ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR A RESTAURANT ON PROPERTY SITUATED AT 471-489 WESTCOTT STREET (A/K/A 117 HARVARD PLACE)

BE IT ORDAINED, that the following resolution adopted by the City Planning Commission of the City of Syracuse on September 20, 2021, pursuant to Article V, Chapter 13, of the Charter of the City of Syracuse-1960, as amended, approving the application of RJ Westcott Holdings, LLC, owner and Shane Kelly and Danielle Mercuri-Campolito, applicants, for a special permit for a restaurant on property situated at 471-489 Westcott Street (a/k/a 117 Harvard Place), Syracuse, New York, pursuant to Part B, Section III, Article 2, and Part C, Section IV, Articles 1 and 2 of the Zoning Rules and Regulations of the City of Syracuse, as amended, in the manner and upon the conditions stated, be and the same hereby is consented to and approved, namely:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR A RESTAURANT ON PROPERTY SITUATED AT 471-489 WESTCOTT STREET (AKA 117 HARVARD PLACE)

We, the duly appointed members of the City Planning Commission of the City of Syracuse, do this 20th day of September, 2021, adopt the following resolution:

- WHEREAS, the applicants, Shane Kelly and Danielle Mercuri-Campolito, are requesting a Special Permit for a Restaurant on property situated at 471-489 Westcott Street (aka 117 Harvard Place) pursuant to Part B, Section III, Article 2 and Part C, Section IV, Articles 1 and 2 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission held a Public Hearing on the request on August 30 and September 20, 2021, at 6:00 p.m. in the Common Council Chambers, City Hall, Syracuse, New York, heard all those desiring to be heard, and duly recorded their testimony; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has studied the proposal and all submittals by the applicant and all interested parties; and
- WHEREAS, the subject property is a developed, regular-shaped, corner lot with multiple attached buildings and seven surface parking spaces with access to Harvard Place, 156.18 feet of frontage on Westcott Street and 172 feet of frontage on Harvard Place; and
- WHEREAS, the property lies within a Business, Class A zoning district, as do the neighboring properties to the west and south; adjacent and neighboring properties to the east lie within a Residential, Class B-1 zoning district; adjacent and neighboring properties to the north lie within a Residential, Class A zoning district; other neighboring properties lie within Residential, Class AA and Residential, Class A-1 zoning districts; and
- WHEREAS, land use in the area consists primarily of residential uses with a node of mixed uses along Westcott Street between Dell Street and South Beech Street; and
- WHEREAS, the "Syracuse Land Use and Development Plan" designates the character of this site, which lies within the Eastside neighborhood, as Neighborhood Commercial; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has approved multiple Special Permits for Restaurants related to this property over the years, with modifications, thereto, on properties previously known as 471-473 Westcott Street, 475-477 Westcott Street, 489 Westcott Street, 111 Harvard Place, and 115 Harvard Place:
 - SP-75-22; Special Permit for a Restaurant (wine and cheese); 471 Westcott St;
 - SP-76-38; Special Permit for a Restaurant; 471 Westcott St;
 - SP-80-07: Special Permit for a Restaurant (Ko-Ko's); 471 Westcott St;
 - SP-82-11; Special Permit for a Restaurant (John John's); 475 Westcott St;
 - SP-83-28; Special Permit for a Restaurant; 471 Westcott St; modification to SP-76-38;
 - SP-83-76; Special Permit for a Restaurant (Domino's Pizza); 115 (aka 111) Westcott St; two modifications, thereto (May and July, 2014), for signage and floor plan (Go Chix);

- SP-91-20: Special Permit for a Restaurant (pizza shop); 473 Westcott St;
- SP-95-16; Special Permit for a Restaurant (Sabastino's Pizza & Deli); 477 Westcott St;
- SP-96-30; Modification to expand a Special Permit for a Restaurant (Sabastino's Pizza); 475-477 Westcott St; three modifications, thereto (6/16/2014 (Subway), 4/23/2018 (salon), and 1/7/2019 (Syracuse Halal Guys)); and
- WHEREAS, the properties have been reconfigured into one Lot that includes 117 Harvard Place, which has no record of previous Special Permit approval for a Restaurant; and
- WHEREAS, additional land uses currently on the site include the following:
 - 471-473 Westcott Street: a restaurant (New Garden) (SP-80-07);
 - 475-477 Westcott Street: a restaurant (Syracuse Halal Gyro) within a grocery store (SP-96-30M3);
 - 489 Westcott Street: retail (Boom Babies);
 - 111 Harvard Place: retail (Westcott Liquor);
 - 115 Harvard Place: a restaurant (SP-83-76M2);
 - 117 Harvard Place: proposed restaurant (Clean Cuseine) (SP-21-08); and
- WHEREAS, the applicant submitted a site plan (Sheet C-1) dated September 6, 2021, which illustrates an existing, one-story masonry and frame building (No. 471-479), 57 off-street parking spaces, an eight-foot buffer along Harvard Place, and three driveways consisting of a 23.5-foot wide driveway on Westcott Street and two, 24-foot wide driveways on Harvard Place, on four properties situated at 469 Westcott Street, 471-489 Westcott Street, 119-21 Harvard Place, and 123 Harvard Place; and
- WHEREAS, the applicant submitted a building plan in the form of an altered property survey that identifies existing and proposed land uses; and
- WHEREAS, the applicant submitted a floor plan for the proposed restaurant that illustrates a customer service area of 16'-11" by 14'-6" (≈245 square feet); and
- WHEREAS, the proposed restaurant requires eight off-street parking spaces; current and proposed land uses on the property necessitate approximately 75 off-street parking spaces; and
- WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission has previously waived off-street parking requirements for current and previous land uses based on off-street parking available on properties situated at 469 and 471-489 Westcott Street and 119-121 and 123 Harvard Place; and
- WHEREAS, the site plan illustrates 57 off-street parking spaces are available on properties situated at 469 and 471-489 Westcott Street and 119-121 and 123 Harvard Place as follows:
 - 469 Westcott St: 27 spaces; V-65-32;
 - 471-489 Westcott Street (aka 117 Harvard Place): 7 spaces; on-site;
 - 119-21 Harvard Place: 19 spaces; SP-08-11;
 - 123 Harvard Place: 4 spaces; SP-08-11; and
- WHEREAS, the hours of operation for the proposed restaurant will be Sunday through Saturday from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m., with a maximum of five employees on premises at one time; and

- WHEREAS, the applicant is proposing to install an 18.5"x54" (6.9-square foot) window sign above the entrance to 117 Harvard Place; the applicant is proposing to maintain an existing mural on the east side of the building; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(1) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that the proposal requires 8 parking spaces and the applicant is proposing 0 off-street parking spaces; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(4)(c) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that any driveway located next to a residential district shall provide not less than 25 feet of spacing between such district boundary and the nearest boundary of the driveway; the site plan shows a driveway on Harvard Place adjacent to a Residential, Class B-1 zoning district; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(4)(d) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that driveways shall be located not less than 10 feet from the property lines; the site plan shows a driveway on Harvard Place adjacent to the eastern property line; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(5)(c) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that curbs shall be provided along the edge of all areas accessible to motor vehicles to prevent the encroachment of vehicles or any portions thereof, upon adjacent property or the street right-of-way; the site plan does not show the required curbing along the edges of the seven off-street parking spaces situated in front of the proposed restaurant, known as 117 Harvard Place; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(6) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that the proposal is allowed one wall and one ground sign, neither to exceed 40 square feet, and the applicant is proposing to install an 18.5"x54" (6.9-square foot) window sign; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal deviates from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1, paragraph d.(9) of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, in that the proposed restaurant shall comply with the provisions of Part C, Section I, Article 5 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, wherein pursuant to paragraph 3, a screen shall be provided adjacent to either residential or office districts or uses so as to protect these areas from unreasonable disturbance; the site plan does not show the required screening along the eastern lot line; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal necessitates six waivers from the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, with respect to the off-street parking, driveway spacing, driveway location, curbing, sign, and side yard treatment regulations; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was submitted to the City of Syracuse Departments of Engineering and Public Works, and the Division of City Planning for review; and

- WHEREAS, pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, the City Planning Commission has reviewed the subject proposal, which is an Unlisted Action and has determined that it will have no significant environmental impact based on the limited magnitude of the proposal, and therefore has issued a negative declaration; and
- WHEREAS, due consideration was given to the necessity, adequacy, and character of the proposed development, and vehicular and pedestrian circulation within the immediate vicinity; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed use is so located as not to be detrimental to adjoining zoning districts and permitted uses; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed use will not create hazardous or obnoxious conditions, and the public health, welfare, and safety will be protected; and
- WHEREAS, the proposal was found to be in character with the adjoining land use;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that We, the duly appointed members of the City Planning Commission of the City of Syracuse, do this 20th day of September, 2021, APPROVE the application of Shane Kelly and Danielle Mercuri-Campolito for a Special Permit for a Restaurant on property situated at 471-489 Westcott Street (aka 117 Harvard Place) pursuant to Part B, Section III, Article 2 and Part C, Section IV, Articles 1 and 2 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Commission GRANTS the requested waivers from Part C, Section IV, Article 2-8.1 of the City of Syracuse Zoning Rules and Regulations, as amended, as they pertain to the off-street parking, driveway spacing, driveway location, curbing, side yard treatment, and sign regulations as identified in the preamble to this resolution;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said application be approved subject to compliance with the following conditions:

- 1. The subject premises shall be used, operated and maintained in a neat and orderly condition at all times; all outside storage of junk, bottles, cartons, boxes, debris and the like shall be restricted to appropriately screened enclosures not visible to the general public;
- 2. All construction, improvements and additions relating to this proposal, including those activities required in order to comply with the conditions of this approval, shall be completed by the applicant or its agents within twelve (12) months of the date of approval of this resolution by the City of Syracuse or this approval will be considered null and void;
- 3. Improvements to the subject property and its use shall be substantially in accordance with the submitted plans on file in the City of Syracuse Office of Zoning Administration entitled:
 - Parking Site Plan (Sheet C-1); 471-489 Westcott Street; prepared by: KET, Natural Systems Engineering; dated: 9-6-21; scaled: 1"=20";
 - Building Plan (Location Survey); Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6, Block #1, of the Hillsdale Tract Amended and Lots 28 and 29 and part of Lot #3 of the M.C. Palmer Tract;
 - Floor Plan; Clean Cuseine, 471-89 Westcott St; prepared by: Tim Delavan; scaled: 1/4"=1'-0"; dated: 8/2/21;
 - Sign Plan (photo); Clean Cuseine; 18.5" high by 54" long; undated;

- 4. Signage for the proposal is limited to an 18.5"x54" (6.9-square foot) window sign, as noted in condition number three above;
- 5. Any exterior lighting of the subject proposal shall be designed, located and maintained so as to prevent any direct rays of light from shining beyond the boundaries of the subject property;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the applicant shall abide by the hours of operation as identified in the preamble to this resolution;







SERVICES AND NEIGHBORHOOD SUPPORT AGREEMENT

This Services and Neighborhood Support Agreement (this "Agreement") is made as of July 1, 2021 (the "Effective Date"), by and between SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY, a not-for-profit educational corporation chartered by a special act of the New York State Legislature, with an office at 900 South Crouse Avenue, Syracuse, New York 13244 (the "University") and the CITY OF SYRACUSE, a municipal corporation with offices at 233 East Washington Street, Syracuse, New York 13202 (the "City").

RECITALS

- A. The University is an important institution in and for the City, providing many educational, cultural, financial and other benefits to the City and its residents. A number of these benefits are set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.
- B. In recent years, the University has expanded on and from the University Hill neighborhood into many areas of the City. The University and the City expect that the University will continue to expand on the Hill and throughout the City. The City recognizes that existing and future projects have benefited and will continue to benefit the City and the businesses, organizations, and residents of the City and the City will support those efforts.
- C. The University recognizes that its presence in the City and future expansion may require additional City resources, infrastructure, and services. As such, the University voluntarily agrees to provide funds to support the City.
- D. The University recognizes that its activities have an impact on the City neighborhoods surrounding the University (the "Neighborhood(s)"), which uniquely benefit from their close proximity to the University and other large institutions. The City and the University

also recognize the University's operations and student populations are concentrated in the Neighborhoods, which has an impact on service needs in these areas.

- E. In furtherance of the parties' mutual interest in enhancing the health, safety and welfare of the Neighborhoods, the University voluntarily agrees to provide financial and other support to assist the City in addressing the services and assistance required by Neighborhoods.
- F. Both parties acknowledge that the benefits from the University's expansion on and from the Hill can best be achieved by cooperating on the University's projects, whether located on the Hill or elsewhere in the City, so that they can be accomplished fully and expeditiously and in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements. Thus, each of them wishes to further its commitment to the other to continue to collaborate and cooperate with each other on University projects.
- G. The University's commitment to support the City and the Neighborhoods has been memorialized in written agreements, including (1) the Services Agreement between the University and the City that addressed the funding to support the City services (effective July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2021); (2) the Services Agreement between the University and the City that addressed the funding to support the City services (effective June 20, 2011 through June 30, 2016); and (3) the Service Agreement between the University and the City that addressed the neighborhood impacts (effective July 21, 1994 through July 21, 2014 amended to be extended until June 20, 2016). The parties intend for these agreements together with any amendments or extensions thereto to be superseded by this Agreement.
- H. Both parties recognize the historical, environmental, economic, and cultural significance of the parks located throughout the City of Syracuse and adjacent to the University's campus, including Walnut Park and Thornden Park, and the parties desire to maintain, protect, preserve, and improve such parks.

I. The City agrees to permit the University to perform certain park maintenance and operations (as set forth in more detail in paragraph 6 of this Agreement), and the University has the necessary skills, capabilities, and experience to perform such park maintenance and operations upon terms more fully set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Term of Agreement. The parties agree that the term of this Agreement shall begin on the Effective Date (July 1, 2021) and expire on June 30, 2026 (the "Term"). This Agreement may only be terminated by the University or the City prior to the expiration of the Term if the other party breaches a material term or condition of this Agreement and such breach is not cured within thirty (30) days from receipt of written notice of the breach.
- 2. <u>Financial Support for City Services</u>. The University shall make annual payments to the City according to the schedule set forth in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and made a part hereof. Each annual payment shall be made on or before August 31 of each year commencing on August 31, 2021, with the last payment due on August 31, 2025. When the City implements a municipal sidewalk maintenance program, the University may hold back Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) from each annual payment due hereunder to cover any sidewalk assessments for University parcels that are included in the program during the Term (the "Hold Back"). The University shall remit the balance of the Hold Back (if any) within thirty (30) days of the payment of the municipal sidewalk assessment.
- 3. <u>Financial Support for City Neighborhoods</u>. In recognition of the fact that the University's activities have a direct impact on the surrounding City Neighborhoods, in addition to the payments described in paragraph 2 above, the University shall make to the City annual payments of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to provide financial support for the Neighborhoods. The annual Neighborhood support payments will be made on or before

August 31 of each year commencing on August 31, 2021, with the last payment due on August 31, 2025.

- 4. <u>Application of Neighborhood Payments</u>. The City agrees to apply the payments from the University pursuant to paragraph 3 above as follows:
 - a. Out of each \$500,000 annual payment, \$125,000 shall be allocated to the City of Syracuse Police Department and applied to the cost of maintaining safety and security in the Neighborhoods; and
 - b. The remaining balance of each annual payment (\$375,000) will be used for Neighborhood projects and services that are in the mutual interest of the Neighborhoods, their residents (including University students) and the University. The specific projects and services for which these funds will be used shall be decided pursuant to the University Neighborhood Services Agreement Advisory Committee (the "UNSAAC") process. The Neighborhood area for which these funds shall be eligible is set forth in the map attached as Exhibit "C." During the Term of this Agreement, one (1) representative of the University will serve on the UNSAAC as a voting member. The City will ensure that the UNSAAC adopts a conflicts of interest policy governing all voting members.
- 5. <u>Prior Service Agreements</u>. This Agreement supersedes the Prior Service Agreements, and the parties agree that the Prior Service Agreements have no force and effect as of July 1, 2021.
- 6. <u>Support Services for City Parks</u>. The City agrees to permit the University to perform certain maintenance and improvements at Walnut Park and Thornden Park, subject to the written approval (not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed) of the Commissioner of Parks

as to the scope of work as more fully set forth below. Unless otherwise mutually agreed to by the City and the University, the Commissioner of Parks shall review and approve or deny (in writing) all requests to perform maintenance or improvements within five (5) business days from receipt of the request from the University (the "Review Period"). Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, any request that is not approved or denied in writing within the Review Period is deemed approved.

Walnut Park. Walnut Park refers to the three-block linear green space in Syracuse, New York, located to the immediate northeast of the University, and bordered on the north end by Harrison Street, the south by Waverly Avenue, the east by Walnut Avenue, and the west by Walnut Place. During the Term, the University shall provide certain maintenance, development, and security services for Walnut Park, including (i) general maintenance of the grounds at the park to the extent they affect the University's use and enjoyment of the park, including, without limitation, snow removal, mowing, weeding, tree trimming and litter pickup; (ii) the right to repair and improve areas of the park that affect the University's use and enjoyment of the park; and (iii) reasonable security and patrols. The University shall enjoy the right to determine, subject to the written approval of the Commissioner of Parks (as outlined above), whether such repairs and improvements to Walnut Park shall be performed and the right to schedule and perform such repairs and improvements once the University has secured the proper City approvals and permits, which approvals and permits the City shall make best efforts to expedite. The University's Department of Public Safety shall provide reasonable security and public safety patrols at Walnut Park, consistent with

the existing Memorandum of Understanding between the Syracuse Police Department and the Syracuse University Department of Public Safety, the terms of which are incorporated by reference herein. The University shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with maintenance, repairs, and improvements performed by the University at Walnut Park. The University and its students, faculty, staff, and other members, shall be free to use the park for educational, recreational, or ceremonial activities, subject to securing the proper City approvals and permits, which approvals and permits the City shall make best efforts to expedite.

b. Thornden Park. Thornden Park refers to the 76-acre park space in Syracuse, New York, located to the northeast of the University, and bordered on the north end by Madison Street, the south by Clarendon Street, the east by Ostrom Avenue, and the west by S. Beech Street. During the Term of this Agreement, the University shall enjoy the right to determine, subject to the written approval of the Commissioner of Parks (as outlined above), whether maintenance, repairs and temporary and permanent improvements affecting the University's use and enjoyment of a certain portion of Thornden Park, as set forth in Exhibit "D" attached hereto and made a part hereof and including entrances into Thornden Park from Ostrom Avenue, shall be performed and the right to schedule and perform such maintenance, repairs and improvements once the University has secured the proper City approvals and permits, which approvals and permits the City shall make best efforts to expedite. Such maintenance, repairs and improvements may include, without limitation, snow removal, mowing, weeding, tree trimming and litter pickup.

The University shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with such maintenance, repairs, and improvements performed by the University at Thornden Park. The University and its students, faculty, staff, and other members, shall be free to use the park for educational, recreational, or ceremonial activities, subject to securing the proper City approvals and permits, which approvals and permits the City shall make best efforts to expedite. In addition to any maintenance, repairs or improvements the University may elect to make at Thornden Park, the City agrees to install new crosswalks in the following locations to ensure the safety of pedestrians entering Thornden Park and other property owned by the City: Ostrom Avenue and University Place; Ostrom Avenue and Waverly Avenue; Ostrom Avenue and Adams Street; Ostrom Avenue and Harrison Street; Ostrom Avenue and Madison Street.

general liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect it from claims for death, personal injury or property damage arising from or resulting out of the negligence of the University in the performance of its operations pursuant to this paragraph 6 provided that as a minimum the policy shall provide for Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) in general liability coverage naming the City of Syracuse as an additional insured, and (b) workers compensation coverage (statutory limits). The University shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Syracuse, its officers and employees, from any and all claims, actions, suits, judgments, or proceedings that arise from the University's negligent acts or omissions in conducting activities on City property pursuant

- to paragraph 6. For the avoidance of doubt, the University shall have no obligation to exercise any of the rights granted to it under this paragraph 6 and shall have no liability to the City or any third party for choosing not to exercise any such rights.
- 7. <u>Cooperation</u>. In recognition of the benefits the City, its residents and visitors will receive from University projects developed or maintained within the City, whether on the Hill or elsewhere in the City, the City will maintain appropriate levels of staffing, including without limitation a senior project review position that will serve as the University's primary point of contact, and will use best efforts to review and improve its permitting processes and expedite the consideration, approval, and development of University projects within the City in compliance with applicable law. The City will also use best efforts to expedite completion of required inspections of University properties. The City and the University shall designate representatives (including at least one (1) senior executive) who will meet on a quarterly basis throughout the Term (within thirty (30) days of the conclusion of each calendar quarter) to discuss any concerns arising out of any of the matters set forth in this paragraph 7.
- 8. <u>Community Policing.</u> In recognition of the fact that the University's operations and student populations are concentrated in the Neighborhoods and the benefits of community policing, the City agrees to dedicate at least two (2) sworn, non-probationary officers from the City police department to act as community service officers and work with the Community Policing Services Unit of the University's Department of Public Safety ("DPS") to engage students (and their parents) and student groups in the Neighborhoods alongside DPS' other partners. Such officers will be stationed full time on a Tuesday through Saturday schedule (hours to be mutually agreed upon by the parties, but shall include evening hours on a consistent basis)

at the following locations: (a) the University's Hildegarde and J. Myer Schine Student Center, and (b) a mutually agreed upon location on the University's south campus.

- 9. <u>No Obligation to Extend</u>. During the final year of this Agreement, the parties shall engage in good faith discussions regarding an extension of this Agreement. Neither party has an obligation of any kind to extend or supplement this Agreement, or enter into a new services agreement after the expiration of this Agreement.
- 10. <u>Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New York. It is agreed that this Agreement does not waive or dispense with the requirements of any law, rule, or regulation applicable hereto, including the Charter of the City of Syracuse.
- 11. Third Party Beneficiaries. The obligations under this Agreement are for the sole benefit of the parties, and neither this Agreement nor anything performed pursuant to it shall give rise to, or shall be deemed or be construed to confer, any right, claim, or cause of action on any other party as a third party beneficiary or otherwise.
- 12. <u>Modifications</u>. This Agreement shall not be modified except in writing executed by both parties.
- 13. <u>Severability</u>. If any section or provision of this Agreement, or any portion of any section or provision, shall for any reason be held to be void, illegal, or otherwise unenforceable, all other portions of this Agreement shall nevertheless remain in full force and effect.





BE IT ORDAINED, that Ordinance No. 675-2019 as last amended by Ordinance No. 340-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

WHEREAS, Section 5-205-A of the Charter of the City of Syracuse, as amended, provides the Mayor shall "award contracts for professional services subject to the approval of the Common Council"; and

WHEREAS, the City of Syracuse, Onondaga County, and Oswego County issued a joint Request for Proposal for a vendor to administer their pharmacy benefits programs and the Mayor has approved the retention of ProAct, Inc., under the following terms:

- (1) ProAct, Inc. shall provide all required pharmacy benefits management services throughout the term of the agreement for all covered active City employees and for City retirees under the age of sixty-five (65); the scope of services of this agreement is hereby amended to reflect that ProAct shall supply and administer flu shots to City of Syracuse employees at the Annual Flu Clinic for 2021 which will be held October 19, 2021 and October 27, 2021 and for the City's First Responders at a drive thru clinic to be held on dates yet to be determined;
- (2) This agreement shall be for a term of one (1) year effective January 1, 2020 with the option of two (2) additional one (1) year renewal periods subject to the approval of the Mayor and the Common Council; this agreement is hereby extended for the first one year renewal period effective January 1, 2021;
- (3) The City shall pay to ProAct, Inc. based on submitted claims with annual costs estimated not to exceed \$7,500,000 for the first year of the agreement; the cost not to exceed for this agreement is hereby increased by \$15,000 which shall cover the costs for 500 City employees to receive the flu shot at a cost to the City of \$30.00 per person, the flu shot is covered under the City's Employee Health Benefits Plan, the new total cost not to exceed for all services to be provided by ProAct under the agreement is \$7,515,000.; NOW, THEREFORE,

WHEREAS, Onondaga County has requested permission to fuel cars and pick-up trucks owned by the County and/or used by the County of Onondaga officers and employees in the course of their employment responsibilities at the City Department of Public Works Fuel Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Public Works has determined that the City Fuel Facility located at the Department of Public Works is capable of handling the additional fuel required to carry out the terms of the agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County of Onondaga has agreed to reimburse the City for the cost of fuel (including compressed natural gas), plus a \$.06 administrative fee per gallon, and all costs associated with the addition of Onondaga County vehicles to the City's computerized fuel handling system including paying the charge for gas keys based on the actual cost to the City plus a five percent (5%) administrative charge for personnel identification numbers, which is necessary whenever a new or lost key is issued; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, that the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Syracuse, is hereby authorized to enter into a municipal cooperation agreement with the County of Onondaga in relation to the use of the City of Syracuse Public Works Fuel Facility by cars and pick-up trucks owned by the County of Onondaga and/or used by County of Onondaga officers and employees in the course of their employment responsibilities, with (1) all the costs of vehicle gas keys and personnel identification numbers required by said County vehicles, (2) costs necessary for computer accessibility, including

but not limited to a phone modem, (3) the cost of fuel used in County vehicles purchased under the appropriate City and/or County fuel contracts, plus an administrative fee of \$.06 per gallon, to be paid by the County to the City on a monthly basis for fuel costs, (4) with the charge for keys being based on actual cost to the City to be paid on an "as incurred basis" as are the charges for all identification numbers and computer accessibility costs, and (5) the City shall collect a five percent (5%) administrative charge for vehicles keys and personnel identification numbers issued to the County; such billing shall be handled through the appropriate City department or departments; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any updates or improvements to the City's Fuel Facility and related systems shall be a shared cost between the City and the County based on percentage of fuel (including compressed natural gas) used by each party, provided the City shall notify and get the approval of the County prior to commencement of such improvements, and further the County shall be solely responsible for the costs of updates or changes in programming which are done for the convenience of the County; and

PIN NO. 3756.25 AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 522-2020, ORDINANCE NO. 209-2021, AND AS LAST AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 465-2021 TO ADD AN ADDITIONAL \$50,000 TO THE CONSTRUCTION COSTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION PHASE, TO COVER THE COST OF THE WORK FOR THE INSTALLATION OF WIRELESS VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN DETECTION SYSTEMS AT NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (NYSDOT) OWNED TRAFFIC LIGHTS (ADAMS STREET & SOUTH WARREN STREET AND ADAMS STREET & **MONTGOMERY STREET) THAT WAS** REQUESTED TO BE INCLUDED IN THE PROJECT BY THE NYSDOT FOR A NEW TOTAL COST NOT TO EXCEED OF \$5,034,000

BE IT ORDAINED, that Ordinance No. 786-2017 as previously amended by Ordinance No. 522-2020, and Ordinance No. 209-2021 and last amended by Ordinance No. 465-2021 is hereby amended to read as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Common Council of the City of Syracuse as follows:

Section 1. For the specific object or purpose of providing funds to defray the cost and

expense of the Scoping, Preliminary Design, Detailed Design, Construction and Construction Inspection Phases of the Downtown Mill and Pave Project at an estimated maximum cost not to exceed Five Million Thirty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$5,034,000.00)*, general obligation bonds of the City of Syracuse, to be of the terms, form and contents hereinafter provided for, are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law of the State of New York.

Section 2. <u>Five Million Thirty-Four Thousand Dollars (\$5,034,000.00)</u>* is estimated as the maximum cost of the specific object or purpose for which such bonds are to be issued.

Section 3. The plan for financing such specific object or purpose consists of the issuance and sale of bonds of the City of Syracuse in the principal sum of <u>Five Million Thirty-Four Thousand</u> <u>Dollars (\$5,034,000.00)</u>*, thereby providing such sum for the initial cost of such specific object or purpose, with additional bonds to be issued in the future to finance the balance of the Project.

Section 4. It is hereby determined that the specific object or purpose for which bonds are to be issued falls within subdivision 20 (c) of paragraph (a) Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law and the period of probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose is fifteen (15) years.

Section 5. The Commissioner of Finance, not more than fifteen (15) days and not less than three (3) days before the sale of said bonds, shall file with the Comptroller of the State of New York a supplemental debt statement and file a duplicate thereof with the City Clerk in compliance with Section 109.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell the bonds and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the Commissioner of Finance who is the chief fiscal officer of the City under the Local Finance Law.

The Commissioner of Finance may sell such bonds at public or private sale, with or without bond insurance or other credit enhancement, at a discount or premium, at fixed or variable rates of interest or at no interest whatsoever, or as capital appreciation bonds, and with such amortization of principal as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine is most favorable to said City, and in compliance with any rules of the State Comptroller applicable thereto. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said Commissioner of Finance, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law. The Commissioner of Finance is hereby authorized to issue variable rate debt, acquire credit support, and enter into such agreements as said officer finds reasonable to facilitate the issuance, sale, resale and repurchase of such bonds, as authorized under Sections 54.90 and 168.00 of the Local Finance Law. Said bonds shall be signed in the name of the City by the original or facsimile signature of the Mayor and countersigned by the original or facsimile signature of the Commissioner of Finance and sealed with the original or facsimile corporate seal of the City, provided, however, that if the signatures of the Mayor and the Commissioner of Finance are each by facsimile signatures on any bond, such bond shall be authenticated by the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent of the City. All other matters, except as provided herein, relating to such bonds, including prescribing whether manual or facsimile signatures shall appear on said bonds, prescribing the method for the recording of ownership of said bonds, appointing the fiscal agent or agents for said bonds, providing for the printing and delivery of said bonds (and if said bonds are to be executed in the name of the City by only facsimile signatures, providing for the manual countersignature of a fiscal agent or of a designated official of the City), the date, form, denominations, maturities, interest rate or rates, terms of and manner of sale and interest payment dates, place or places of payment, and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the Commissioner of Finance.

The Commissioner of Finance may elect to become the fiscal agent for the bonds, or may contract on behalf of the City for this service pursuant to the Local Finance Law. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the Commissioner of Finance shall determine. The Commissioner of Finance may also agree on behalf of the City to provide or disclose such information about the City as may be necessary to enable the purchasers of bonds or notes of the City to comply with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 7. The temporary use of available funds of the City of Syracuse, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were raised or otherwise created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this ordinance. The reasonably expected source of funds to be used to initially pay for the expenditures authorized by Section 1 of this resolution shall be from the City's Capital Fund. It is intended that the City shall then reimburse expenditures from the Capital Fund with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by this ordinance and that the interest payable on the bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such bonds shall be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes. This ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this ordinance with the proceeds of the bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are reasonably expected to be received, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the objects or purposes described herein.

Section 8. When said bonds and notes shall have been duly sold, the same shall be delivered by the Commissioner of Finance to the purchaser upon payment to him of the purchase price, including accrued interest, and the receipt of the Commissioner of Finance shall be a full acquittance to such purchaser who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 9. The faith and credit of the City of Syracuse are hereby pledged to the payment of the principal of said bonds and interest thereon when due. An amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on said bonds as the same becomes due each year shall be included in the annual budget of said City for the year.

Section 10. The validity of the bonds hereby authorized may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City of Syracuse is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

- 1. The Owner shall construct, without cost to the City, and in accordance with plans, specifications and final locations to be approved by the City Engineer, and the Commissioner of Public Works, the seven parking spaces (including but not limited to granite curbing, asphalt pavement, concrete sidewalk and signs) along the Park Street (1900 Block) which are the subjects of this action.
- 2. The plans and specifications required to construct all facilities subject to this ordinance shall be prepared by a Professional Engineer registered by the State of New York. The plans for the work shall be approved by the City Engineer, and record drawings, including AutoCad and GIS formats on magnetic media referenced to New York State plane coordinate, Central Zone shall be provided to the City Engineer subsequent to the completion of the work. ADHV REDEV, LLC. shall endeavor to provide a certification by a Professional Engineer as to the accuracy of the as-built drawings and attest to the fact that the improvements were constructed in conformity with the plans and specifications approved by the City. As-built drawings and a certification of completion shall be submitted within 30 days after the Department of Public Works has determined that the project is complete. If this information is not received, you will be subject to a \$500.00 penalty fee and additional collection fees if necessary.
- 3. That traffic shall be maintained at all times during construction. The entire excavation of said work is to be protected by suitable guards and signal both by day and night and precautions are to be taken by all reasonable means to prevent any accident or injury while the work is in progress.
- 4. That ADHV REDEV, LLC., their successors, assigns, and agents shall at all times defend and indemnify and save harmless the City of Syracuse, its officers and servants from any and all liability and from any and all claims, damages, costs and expenses of every name and nature to person or property which may accrue or grow out of the installation, operation, and maintenance of such work in said streets or arising in any way out of the operations for this consent, and shall defend and indemnify and save harmless said City from all costs, damages and expenses by reason of any damages or injuries to any gas pipe, water pipe, sewers, other utilities, pipes or construction work now located in, under and along the surface of said street at the point and place or places where said work is to be performed and maintained, including damages incurred as a result of damage to the Facilities caused by the City.
- 5. That said applicant, its successors or assigns, shall within thirty (30) days from the adoption of this Ordinance execute and file in the Office of the City Clerk written acceptance of this permission and consent.
- 6. That all ordinances, rules and regulations of the City and its departments shall at all time be complied with including the Building Code of the City of Syracuse.
- 7. The Work shall be subject to street cut and repair permitting process administered by the Commissioner of Public Works and any other standard permitting processes that exist.

- Restoration of pavement and sidewalks must be completed in accordance with all City of Syracuse standards.
- 8. That the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Works shall be advised in advance of time when the work is to be done and the work of installation, including shoring, protection of pipes and facilities and other safety measures, shall be subject to the supervision of the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Works.
- 9. Subject to the City Engineer, review and approval, permission may be granted by the City for other utilities to cross the area to be occupied by the proposed facilities.
- 10. All work shall be done in a skillful manner with reasonable dispatch and in accordance with plans and specifications and all conditions imposed by any laws, rules or regulations which may apply to the work. A dust and sediment and erosion control program shall be in effect for the duration of the project to prevent a nuisance and to prevent interference with or damage to adjacent property, streets, sewers and drainage courses.
- 11. That ADHV REDEV, LLC., shall adequately and properly protect any existing underground utilities located within or near said installation. If any such property or facilities are interfered with or damaged, ADHV REDEV, LLC., or its successors and assigns, shall be responsible for replacement to the satisfaction of the City Engineer. Should the City Engineer determine that City facilities or utilities require relocation, temporary support or other modification as a result of this Work, said modifications shall be made as directed by the City Engineer.

Upon completion of the facilities and acceptance and approval of the roadway restoration by the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Works, the use, operation and maintenance of the roadway and utilities located therein will be subject to all laws, rules, ordinances and procedures which apply to streets and utilities throughout the City.

That ADHV REDEV, LLC., their successors, assigns, and agents shall at all times defend and indemnify and save harmless the City of Syracuse, its officers and servants from any and all liability and from any and all claims, damages, costs and expenses of every name and nature to person or property which may accrue or grow out of the installation, operation, and maintenance of such work in said streets or arising in any way out of the operations for this consent, and shall defend and indemnify and save harmless said City from all costs, damages and expenses by reason of any damages or injuries to any gas pipe, water pipe, sewers, other utilities, pipes or construction work now located in, under and along the surface of said street at the point and place or places where said work is to be performed and maintained, including damages incurred as a result of damage to the Facilities caused by the City.
- 5. That said applicant, its successors or assigns, shall within thirty (30) days from the adoption of this Ordinance execute and file in the Office of the City Clerk written acceptance of this permission and consent.
- 6. That all ordinances, rules and regulations of the City and its departments shall at all time be complied with including the Building Code of the City of Syracuse.
- 7. The Work shall be subject to street cut and repair permitting process administered by the Commissioner of Public Works and any other standard permitting processes that exist. Restoration of pavement and sidewalks must be completed in accordance with all City of Syracuse standards.
- 8. That the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Works shall be advised in advance of time when the work is to be done and the work of installation, including shoring, protection of pipes and facilities and other safety measures, shall be subject to the supervision of the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Works.

- 9. Subject to the City Engineer, review and approval, permission may be granted by the City for other utilities to cross the area to be occupied by the proposed facilities.
- 10. All work shall be done in a skillful manner with reasonable dispatch and in accordance with plans and specifications and all conditions imposed by any laws, rules or regulations which may apply to the work. That ADHV REDEV, LLC., its successors, assigns, and agents shall obtain and keep in force for the duration of this permission, a general liability insurance policy, in the amount of \$2,000,000, naming the City of Syracuse as an additional insured. A Certificate of said insurance shall be submitted to the Office of Corporation Counsel, 233 E. Washington Street, Room 300 City Hall, Syracuse, NY 13202.
- 14. That ADHV REDEV, LLC., its successors, assigns, and agents shall agree that the City, acting through its City Engineer shall have the authority to request any on site investigations, excavations or actions, to be taken at the sole expense of ADHV REDEV, LLC., which are necessary to ensure that the excavation of these City Streets does not damage or impair City utilities.
- 15. That this permission and consent is temporary and revocable and all rights under this ordinance shall cease and be terminated at the expiration of ninety (90) days from the adoption by the Common Council of an ordinance terminating the same and thereupon, said applicant, its successors or assigns, shall remove said work in connection therewith and restore the street, sidewalk and all other facilities wholly at the cost and expense of said applicant, its successors or assigns. The City shall provide written notice to the Owner if the Common Council is going to consider a future ordinance revoking this permission.

- 16. By consequence of the ordinance or subsequent approvals authorized by the ordinance, the City of Syracuse makes no representation, express or implied, as to the feasibility of the proposed plans or Work or to the extent of Work involved in accommodating any existing utility or facility located within the City rights-of-way. Any coordination with the various utility operators, private and/or public, is the responsibility of ADHV REDEV, LLC. Upon completion of the facilities and acceptance and approval of the roadway restoration by the City Engineer and the Commissioner of Public Works, the use, operation and maintenance of the roadway and utilities located therein will be subject to all laws, rules, ordinances and procedures which apply to streets and utilities throughout the City.
- 17. The foregoing conditions may be modified or expanded from time to time as agreed upon by the Corporation Counsel, City Engineer and ADHV REDEV, LLC.
- 18. The construction and restoration permitted by the terms of this ordinance must be carried out and completed within two (2) years from the date of its adoption.
- 19. All monuments shall be referenced prior to construction. If any monuments are disturbed or moved, the monuments shall be replaced in the same location and recertified by a licensed surveyor to the City of Syracuse. All expenses for the above shall be paid for by ADHV REDEV, LLC.
- 20. Follow all weather/seasonal limitations per City/NYSDOT specifications for all construction in the City R.O.W. By consequence of the ordinance or subsequent approvals authorized by the ordinance, the City of Syracuse makes no representation, express or implied, as to the feasibility of the proposed plans or Work or to the extent of Work involved in accommodating any existing utility or facility located within the City rights-of-way. Any coordination with the various utility operators, private and/or public, is the responsibility of ADHV REDEV, LLC. Upon completion of the facilities and acceptance and approval of the improvements by the City Engineer, Commissioner of Public Works, the use, operation and maintenance of sanitary sewer structures will be subject to all laws, rules, ordinances and procedures which apply to throughout the City.
- 21. The City reserves the right to reject any and all materials, workmanship of the planned at any time during construction.
- 22. The City shall be notified, consulted and prior approval obtained on all field changes/field change sheets, RFI's etc. related to the work of this approval.

Failure or refusal of the ADHV REDEV, LLC to complete the work as required by this ordinance shall result in City of Syracuse holding the temporary certificate of occupancy and the certificate of occupancy for the Moyer Carriage Lofts Project located at 1710 North Salina Street until the work is complete.
- 24. ADHV REDEV, LLC shall be responsible for all maintenance of all of the improvements installed as part of the parking area, including but not limited to snow removal operations. (Snow shall not be pushed from the parking area into the R.O.W.)




