BE IT ORDAINED, that this Common Council hereby appropriates the sum of \$4,500,000 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) funds received by the City of Syracuse to an account to be determined by the Commissioner of Finance; said funds are to be utilized to provide financial support to homeowners in the City of Syracuse through home improvement partial loans to address general home repairs (i.e. roofs, furnaces, etc.) through the Home Headquarters' Urgent Care Program in an amount up to \$25,000.00 which will be provided to homeowners who occupy their property and who have household incomes up to 100% Area Median Income (AMI), in the manner provided by law; loans under the Urgent Care Program are given with the following structure:

- 50% of the loan is deferred (7 year residency requirement)
- 50% of the loan requires repayment at 1% interest

; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Mayor has waived the competitive bidding process for the administrative services due to the specialized nature of the programs and the fact that Home Headquarters, Inc. already manages similar programs for the City of Syracuse for its CDBG Funding; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to execute an agreement with Home Headquarters, Inc., to administer the \$4,500,000 in ARPA funds for the Urgent Care Program on behalf of the City of Syracuse; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the term for the agreement authorized herein shall be effective from the date of execution through December 31, 2023; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that Home Headquarters, Inc. shall be entitled to an administrative fee of 10% of the appropriation for the services provided pursuant to the agreement authorized herein; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Corporation Counsel as to terms, form and execution; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that upon execution of the aforementioned agreement, the ARPA funds will be expended, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Finance.

- WHEREAS, the applicant, Walton Street Corp, is requesting a Special Permit for a Restaurant in order to expand an existing restaurant on property situated at 402 South Franklin Street pursuant to Part B, Section IV, Article 9 and Part C, Section IV, Articles 1 and 2 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended; and

 - the location and height of buildings, the location, nature and height of walls, fences and other structures, and the nature and extent of drainage and landscaping on the site shall be such that the use will not hinder or discourage the appropriate development and use of the adjacent lands and buildings, nor impair the value thereof; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, do not provide any specific approval criteria for Office use, except that such uses are confined to buildings existing on the effective date of this amendment, and further provided that no major alterations in the exterior appearance of such buildings shall be allowed; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was submitted to the City of Syracuse Departments of Engineering and Public Works, and the Syracuse Landmark Preservation Board for review; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, the City Planning Commission has reviewed the subject proposal, which is an Unlisted Action and has determined that it will have no significant environmental impact based on the limited magnitude of the proposal, and therefore has issued a negative declaration; and

5. Any exterior lighting of the subject proposal shall be designed, located and maintained so as to prevent any direct rays of light from shining beyond the boundaries of the subject property;



ORDINANCE NO. ____-2021

REFUNDING BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE, NEW YORK AUTHORIZING THE REFUNDING OF ALL OR A PORTION OF PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT (SERIAL) BONDS, SERIES 2012, AND PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT (SERIAL) BONDS, SERIES 2013A, OF THE CITY, STATING THE PLAN OF REFUNDING, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$20,200,000 REFUNDING (SERIAL) BONDS AND MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS RELATING THERETO

<u>Recital</u>

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse, New York (the "City") currently has the following outstanding obligations:

- \$9,310,000 outstanding aggregate principal amount of Public Improvement (Serial) Bonds, Series 2012, dated June 13, 2012, due June 1, 2032 (the "Series 2012 Bonds");
- (2) \$9,799,000 outstanding aggregate principal amount of Public Improvement (Serial) Bonds, Series 2013A, dated June 12, 2013, due June 1, 2033 (the "Series 2013A Bonds");

The Series 2012 Bonds and the Series 2013A Bonds are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Refunded Bonds"; and

WHEREAS, the following Refunded Bonds are subject to redemption prior to maturity as shown below:

- (1) Series 2012 Bonds are subject to redemption prior to maturity on or after October 14, 2021 at a redemption price of 100.00% of par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption;
- (2) Series 2013A Bonds are subject to redemption prior to maturity on or after October 14, 2021 at a redemption price of 100.00% of par, plus accrued interest to the date of redemption;

WHEREAS, Sections 90.00 and 90.10 of the Local Finance Law permits the City to refund all or any portion of the outstanding maturities of the Refunded Bonds by the issuance of new bonds (the "Refunding Bonds") if the issuance thereof will result in present value debt service savings for the City; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the Commissioner of Finance of the City, as Chief Fiscal Officer, to, should he deem it to be in the best interests of the City to do so, refund the Refunded Bonds by the issuance of the Refunding Bonds in an amount sufficient to accomplish present value debt service savings for the City;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, AUGUST 23, 2021, BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE, NEW YORK (by favorable vote of not less than two thirds of said Common Council) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. In this ordinance, the following definitions apply, unless a different meaning clearly appears from the context:

Bonds.

(a) "Refunded Bonds" means the Series 2012 Bonds and the Series 2013A

(b) "Escrow Contract" means the contract to be entered into by and between the City and the Escrow Holder pursuant to Section 11 hereof.

(c) "Escrow Holder" means the bank or trust company designated as such pursuant to Section 10 hereof.

(d) "Present Value Savings" means the dollar savings which result from the issuance of the Refunding Bonds computed by discounting the principal and interest payments on both the Refunding Bonds and the Refunded Bonds from the respective maturities thereof to the date of issue of the Refunding Bonds at a rate equal to the effective interest cost of the Refunding Bonds. The effective interest cost of the Refunding Bonds shall be that rate which is arrived at by doubling the semi-annual interest rate (compounded semi-annually), necessary to discount the debt service payments on the Refunding Bonds from the maturity dates thereof to the date of issue of the Refunding Bonds and to the agreed upon price including estimated accrued interest.

(e) "Refunding Bond" or "Refunding Bonds" means the Public Improvement Refunding (Serial) Bonds of the City of Syracuse, authorized pursuant to Section 2 hereof.

(f) "Refunding Bond Amount Limitation" means an amount of Refunding Bonds which does not exceed the sum of the principal amount of Refunded Bonds, the aggregate amount of unmatured interest payable on such Refunded Bonds, redemption premiums on the Refunded Bonds, costs and expenses incidental to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds including the development of the Refunding Financial Plan, and costs of executing and performing the terms and conditions of the Escrow Contract and all fees and charges of the Escrow Holder as referred to in Section 10 hereof.

(g) "Series 2012 Bonds" shall mean all or a portion of the \$9,310,000 outstanding aggregate principal amount of Public Improvement Refunding (Serial) Bonds, Series 2012, dated June 13, 2012, due June 1, 2032;

(h) "Series 2013A Bonds" shall mean all or a portion of the \$9,799,000 outstanding aggregate principal amount of Public Improvement (Serial) Bonds, Series 2013A, dated June 12, 2013, due June 1, 2033;

Section 2. The object or purpose of refunding all or a portion of the Refunded Bonds of the City more particularly described and referred to in the recitals hereof is hereby authorized. The plan of financing said object or purpose is by the issuance of not to exceed \$20,200,000 Refunding Bonds and the levy and collection of a tax upon all the taxable real property within the City to pay the principal and interest on the Refunding Bonds as the same shall become due and payable, the said principal and interest to be reimbursed to the City by the assessment and levy on the real property for any benefited properties referred to in the Ordinances authorizing the issuance of the Refunded Bonds in Section 1 hereof. Bonds of the City in the maximum principal amount of \$20,200,000 and designated "Public Improvement Refunding (Serial) Bonds with an appropriate Series designation, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of Sections 90.00 and 90.10 of the Local Finance Law. The financial plan for the refunding, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Refunding Financial Plan") prepared for the City by Capital Markets Advisors, LLC, the City's financial advisor (the "Financial Advisor") is hereby accepted and approved. The Refunding Financial Plan includes the deposit of all proceeds of the Refunding Bonds with an Escrow Holder pursuant to an Escrow Contract as authorized in Section 10 hereof, the payment of all costs incurred by the City in connection with said refunding from such proceeds, and the investment of a portion of such proceeds by the Escrow Holder in certain obligations, the principal of and interest on which, together with the balance of such proceeds to be held uninvested, shall be sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Refunded Bonds becoming due and payable on their respective payment or redemption dates. It is anticipated that the actual amount of Refunding Bonds to be issued will approximate \$19,580,000 and will mature, be of such terms, and bear interest as set forth in said Refunding Financial Plan. The Common Council recognizes that the principal amount of the Refunding Bonds, and the maturities, terms, interest rate or rates borne by the Refunding Bonds, whether the full amount of the Refunding Bonds authorized herein to be issued will be issued, whether all of the Refunded Bonds herein authorized to be refunded will actually be refunded, whether the refunding Bonds determined to be issued will be issued in one or more series, and respective provisions for redemption thereof prior to maturity may be different from that set forth in Exhibit A. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized and directed to determine which of the Refunded Bonds shall actually be refunded, the amount of Refunding Bonds to be issued and whether same shall be issued in one or more series, and the maturities and terms thereof, the respective provisions relating to the redemption of the Refunding Bonds prior to maturity, if any, and the rate or rates of interest to be borne thereby, and to prepare, or cause to be provided a final refunding financial plan and, in accordance herewith, all powers in connection therewith may be exercised by the Commissioner of Finance; provided that the respective amounts and terms of the Refunding Bonds actually to be issued, including the rate or rates of interest thereby, shall comply with the requirements of Sections 90.00 and 90.10, as applicable of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance shall file a copy of his certificate (or certificates, if the Refunding Bonds are issued from time to time in more than one series) determining the details of the Refunding Bonds and the final refunding financial plan with the Clerk of the Common Council within ten (10) days after each delivery of the Refunding Bonds, as herein provided.

Section 3. The Commissioner of Finance, the chief fiscal officer of the City, is hereby authorized to approve all details of the Refunding Financial Plan not contained herein.

Section 4. The issuance of the Refunding Bonds will not exceed the Refunding Bond Amount Limitation.

Section 5. The aggregate amount of estimated Present Value Savings as set forth in the proposed Refunding Financial Plan attached hereto, computed in accordance with subdivision two of paragraph b of Section 90.10 of the Law, is \$1,678,880.47.

Section 6. (a) The Refunding Bonds shall be sold at private sale. The Commissioner of Finance, the chief fiscal officer of the City, is hereby authorized to execute a Purchase Contract on behalf of the City between the City and one or more underwriters for the sale of the Refunding Bonds in order to implement the Refunding Financial Plan, provided that the terms and conditions of such sale shall be approved by the State Comptroller; (b) the Commissioner of Finance is hereby further authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to accomplish said refunding, and to execute any contracts and agreements for the purchase of and payment for services rendered or to be rendered the City in connection with said refunding including the preparation of the Refunding Financial Plan referred to in Section 2; and (c) the Commissioner of Finance is also authorized to execute an undertaking to provide continuing disclosure of certain events and financial information as may be necessary or convenient to enable or facilitate compliance by the underwriters with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities & Exchange Commission.

Section 7. Each of the Refunding Bonds authorized by this ordinance shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and the Refunding Bonds shall be general obligations of the City payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the City without limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Refunding Bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City for (a) the amortization and redemption of the Refunding Bonds to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Subject to the provisions of this ordinance and of the Local Finance Law, Section 8. and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 50.00, 90.00 and 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, the powers and duties of the Common Council relative to prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the Refunding Bonds are hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance. The Commissioner of Finance may sell the Refunding Bonds at public or private sale, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to the City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. The Refunding Bonds shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. In the event the Commissioner of Finance determines to issue variable rate bonds, the Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Section 54.90 of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is also authorized to enter into such agreements and take such other action as may be necessary or appropriate and lawful to facilitate the sale of the Refunding Bonds or to execute agreements concerning credit enhancement, remarketing, arbitrage or the use of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds, including the Escrow Contract described in Section 10 hereof.

Section 9. In accordance with the terms of the Refunded Bonds and the provisions of Section 53.00 and of paragraph h of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, and subject only to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds as herein authorized to be issued for the refunding of all or any portion thereof, the City hereby elects to call in and redeem the Refunded Bonds, provided, however, that the portion, if any, of such Refunded Bonds which the Commissioner of Finance determines at the time of issuance of the relevant Refunding Bonds is not to be refunded or not to be called for redemption prior to maturity, shall not be called for redemption prior to maturity. The sum to be paid therefor on such respective redemption date shall be the respective par value thereof plus the redemption premium, if any, as provided in such Refunded Bonds, and the accrued interest to such redemption date. The Escrow Agent is hereby authorized and director to cause notice of such call for redemption to be given in the name of the City in the manner and within the time provided in the relevant Refunded Bonds and in paragraph a of Section 53.00 of the Local Finance Law. Upon the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, the election to call in and redeem the Refunded Bonds actually refunded and the direction to the Escrow Agent to cause notice thereof to be given as provided in this paragraph shall become irrevocable, provided that this paragraph may be amended from time to time as may be necessary in order to comply with the publication requirements of paragraph a of Section 53.00 of the Local Finance Law, or any successor law thereof.

Section 10. The validity of the Refunding Bonds authorized by this ordinance may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 11. Prior to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, the City shall contract with a bank or trust company located and authorized to do business in this state (the "Escrow Contract"), for the purpose of having such bank or trust company act as the escrow holder of the proceeds (the "Escrow Holder"), inclusive of any premium from the sale of the Refunding Bonds, together with all income derived from the investment of such proceeds. The Escrow Contract shall contain such terms and conditions as shall be necessary in order to accomplish the Refunding Financial Plan, including provisions for the Escrow Holder without further authorization or direction from the City, except as otherwise provided therein, (a) to make all required payments of principal or redemption price and interest to the appropriate agent with

respect to the Refunded Bonds, (b) to pay costs and expenses incidental to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds, including the development of the Refunding Financial Plan, and of executing and performing the terms and conditions of the Escrow Contract and all of its fees and charges as the Escrow Holder, (c) to invest the moneys held by it consistent with the provisions of the Refunding Financial Plan, and (d) to provide notice of redemption of called Refunded Bonds. The Escrow Contract shall be irrevocable and shall constitute a covenant with the holders of the Refunding Bonds.

Section 12. The proceeds, inclusive of any premium, from the sale of the Refunding Bonds, immediately upon receipt, shall be placed in escrow by the City with the Escrow Holder in accordance with the Escrow Contract. All moneys held by the Escrow Holder shall be invested only in direct obligations of the United States of America or in obligations the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States of America, which obligations shall mature or be subject to redemption at the option of the holder thereof not later than the respective dates when such moneys will be required to make payments in accordance with the Refunding Financial Plan. Any such moneys remaining in the custody of the Escrow Holder after the full execution of the Escrow Contract shall be returned to the City and shall be applied by the City only to the payment of the principal of or interest on the Refunding Bonds then outstanding.

Section 13. That portion of such proceeds from the sale of the Refunding Bonds, together with interest earned thereon, which shall be required for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Refunded Bonds, in accordance with the Refunding Financial Plan, shall be irrevocably committed and pledged to such purpose and the holders of the Refunded Bonds shall have a lien upon such moneys and the investments thereof held by the Escrow Holder. The pledge and lien provided for herein shall become valid and binding upon the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and the moneys and investments held by the Escrow Holder shall immediately be subject thereto without any further act. Such pledge and lien shall be valid and binding against all parties having claims of any kind in tort, contract or otherwise against the City irrespective of whether such parties have notice thereof. Neither this ordinance, the Escrow Contract, nor any other instrument relating to such pledge and lien, need be filed or recorded.

Section 14. Notwithstanding any other provision of the resolution, so long as any of the Refunding Bonds shall be outstanding, the City shall not use, or permit the use of, any proceeds from the sale of the Refunding Bonds in any manner which would cause any of the Refunding Bonds to be "arbitrage" bonds as that term is used in Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and, to the extent applicable, the Regulations promulgated by the United States Treasury Department thereunder as then in effect.

Section 15. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

Refunding Summary

BOND ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SYRACUSE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF BONDS IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$300,000.00) TO DEFRAY THE COST AND EXPENSE OF THE 2021/2022 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND YOUTH PROGRAMS FOR PARK IMPROVEMENTS WITHIN EASTWOOD AREA PARKS

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific objects or purposes of providing funds to defray the cost and expense of the 2021/2022 Capital Improvement Program for the Department of Parks, Recreation and Youth Programs for park improvements within Eastwood Area parks, which may include Eastwood Heights, Huntington, Norwood, Burlingham, Cummings Field and Sheridan. Exact improvements shall be determined based off upcoming public engagement and surveys within the community and from various stakeholders. Expected capital projects could include a splash pad, athletic courts, dog park, playground/fitness equipment and/or addition of a parking lot to current parkland. at a cost not to exceed Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific objects or purposes for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific objects or purposes consists of the issuance

and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00), thereby providing such sum for all the maximum cost of such specific object or purpose.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific objects or purposes for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 35 of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is five (5) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale

and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance. The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately

required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.
