018 and 2019, which included wage and benefit increases for 2018 and 2019, which increases shall be paid from the Treasury of the City of Syracuse in the fiscal year 2021/2022 for a portion of fiscal year 2017/2018, fiscal year 2018/2019 and a portion of fiscal year 2019/2020 notwithstanding the fact that any such salary, compensation and benefits shall previously have been fixed or provided for in the budgets of said City for such fiscal years 2017/2018, 2018/2019 and 2019/2020, provided, however, that any such increases shall be within the total amount contained in the budget for fiscal year 2021/2022,

the amended budget for fiscal year 2021/2022 and within such additional amounts as may be legally available therefor contained in the amended budgets for fiscal year 2017/2018, 2018/2019, and 2019/2020 and within such additional amounts as may be legally available therefor

Section 2. The annual budgets of the City of Syracuse for the years 2017/2018, 2018/2019 and 2019/2020 be and the same hereby is amended to reflect the increases and changes for employees covered by the aforementioned award and contract.

Section 3. Article 2-C, Section 25 of the General City Law, insofar as it restricts or is inconsistent with the provisions of Section 1 through 2 of this Local Law is hereby superseded.

Section 4. This local law shall take effect immediately.

Departments, and is of the opinion that it is acceptable to expand the temporary access to include the commencement of the construction of the underground charging vault station as part of their gas main system at 1350-1372 South Salina Street and Martin Luther King Boulevard West (Tax Map No. 085.-04-03.0) pending the finalization of the Local Law process relative to the permanent easement to be granted for a portion of this parcel, which is being authorized contemporaneously with this Ordinance; NOW, THEREFORE,

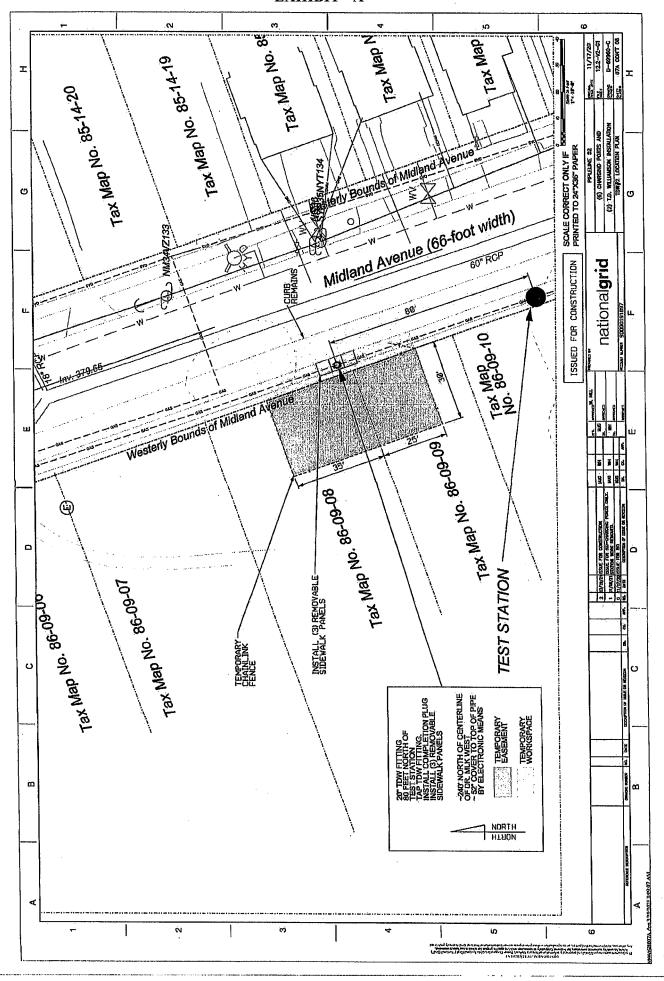
BE IT ORDAINED, upon the recommendation of the City Engineer that this Common Council hereby authorizes a temporary use and access Agreement with National Grid to allow National Grid to use three (3) City owned parcels identified as 624-630 Midland Avenue (Tax Map

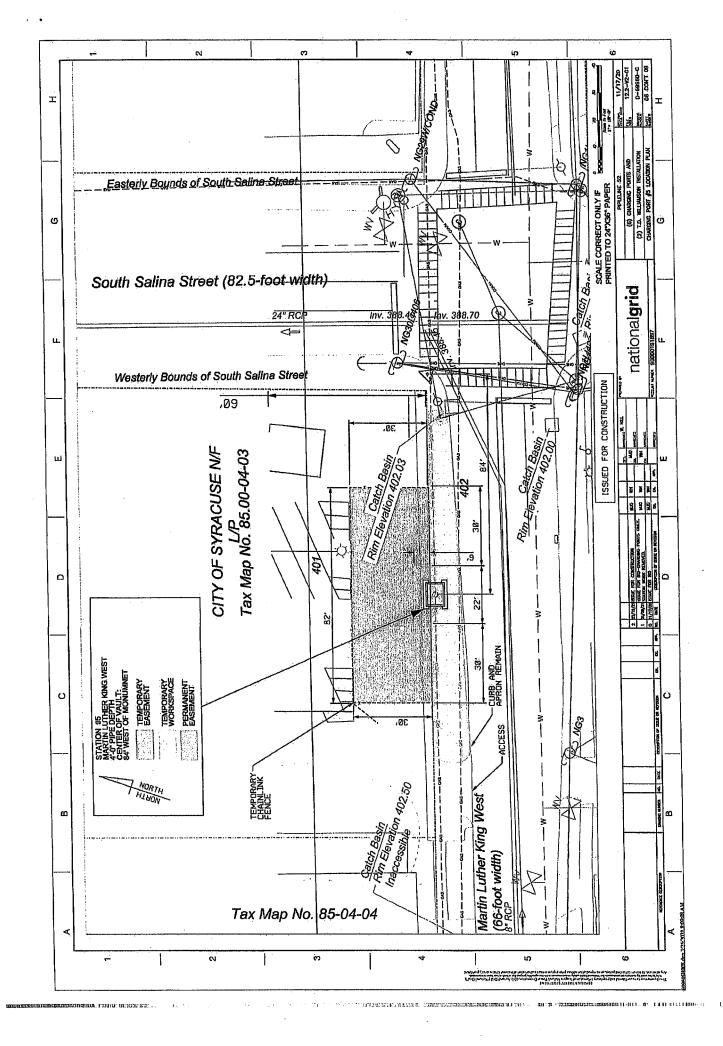
No. 086.-09-08.0), 632-634 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-09.0) and 1350-1372 South Salina Street and Martin Luther King Boulevard West (Tax Map No. 085.-04-03.0 as areas for staging equipment as part of their Charging Vault Project as described on the plans attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and in accordance with the National Grid drawings forwarded to the Department of Engineering, dated November 17, 2020, (last revised 3/19/21) subject to the following conditions:

- 1. National Grid and/or its officers, representatives, agents, employees, contractors or their subcontractors are hereby authorized and permitted to enter upon City-owned property identified as 624-630 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-08.0), 632-634 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-09.0), and 1350-1372 Salina Street South and Martin Luther King Boulevard West (Tax Map No. 085.-04-03.0) located in the City of Syracuse as shown on the plans attached hereto as Exhibit "A" for the purpose of staging equipment as part of National Grid's Charging Vault Project. The temporary access agreement is hereby expanded to also include the commencement of construction of the underground charging vault station as part of National Grid's gas main system at the City owned parcel 1350-1372 Salina Street S. and Martin Luther Boulevard West (Tax Map No. 085.-04.-03.0) pending the finalization of the Local Law process relative to a permanent easement being granted for a portion of this parcel, which is being authorized contemporaneously with this Ordinance.
- 2. At the termination of this agreement, National Grid or its officers, representatives, agents, employees, contractors or their subcontractors shall leave the site in a condition as reasonably close as possible to the condition before the commencement of this agreement and to the complete satisfaction of the City. Once the use is terminated, the City will conduct a final inspection with representatives from National Grid to determine that the parcels are in as good or better condition than before the commencement of the occupation. Upon determination by the City that the conditions of the sites are acceptable, National Grid's obligations under this agreement are terminated.
- 3. National Grid agrees, to indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its officers, agents and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, expenses and liability of any kind, for personal injury, including death or property damage, or any other type of claim including but not limited to liability for any environmental remediation costs that are a direct result of National Grid, its contractors or subcontractors using the property which is subject to this agreement, arising from any wrongful or negligent act or omission, intentional act or willful misconduct on the part of National Grid, its contractors or subcontractors, in connection with the performance of the project work, on the property which is subject to agreement. This paragraph shall not apply to any known or unknown pre-existing or historic contamination existing on the property prior to the effective date of this agreement and National Grid shall bear no liability for any such contamination.

- 4. National Grid shall cause any insurance provided by its contractors working on their Charging Vault Project, to also name the City as an additional insured. National Grid agrees to require of its prime general contractor a Comprehensive General Liability Insurance policy naming National Grid as an additional insured and naming the City as an additional insured with minimum limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury and Property Damage with an excess umbrella policy having a limit of not less than Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00). In addition, National Grid shall require the contractors to maintain workers compensation insurance.
- 5. National Grid shall not assign, transfer, convey, subcontract or otherwise dispose of its rights under this agreement without first obtaining the written approval of the City, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.
- 6. This agreement shall be governed by and interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of New York.
- 7. This agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both National Grid and the City. In the event that the specified timeframes of six (6) and twelve (12) weeks needs to be extended, upon approval from the City Engineer to extend the timeframe, National Grid shall reimburse the City accordingly based on the fee proposal in item 12 (Fees) on a prorated basis.
- 8. The agreement shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties, however the terms of this agreement shall take effect on the date that National Grid first occupies each parcel(s), National Grid shall notify the City in writing in advance of the selected dates, the terms will then terminate on the date the City determines the parcel(s) are in as good or better condition than before the commencement of the occupation.
- 9. National Grid shall only be allowed to use and access the City owned lands for the following durations; 624-630 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-08.0) and 632-634 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-09.0), for six (6) weeks only, and for 1350-1372 Salina Street South and Martin Luther King Boulevard West (Tax Map No. 085.-04-03.0) for twelve (12) weeks only. The City Engineer shall be notified in writing one week before National Grid starts to access and occupy the lands. National Grid shall vacate the lands within the timeframe specified and shall return the site as per condition number 2 of this ordinance. National Grid shall contain their occupation of the City lands to the dimensions as shown on the plans, National Grid shall not obstruct the City's Creekwalk in proximity to Tax Map Parcel 086.-09-08.0 (624-630 Midland Ave), and shall maintain and keep open for others the driveway of parcel 085.-04-03.0 (1350-1372 Salina Street South and Martin Luther King Boulevard West) located on Martin Luther King (portions of this lot not occupied by National Grid are to be used by others, ingress and egress shall be maintained for others and National Grid and their contractor shall cooperate with others using the same parcel).

- 10. This agreement does not allow National Grid to undertake any construction or install any permanent utilities or facilities on the subject parcels, it only allows for the staging of equipment. All staging areas shall be kept clean and orderly for the duration of occupation, no stockpiling of spoils or other similar material shall be allowed. National Grid shall secure the staging areas with appropriate fencing or similar.
- 11. <u>Fees- National Grid shall pay the following fees: 624-630 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-08.0) and 632-634 Midland Avenue (Tax Map No. 086.-09-09.0), a total for both of \$3,200.00 for six (6) weeks; and for <u>1350-1372 Salina Street South and Martin Luther King Boulevard West (Tax Map No. 085.-04-03.0) a total of \$6,000.00 for twelve (12) weeks. Payments shall be made by National Grid when they notify us in writing of the date(s) that they will occupy the parcel(s).</u></u>
- 12. That Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation, its successors or assigns, shall within thirty (30) days from the adoption of this <u>amended</u> Ordinance execute and file in the Office of the City Clerk written acceptance of this permission and consent.
