#### BY COUNCILOR BEY:

- Bond Ordinance Authorizing the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse to defray the cost of the required 10% local match for NYSDEC 2021 Environmental 645 Restoration Program for the remediation of the "Zip-Zip" site located at 1410 Erie Boulevard East. Total cost not to exceed from \$65,000.
- 10. Application & Agreement To and with NYSDEC 2021 Environmental Restoration
   8-0 Program in an amount not to exceed \$650,000. The grant will fund the remediation of 646 the "Zip-Zip" site located at 1410 Erie Boulevard East. There is a required 10% local match not to exceed \$65,000 to be met by the issuance and sale of City bonds.

The City will agree to accept current and additional University sidewalk maintenance in lieu of assessing new sidewalks fees; to stripe crosswalks on Ostrum Avenue near Thornden Park; provide assistance and coaching related to the permitting process, hire an additional code inspector to be assigned to the university area; and add Schine Student Center and South Campus as training rotations for Police Cadets (pre-Academy CSOs.) The University will also increase payments to the City from \$1 million to \$2 million over four years (FY22-FY26), as detailed in the legislation, to be deposited in Account #01.425910.
- 16. Amend Ord. #727 (12/16/2019), "Agreement With Open Cities for website redesign services for syrgov.net and for implementation of a new Content Management System 647 to manage the City's website. Included in the agreement is Website design, configuration and implementation, Digital Services Training for City Departments, Open Cities Annual Subscription of \$32,000 for Year One, and Open Forms Enterprise Version, effective December 18, 2019. Total cost not to exceed \$105,000 from IT Account #5405300 Fund 01 Dept.16800." Amend to extend the cost not to exceed from \$105,000 to \$305,000, expanded services outlined in the legislation.
- 17. Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$200,000 and enter into an agreement with Open Cities, on behalf of **648** Information Technology, to support an expanded scope of work including developing and writing new web content for key departments and for converting 200 of the City's PDF forms to ADA compliant online forms.

Accept The relocation and road reconstruction of an 18" combined sewer main and associated appurtenances along with accepting an easement for the operation, 651 maintenance & repair from Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation D/B/A National Grid (National Grid), located in the former Temple Street right of way (tax map parcel 096.-08-03.0 (900-940 Clinton Street). National Grid is requesting to relocate the sewer in order to facilitate expanding and improving the electrical transformer station.
- 21. - 33. Agreement With Let's Brainstorm, LLC to provide board development services for the Police Athletic League of Syracuse (PAL), for the period of October 1, 2021-June 30, 2022. Services to include reviewing board formation and organizational documents, executive coaching, strategy training, teambuilding and problem-solving instruction. Total cost not to exceed \$11,000 charged from ARPA funds. The Mayor has waived the RFP process.
- 34. Agreement With Humane CNY to provide veterinary services and lodging for animals that are victims in animal cruelty investigations, on behalf of the Police Department, for the period of July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022. Total cost not to exceed to \$50,000, charged to Account #541500.01.31231.

35. Agreement - With Dr. Ronald Fish, a licensed psychologist, to instruct training and consult with the Police Department Peer Support Team and Officer Wellness Program, for the period of July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022. Total cost not to exceed \$2,500 charged to Account #541500.01.31230.

- 36. Amend Ord. #74 (03/01/2021), "Purchase w/c/b Agreement with Axon, Inc., on behalf of the Police Department, for a total of two hundred and twenty (220) Body 3 camera systems, for a term of five (5) years effective July 1, 2019-June 30, 2024. Total cost not to exceed \$121,572, from A/C #599802.02.31225 Project #222160319 (\$100,000 US DOJ Grant). There is a \$100,000 local match, \$21,572 will come from the SPD operating budget, and the remaining \$78,428 will be provided as an in-kind match of personnel salaries and benefits. Annual Maintenance costs will be charged to Account #540542.01.31230." Amend to add sixty (60) Body 3 Cameras.
