After multiple conversations with the business and property owners about a relatable mural concept that speaks to their craft, identify and their family's origins (Lebanon / Jordan), "Munjed's Majesty" was conceived as an original design by artist Nada Odeh that consists of various different visual elements:

- > The warm colors reflect the Middle Eastern culture and memories from the land of sun;
- > The drawings and the religious symbols reflect the people who live and resides in the Middle East who come form different backgrounds and populations;
- > The scenery of the city roofs and the skies that can be found anywhere in the middle East;
- > The interiors of the Arabic houses with the simple objects that can be found in the cities across the Middle East.

As it relates to its immediate surroundings and neighborhood, "Westcott Nation", which consists of a myriad of people from different backgrounds, religions and beliefs, is the home of many SU students and professors, international food destinations, and still is the place where a broad mix of visitors, academics, artists and residents gather, this mural aims to reflect all the creativity, diversity and beauty it has to offer.

The mural design will be scaled up, reproduced and painted by a Nada and small team volunteer artists associated with the 315Alive project in mid-October. We estimate the use of appx. 20-30 co-labor hours of work to complete the mural. The surface will be prepared with a concrete block primer and the mural painted with exterior latex paint. The use of ladders and a movable scaffolding unit will be necessary.

Upkeep: The owner of the property has approved the final design and has signed a contract with the 315Alive project ensuring long-term care, maintenance oversight and a willingness to preserve the integrity of the mural to the best of their ability before any work commences.

Budget: \$0. The materials, equipment and additional resources needed for the project will be donated to the effort by participating supporters, vendors and donors. Artist compensation will be determined by the total sum raised through the projects' crowd fund site: gofundme.com/315alive

Artist Biography / Portfolio: Nada Odeh. Syracuse, NY.

Nada Odeh is a Syrian artist, activist, humanitarian and a modern-day poet. She was both born and raised in Damascus and has lived in countries such as Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates and has recently come to the USA in 2013 due to the conflict and revolution in her country. Nada got her M.A. in Museum Studies from Syracuse University. She lives and works in Syracuse, New York. She had gotten her Bachelor in fine arts from the Damascus University. She has attended many workshops in the field of visual arts, communication arts, and therapeutical arts.

Odeh has established a project commonly known as 'Nada's Picassos', which had begun in Damascus but was then later moved to Dubai, Michigan and currently New York State. The medium she works in is Acrylics on Canvases. Arabic miniatures, Middle Eastern colors and small details of the heritage influence her artwork.

The key theme in which her artwork is mainly focused on is the Syrian refugees in camps and Syrian people. Recently she is focusing more on displaced Syrian women in exile. She has exhibited her art in Damascus, Dubai, New York City, Detroit, Toledo, Tiffin, Washington D.C. Syracuse, Albany and Auburn, New York.



MURAL SITE! PROPERTY AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made this <u>OB</u> day of <u>OCHOBER</u> , 2018 BETWEEN: 315ALIVE (ie. SPARK ART CONTEMPORARY SPACE, Inc), Hereinafter referred to as "315ALIVE" – and – <u>Samue ESS</u> , Hereinafter referred to as the "Owner".
WHEREAS 315ALIVE, sponsored by ALCHEMICAL NURSERY, a 501c3 not-for-profit charitable organization, AND WHEREAS the Owner is the registered Owner of the building / property at, Syracuse, New York:
 The Owner hereby agrees to permit 315ALIVE, and its artists, to paint a Mural located at Syracuse, hereinafter called the "Wall". The Owner agrees not to deface, cover, destroy, damage, alter or directly obstruct the visibility of the Mural and also agrees to maintain the integrity of the Mural after production. A theme for the mural will be established and a sketch proposal will be presented to the Owner for approval before painting. The Owner agrees that if repairs are required to be made to the Wall, the Owner will notify
315ALIVE in writing of this intention to repair. Once authorization has been received from 315ALIVE the Owner agrees to proceed with the approved repairs using all reasonable efforts to minimize the damage to the Mural. 5. 315ALIVE will use all reasonable efforts not to interfere with the business being conducted by the Owner and tenants/occupiers of the Building. The Owner will assist 315ALIVE to coordinate
the painting of the Mural with the affected tenant(s)/occupier(s) of the Building. 6. The Owner agrees to permit by prior appointment 315ALIVE and its artists access to the Wall at all reasonable times in order to complete the Mural and to undertake any necessary inspections, approvals or repairs and 315ALIVE will use all reasonable efforts not to interfere with the business conducted by the Owner and other tenants/occupiers of the Building. 7. In the event that the Wall with the mural is to be demolished, removed or painted over, the Owner will notify 315ALIVE prior to the demolition or painting.
