Lease Agreement - With Focusing Our Resources for Community Enlightenment (FORCE), of the City owned properties located at 515 Cannon Street and 162-170 716 7-0 West Brighton Avenue, for the period of five (5) years for \$1.00 a year. The tenant is responsible for maintenance, including landscaping and snow removal.

Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$532,000 and enter into an agreement with Microsoft, on behalf of H H Information Technology, for the term of three (3) years, for a modernization project that will migrate approximately 750 network users to Microsoft 365, included is a cloud hosted email solution along with access to the latest Microsoft Office applications.
- Agreement With Syracuse University, to maintain in-kind services, to include maintaining a portion of Thornden Park and the replacement and maintenance of H H sidewalks along Ostrum Avenue near the park. The City will agree to accept current and additional University sidewalk maintenance in lieu of assessing new sidewalks fees; to stripe crosswalks on Ostrum Avenue near Thornden Park; provide assistance and coaching related to the permitting process, hire an additional code inspector to be assigned to the university area; and add Schine Student Center and South Campus as training rotations for Police Cadets (pre-Academy CSOs.) The University will also increase payments to the City from \$1 million to \$2 million over four years (FY22-FY26), as detailed in the legislation, to be deposited in Account #01.425910.
- 14. Agreement With Cushman & Wakefield, for appraisal services, for properties located at 744-754 West Genesee Street, 827-829 West Belden Avenue, and 832-836 West 7-0 717 Belden Avenue for property tax litigation, for fiscal years 2020/2021 and 2021/2022. Total cost not to exceed \$12,000 plus \$500 per hour for trial preparation and related costs, charged to Account #541500. 01.13550. The Mayor waived the RFP process.
- Amend Ord. #188 (04/13/2020), "Agreement With ePlanSoft, for Digital Plan Review Software Services, to improve customer service, reduce applicant expenses, 7-0 718 and expedite the review process by providing digital mark-up tools to our plan reviewers, to expire June 30, 2021, with two (1) two year renewal option with the approval of the Mayor and the Common Council. Total cost not to exceed \$90,500, Information Technology's Factual charged to & Information Account #540530.01.16800." Amend to use the first of two (2) one (1) year renewal options, for the period of July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022. Total cost not to exceed \$41,000.
 - 16. Local Law Of the City of Syracuse to amend the Budget for the year July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022, relative to Syracuse School City District, to increase the General Fund T T Operating Budget, from \$460,290,242 to \$472,405,919.

Appropriate Funds From the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) in an amount not to exceed \$500,000, to provide homeowner support for sidewalk-related costs, through Home HeadQuarters' Urgent Care Program, to expire December 3, 2023. The program will address costs associated with sidewalks, including remaining balances for homeowners who completed repairs under the City's previous sidewalk program. Eligible City owner-occupied homeowners must live in qualified census tract or demonstrate a financial hardship as a result of COVID-19.
- 19. Correct Tax Rolls (615 Oneida Street for tax years 2021/2022) to remove board-up & 7-0 clean-up charges, as outlined in Appendix "A".
